Senator Hatch's Letter Requesting Support SUBJECT:

For SR-71 SENIOR KING Program (S)

Prior to writing to you about the SR-71 SENICR KING program (Tab A), Senator Hatch wrote two letters to the President on the same subject (Tabs B & C) requesting Presidential support. (S)

Concurrent with Senator Hatch's initial request, the House Appropriations Committee (Chappell) and the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (Cheney) were expressing concerns regarding the cost/benefit of the SR-71 and SENIOR KING programs. The response to Senator Hatch's initial request was, therefore, delayed until the Air Force could respond to questions raised by the HAC and the HPSCI. The Air Force is still in the process of answering the numerous issues raised by Congressman Cheney. The response to Senator Hatch's second request was delayed to allow the Congressional principals (Cheney and Hatch) the opportunity to meet and perhaps work out a compromise. Cheney and Hatch met on June 16 to discuss this issue. The meeting did not result in the movement of either side. (S)

Senator Hatch is correct in stating that the SR-71 and SENIOR KING programs are important to our national security. However, the HAC and the HPSCI have raised some issues which should be addressed. It appears there is still the possibility of a solution between the DoD and Congress on this issue without the President having to take a position in favor of one side or the other. (S)

I recently forwarded two letters to the President for his signature; one to Senator Hatch, and one to Representative Stokes with a copy of the Stokes letter going to all the cognizant congressional committees. The letters, which have been signed and sent, endorse the merits of a viable SR-71 program and encourage a compromise on this issue acceptable to all parties.


