

Given the close nature of our relations, the Department recommends that the President be represented, and suggests that Ms. Maureen Reagan and Ambassador Grove be chosen. Ms. Reagan would be accompanied by Ralph Bresler of the Bureau of African Affairs. We recommend that a military aircraft be made available. If you concur in their nomination, we recommend that Ms. Reagan hand carry the signed original of a congratulatory letter from the President to President Mobutu, and have attached a proposed draft.

The President today announced the membership of the United States Delegation to the World Conference of the United Nations Decade for Women, 1985. Maureen E. Reagan, businessowner, lecturer, broadcaster and daughter of the President will chair the member delegation. Nancy Clark Reynolds, president of Wexler, Reynolds, Harrison and Schule, Inc. and the U.S. Representative to the U.N. Commission on the Status of Women for the past four years, will be the delegation's co-chair.

The delegation was selected from over 1,000 suggestions and requests. It reflects the diverse cultures in the United States and represents the richness of women's activities and concerns.

The World Conference marking the end of the 1975-1985 Decade for Women will be held in Nairobi July 15-26, 1985. The Department of State has established a special office, the U.S. Secretariat for the World Conference, under the leadership of Betty Dillon, to coordinate U.S. preparations.

The United States delegates will join with delegates from other nations in discussion of specific progress and strategies in the areas of education, employment and health. Issues of particular interest to this delegation are women as refugees, family violence and the role of women in development.

SUBJECT: APPOINTMENT OF ANNELISE ANDERSON

I have looked into the question of whether or not the appointment of Annelise Anderson to the position of Associate Director for Economics and Government in the Office of Management and Budget violates any statutory regulations because her husband Martin Anderson is employed in the White House.

I have reviewed all the OLC memos on the "nepotism" Statute, 5 USC 3110 which provides no federal official may appoint or promote or advocate the appointment or promotion of a relative, defined to include a wife in and agency in which the public official is serving over which he exercises jurisdiction or control. A "public official" is defined as one who has authority to appoint, employ, promote or advance individuals, or to recommend individuals for appointment, employment, promotion, or advancement.

Civil Service Commission guidelines on employment of relatives state that under the statute an official is considered to have advocated a relative's appointment or promotion if he simply refers the relative for consideration to one of his subordinates.

The only way the appointment of Mrs. Anderson could violate the applicable rules would be because of advocacy by Mrs. Anderson because her husband has no authority to promote or appoint her to her position at the Office of Management and Budget.

I have investigated the circumstances surrounding Mrs. Anderson's appointment and the statute has not been violated. First, Mrs. Anderson was offered her position prior to the Inauguration and her husband at that time was not a public official subject to the provisions of the Act. This fact should be dispositive of the question. In addition, Mrs. Anderson was very active in the campaign and has a very impressive background. Both she and her husband told me that he was not consulted by anyone as to her ability to fill the OMB position. There is no bar to relatives serving in the same agency. Therefore, there is no bar to Mrs. Anderson serving in the position to which she has been appointed.



SUBJECT: Employment of Relatives; Restrictions

The basic restrictions concerning the employment of relatives by a public official serving in an Executive agency are set forth in 5 U.S.C. §3110. Those restrictions are incorporated by reference in the Civil Service Reform Act (P.L. 95-454), wherein it is provided at 5 U.S.C. §2302(b)(7) that violation constitutes per se a prohibited personnel practice.

Section 3110(b) provides, in part, that:

"[a] public official may not appoint, employ, promote, advance, or advocate for appointment, employment, promotion, or advancement, in or to a civilian position in an agency in which he is serving or over which he exercises jurisdiction or control any individual who is a relative of the public official."

Section 3110(a)(2) defines "public official" to mean:

"... an officer ... and any other individual, in whom is vested the authority by law, rule or regulation, ... to appoint, employ, promote, or advance individuals, or to recommend individuals for appointment, promotion, or advancement, in connection with employment in an agency."

Further, the term "officer" as used in Section 3110 is defined in 5 U.S.C. 2104 as:

"... an individual who is --
(1) required by law to be appointed in the civil service by ...
(A) the President ..."

The term "relative" is defined in 5 U.S.C. 3110(d)(3) to mean:

"... with respect to a public official, an individual who is related to the public official as father, mother, son, daughter ... first cousin ... half-brother, or half-sister."

Accordingly, any public official who employs or advocates the employment of a relative in his or her agency has by definition participated in a prohibited employment practice. While there are no express sanctions in the statutes, the appointment is arguably void or voidable, which could result in the recoupment of monies paid to the relative during the period of employment.
