
Dear Fellow Californian:

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

#### POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS CRIMINAL CONTROL

- PURPOSE: The Special Service Unit provides public safety by strengthening liaison between the Department of Corrections and law enforcement agencies, district attorneys, and judges. This is accomplished by maintaining ongoing intelligence and investigative services aimed at controlling the activity of the more dangerous offender whose conduct is the Department's responsibility while on parole or in prison. The Special Service Unit is attached to the office of the Director of Corrections, and its special functions are: (A) Liaison and training. (B) Intelligence and criminal investigations. (C) Fugitive investigations. (D) Surveillance and organized crime control.
- ELIGIBILITY: Any city, county or federal law enforcement agency, district attorney, or members of the judiciary. The service is limited to the individual in prison or on parole, who, because of his crime or criminal background, is considered to be potentially dangerous to public safety. Information or requests can be made by telephone or letter.

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#### SUBSIDY FOR CONSTRUCTION OF JUVENILE CAMPS

Field staff also processes plans to the State Fire Marshal's office to insure compliance with fire safety codes.

Information Service: DMV has the function of providing, without charge, to courts, enforcement agencies, prosecutors and other government bodies, the complete record of the individual driver and his vehicle. The purpose is to provide requesters with necessary information regarding the driving record and vehicle registration. DMV also maintains special stops on motor vehicle and driver license records on request from governmental agencies, i.e., Aid to Needy Children (a compensated program), bad check stops, court ordered restraining stops on vehicle registration. DMV provides photostats of records for prosecution and identification. Notice of vehicle transfers are now updated into the registration master files on a real time basis.

Law enforcement agencies presently receiving record information thru remote devices are: California Highway Patrol (statewide), Santa Clara Sheriff's Office, L.A. Police Department, and Alameda Police Information Network.

Non-urgent inquiry service is available to the Department of Motor Vehicles units in printed form, whereas law enforcement requests are issued on punched cards.

A special service for the Federal Government to aid Customs in identifying known vehicles of narcotics offendors was established in Sacramento office with data terminals located in San Ysidro.

ELIGIBILITY: Enforcement and other governmental agencies may submit requests by writing, telephone, radio, or teletype to DMV. DMV is paid only for Aid to Needy Children at the rate of \$1 per new case.




