(3) conduct and support evaluations and studies of the performance. and results achieved by Federal juvenile delinquency programs and tivities and of the prospective performance and results that might achieved by alternative programs and activities supplementary to or in lieu of those currently being administered;

- (4) implement Federal juvenile delinquency programs and activities among Federal departments and agencies and between Federal juvenil delinquency programs and activities and other Federal programs and activities which he determines may have an important bearing on the success of the entire Federal juvenile delinquency effort;
- (5) develop annually with the assistance of the Advisory Committee and the Coordinating Council and submit to the President and the Congress, after the first year following October 3, 1977, prior to Des cember 31, an analysis and evaluation of Federal juvenile delinquence programs conducted and assisted by Federal departments and agencies the expenditures made, the results achieved, the plans developed, and problems in the operations and coordination of such programs and brief but precise comprehensive plan for Federal juvenile delinquency programs, with particular emphasis on the prevention of juvenile delinquency and the development of programs and services which will encourage increased diversion of juveniles from the traditional juvenile justice system, which analysis and evaluation shall include recommendations for modifications in organization, management, personnel, standards, budget requests, and implementation plans necessary to increase the effectiveness of these programs; and
- (6) provide technical assistance and training assistance to Federal, State, and local governments, courts public and private agencies, institutions, and individuals, in the planning, establishment, funding, operation, or evalution of juvenile delinquency programs.

(c) Report by President to Congress and Council; time for report

The President shall, no later than ninety days after receiving each annual report under subsection (b)(5) of this section, submit a report to the Congress and to the Council containing a detailed statement of any action taken or anticipated with respect to recommendations made by each such annual report.

(d) First and second annual reports of Administrator; contents

- (1) The first annual report submitted to the President and the Congress by the Administrator under subsection (b)(5) of this section shall contain, in addition to information required by subsection (b)(5) of this section, a detailed statement of criteria developed by the Administrator for identifying the characteristics of juvenile delinquency, juvenile delinquency prevention, diversion of youths from the juvenile justice system, and the training, treatment, and rehabilitation of juvenile delinquents.

The Administrator of the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention has recently submitted to me a copy of the <u>Eighth Analysis and Evaluation of Federal Juvenile Delinquency Programs</u> as required by Section 204 (b) (5) of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974 (P.L. 93-415), as amended. This letter fulfills the statutory requirement to respond to the Congress concerning this document and its recommendations.

The report makes four recommendations for improving Federal juvenile delinquency prevention policy. As you know, I have proposed that the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Program be terminated at the conclusion of fiscal year 1985. Nonetheless, each of the recommendations will be implemented to the extent possible with respect to funds appropriated in fiscal year 1985 and before.




