Initially established by E.O. 12169, October 26, 1979.

P.L. 96-388, October 7, 1980 (Reconstituted)

P.L. 97-84, November 20, 1981 (Membership change)

METHOD:

Appointed by the President and see below.

MEMBERS:

SIXTY-FIVE VOTING MEMBERS AS FOLLOWS:

FIFTY-FIVE appointed by the President;

FIVE appointed by the Speaker of the House from among members of the United States House of Representatives;

FIVE appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate upon the recommendation of the majority and minority leaders from among members of the United States Senate.

THREE EX OFFICIO NONVOTING MEMBERS AS FOLLOWS:

ONE appointed by the Secretary of the Interior;

ONE appointed by the Secretary of State;

ONE appointed by the Secretary of Education.

The members of the Council, as in effect immediately before the date of enactment of the Act (P. L. 96-388), are designated as members of the Council. All noncongressional voting members designated under the preceding sentence shall serve terms as follows:

- (1) All such noncongressional voting members shall serve until January 15, 1986.
- (2) On January 15, 1986, the terms of <u>eleven</u> of such noncongressional voting members, as designated in the bylaws of the Council, shall terminate.
- (3) On January 15 of each year thereafter through 1990, the terms of <u>eleven</u> other such noncongressional voting members, as designated in the bylaws of the Council, shall terminate.

Members may be reappointed.

UNITED STATES HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL COUNCIL (Cont'd)

CHAIRPERSON & VICE CHAIRPERSON:

Appointed by the President from among the members of the Council for a term of five years.

The Chairperson and Vice Chairperson, in effect immediately before the date of the enactment of this Act, are hereby designated respectively as the initial Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of the Council. Such individuals shall serve until January 15, 1986.

The Chairperson and Vice Chairperson may be reappointed.

TERM:

FIVE YEARS.

Any member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring before the expiration of the term for which his predecessor was appointed shall be appointed only for the remainder of such term. A member may serve after the expiration of his term until his successor has taken office. (HOLDOVERS)

SALARY:

Members who are full-time officers or employees of the U.S. or Members of the Congress shall receive no additional pay.

Other Members are authorized to be paid the daily equivalent of the maximum annual rate of basic pay in effect for grade GS-18 for each day, including traveltime, during which they are engaged in the actual performance of duties of the Council.

While away from their homes or regular places of business in the performance of services for the Council, members shall be allowed travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence.

PURPOSE:

Provide for appropriate ways for the Nation to commemorate the Days of Remembrance, as an annual, national, civic commemoration of the holocaust, and shall encourage and sponsor appropriate observances of such Days of Remembrance throughout the United States.

UNITED STATES HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL COUNCIL (Cont'd)

PURPOSE: (Cont'd)

Plan, construct, and oversee the operation of, a permanent living memorial museum to the victims of the holocaust, in cooperation with the Secretary of the Interior and other Federal agencies.

Develop a plan for carrying out the recommendations of the President's Commission on the Holocaust in its report to the President of September 27, 1979, to the extent such recommendations are not otherwise provided for in this Act.

ADMINISTRATIVE

SUPPORT:

The Secretary of the Interior may provide administrative services and support to the Council on a reimbursable basis.
