This order would condition the authority of all U.S. and foreign air carriers to prohibit the sale in the United States of any transportation by air which includes any type of stop in Lebanon.

I am submitting the proposed decision to you before publication under the provisions of section 801(a) of the Federal Aviation Act of 1958. The Department of Transportation (DOT) proposes to take the following action with regard to the above international aviation case:

-- Amend all United States air carrier certificates and foreign air carrier permits to prohibit the sale in the United States of any transportation by air which includes any type of stop in Lebanon.

The Departments of State, Defense, and Justice, and the National Security Council have no objection to the proposed order.

This air case is a special instance involving important national security considerations. Therefore, to fully explain your action on this, DOT has prepared an expanded letter to the Secretary, for your signature.

The Office of Management and Budget recommends that you approve DOT's decision by signing the attached letter to the Secretary which indicates that you do not intend to disapprove DOT's order within the 60 days allowed by statute for your review.

I have reviewed the order proposed by the Department of Transportation in the following case:

Security of Aircraft and Safety of Passengers Transiting Lebanon Docket 43232

I find that its expeditious issuance is consistent with Presidential Determination 85-14 under Section 1114 of the Federal Aviation Act to suspend air service between the United States and Lebanon. Moreover, your action is an important step in implementing my policy with respect to Beirut International Airport in light of Lebanon's failure to act consistently with the Convention for the Suppression of Unlawful Seizure of Aircraft.

For these reasons, I have decided not to disapprove the proposed order.

That Order is in the process of being revised, in light of the sunset of the Civil Aeronautics Board. Section 4 of the Executive Order prohibits individuals within the Executive Office of the President from discussing Section 801 cases -- those involving international aviation -- with outside parties, and requires such individuals to refer written communications on Section 801 cases from outside parties to the appropriate office outside the Executive Office of the President. These restrictions are still in effect. You should refuse to discuss cases subject to the President's approval under Section 801 with interested private parties, and you should refer any written communications you receive on such cases to this office for appropriate referral.

I would also remind you that purely domestic aviation decisions not subject to Presidential approval under Section 801 would typically implicate our general policy against White House interference in particular matters pending before agencies with adjudicative responsibilities. You should consult with this office before discussing such cases with interested private parties or Government agencies.
