SUBJECT:

Request for White House Support for the Fourth National Colon-Rectal Cancer Screening

Attorney Philip F. Zeidman, on behalf of "The Medicine Shoppe," a national chain of pharmacies, has asked that the President endorse The Medicine Shoppe's free colorectal cancer screening program, scheduled for December 6-8. Home testing kits will be distributed free at Medicine Shoppes on those days, and the AMC Cancer Research Center will analyze the results. This is the fourth year for the program.

It is my understanding that the memorandum we prepared on Presidential endorsement of fundraising for colorectal cancer programs is being held in abeyance, pending a meeting with the President on the subject. This request should be addressed at that meeting. This request is a bit different, since it involves a for-profit company, and The Medicine Shoppe will obviously benefit from any publicity surrounding the program. On the other hand, this seems like the sort of private sector initiative often praised by the President, and if he decides to become personally involved in this area he may want to endorse the completely free testing program. Dear Tom:

It was good talking with you on August 29, and being brought up to date. I'll await further word from you as to when you think it would be productive to get together.

I am enclosing the material regarding the fourth National Colon-Rectal Cancer Check offered by the Medicine Shoppe chain as a public service. As we discussed, I think it would be entirely appropriate for the White House to lend whatever support it deems appropriate, perhaps in the form of a letter encouraging people to participate in such screenings.

I am keenly aware of the quite legitimate concern that the President and the First Lady not be drawn into commercial undertakings, even (and perhaps especially) when triggered by the heightened public awareness as a result of the President's BROWNSTEIN ZEIDMAN AND SCHOMER

operation. Nevertheless, it seems to me that the public service nature of this program is such that it would not be inappropriate. I defer to your good judgment on that score. In that regard, I am also enclosing an internal memorandum indicating the contacts which have been made. I suspect, however, that those "contacts" have been, of necessity, rather impersonal.



SUBJECT: Request to Use Picture of the President in Connection With Special Fundraising Piece to be Distributed by the American Cancer Society

JOHN G. ROBERTS

The Connecticut Division of the American Cancer Society has asked permission to use a picture of the President in a fundraising brochure on colorectal cancer. As you noted on the tracking sheet, we are likely to receive numerous similar requests. (I have already seen several advertisements, for products ranging from home colorectal cancer detection kits to prunes (a high fiber food) mentioning the President's cancer.) You may want to raise the question directly with the President, but I assume we will adhere to our usual policy of generally declining to participate in particular fundraising campaigns. Dear Mr. Norbeck:

Thank you for your recent letter to the President, requesting permission to use a picture of the President in connection with a fundraising campaign. As you might imagine, the President receives countless requests to lend his name to fundraising activities for laudable charities. We cannot grant all such requests, and there is no fair way to discriminate among the many worthy requests that are received.

Accordingly, we have been compelled to adopt a policy of generally declining requests that the President participate in particular fundraising projects.

I trust you will understand the reasons we must adhere to this policy, and that our inability to grant your request is in no sense an adverse reflection on your organization or the important work with which it is involved.

SUBJECT: Requests from Charitable Organizations Concerned with Cancer for Fundraising Endorsements

#### I. ACTION FORCING EVENT

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We have received several requests from reputable charitable organizations involved in cancer treatment and research, asking that you permit your name to be used in their promotional or fundraising campaigns.

#### II. DISCUSSION

As you know, our usual policy is to decline such requests from charitable organizations. We explain that the White House receives countless requests for such endorsements, cannot possibly grant them all, and out of fairness to all has been compelled to adopt a policy of generally declining such requests. Rare exceptions are made only after consultation with you and Mrs. Reagan, and typically only for particular causes in which you or Mrs. Reagan have been personally involved, such as Foster Grandparents, various drug abuse prevention programs, and the Motion Picture Country House and Hospital.

A decision needs to be made whether to adhere to the general policy of declining to provide fundraising endorsement for particular charities in the case of cancer-related charities, or to make an exception. I recommend that an exception not be made for cancer-related charities. Your successful operation and recuperation have already done much to promote awareness in this area. Charitable fundraising is as intensely competitive as any business, and I think those working on other diseases might legitimately object to Presidential endorsement of donations to fight only cancer. You often endorse charitable contributions and voluntarism in general, but the choice of what particular cause to support should be an individual's own, and I do not think the President's name should be invoked to sway that decision.

## III. RECOMMENDATION

That you adhere to our usual policy and not endorse • particular fundraising or promotional campaigns for cancer-related charities.
