The Computation of the COST-OF-LIVING ADJUSTMENTS for the Adult Aid Programs

The computation of the cost-of-living (COL) adjustments for the Adult Aid programs is prescribed by the W&I Code. This method of computation is to apply the change from the base period in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) to the dollar base prescribed by the W&I Code. A more commonly used method is to apply the annual change in the CPI to the most recent value as a base. These methods both yield the same results. To illustrate this, attached is the cost of living for the OAS program calculated by both methods.

Referring to the attachment:

- Column 1. Specifies the point-in-time. W&I Code Section 12150 prescribes a base time point of January 1, 1962, for the OAS program and a base dollar value of \$100. The December 1961 CPI is used as the initial value.
- Column 2. The CPI is provided by the Federal Bureau of Labor Statistics. The
 W&I Code Section 12150 prescribes that the average of the CPI for L.A.
 and S.F. shall be used.
- Columns 3 through 6. The calculation of COL as prescribed by the W&I Code Section 12150.

This is the percent increase in the CPI from base time point.

- Col. 4: [Base value of \$100] X [Column 3]

 This converts the percent increase to a dollar value.
- Col. 5: Column 6 accumulated to prior year. This is the COL already provided.
- Col. 6: Column 4 less column 5. This is the additional COL to be provided, rounded to the nearest dollar.
- Columns 7 through 11. The calculations of COL as by the "annual change in CPI to most recent base" method.

This is the percent increase in the CPI from the prior year.

Col. 8: Prior year Column 8 X [Current year Colum. 1]

[100]

Plus [Prior year Column 8]

This increases the prior base by the current change in the CPI.

- Col. 9: [Current Column 8 Base value of \$100]

 This is the accumulated amount of increase.
- Col. 10: Column 11 accumulated to prior year.
- Col. 11: [Column 9] [Column 10] and rounded to the nearest dollar.
