Dear Mr. President:

This year marks the centennial of the founding of Newport News Shipbuilding and Dry Dock Company. We need not tell you that over the 100 years of its existence, this shipyard has made a powerful and continuing contribution to the security of the United States.

One of the principal events of the centennial observance at Newport News Shipbuilding will take place on March 15, when the yard will launch the nuclear attack submarine USS Newport News (SSN-750). We earnestly request that on this occasion, you send an appropriate message congratulating the company on 100 years of achievement.

By way of background, the company was founded in 1886 by Collis P. Huntington, who defined his goal for the shipyard in this way: "The yard is new, and what I want is to get a reputation for building first-class ships, and then always build ships to sustain that reputation." From the shipyard's first hull, the tugboat Dorothy, to the huge, nuclear-powered aircraft carriers and submarines now being produced, the workers and managers of Newport News have met Mr. Huntington's goal.

Famous ships comprising chapters in the company's history include seven battleships of the Great White Fleet which President Theodore Roosevelt sent around the world making port calls and announcing the emergence of the United States as a major naval power; the first ship designed as an aircraft carrier, the USS Ranger (1933); the SS United States, the largest passenger liner built in our country, which still holds records for the fastest crossings of the Atlantic; and the USS Enterprise, launched in 1960, the world's first nuclear-powered aircraft carrier.

In all, Newport News has produced over 700 vessels of widely varying functions and sizes. Today it is the only American shippard engaged in building aircraft carriers and is turning out a steady stream of Los Angeles-class SSN-688 nuclear attack submarines. USS Newport News, so appropriately named for the shippard's home city, will be the 41st nuclear submarine built there.



RELIGION IN AMERICAN LIFE INC. -- A PROFILE

Religion In American Life, Inc. (RIAL, rhymes with smile) is a national, not-for-profit interreligious organization founded in 1949 that has the straightforward goal of getting more Americans into churches and synagogues. This goal grows out of the conviction that religion can profoundly benefit the life of the individual and the quality of life of society as a whole.

Within a religious "community" the individual can discover new insights and a sustaining vision and, in turn, by openness to God, the individual can be of help to others. Research commissioned by RIAL indicates that six out of 10 Americans are interested in deepening their involvement with religion.

With 52 national groups of the major faiths involved -- Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Jewish, and Protestant -- RIAL seeks to achieve its goal through two major activities.

1) Public service advertising -- carried year-round without charge by the media (RIAL's message is unique in this regard), through The Advertising Council. RIAL challenges the American people to "find your way with God" by turning to a local house of worship for moral guidance and a way to be of service in the community. During 1985 production costs this advertising came to \$110,000. The value of print space and radio/TV time contributed across the nation was estimated to be almost \$30 million -- an incredible return on the dollar. The Charles E. Wilson Memorial Award which recognizes an outstanding business leader whose life expresses devotion to religion, distinction in career, and dedication to humanity. This award honors another founder of RIAL, Charles E. Wilson, who served the General Electric Company for 51 years. It is a central part of the annual RIAL Anniversary Dinner.

Religion In American Life, Inc. is directed by a Board of 50 members, who are drawn equally from business leaders and religious leaders. The current Chairman is Dr. Robert C. Campbell, General Secretary of American Baptist Churches, U.S.A.

Two standing committees of the board, the Religious Advisory Council and the Business Advisory Council, provide additional counsel and support to the work of RIAL. The BAC has been chaired by the CEO's of such corporations as the General Electric Company, Colgate-Palmolive Company, Reynolds Metals Company, J.P. Stevens & Company, Inc., Mutual of New York, American Can Company, AMAX, Sperry Rand, The Singer Company, and by the editor in chief of GOOD HOUSEKEEPING.

The over-all work of RIAL is administered by Alan J. Sorem, President and Chief Executive Officer, an ordained Presbyterian minister who holds a degree in theology from Yale Divinity School and an MBA from Fordham University.

I am delighted to salute the officers and sponsors of the Jamestown Foundation, especially William Geimer, its founder and president. I wish I could have been there at your recent gathering to honor Arkady Shevchenko at the ceremony in which he took the oath of allegiance and became an American citizen.

Mr. Shevchenko was a highly placed official of the Soviet Government working at the United Nations when he made the difficult and dangerous decision to turn away from a system in which he had lost all confidence and to throw in his lot with the forces of freedom. That took rare character and courage and determination.

He was fortunate indeed that the Jamestown Foundation was there to provide him with help and encouragement as he made his readjustment to a new way of life. But that is what the foundation was created to do. Mr. Geimer understands that key Soviet-bloc officials who renounce the comforts and privileges of their rank and seek asylum and a life of freedom in the United States need special help, guidance, and friendship. Mr. Geimer also understands that their first-hand knowledge and special insights are an invaluable resource for the entire Free World. The services that the Jamestown Foundation provides are of the kind that only the private sector can accomplish. It is for this reason that I so enthusiastically applaud that spirit of benevolence and public service which animates this Foundation and its supporters.



No one could give more eloquent testimony to the importance of the work the Jamestown Foundation is doing than Mr. Shevchenko. In becoming a U.S. citizen he completed a long and sometimes agonizing passage from the darkness of Soviet totalitarianism to the light of liberty in this blessed land. His rite of passage reminds us once again of America's destiny, reminds us that our gatekeeper, the Statue of Liberty, continues to life her torch as a beacon to those who seek freedom.

I know I speak for all Americans when I extend congratulations and a warm welcome to our new Fellow-American Arkady Shevchenko.

I also warmly comment the work of the Jamestown Foundation and its supporters. You are performing an indispensable service for the cause of freedom. To all of you I send my thanks and my best wishes. God bless you.

You may recall that last August, Pete Hannaford phoned you to discuss a project that our client, Stanley S. Hubbard, president of Hubbard Broadcasting, Inc. and KSTP-TV in St. Paul, wished to launch in support of the President's economic recovery program. Mr. Hubbard wanted to produce and circulate widely in the broadcast media a thirty-second public service message, taped by a prominent spokesperson, urging the public to get behind the President's program and invest their tax-cut dollars in the future of America. I believe at the time you indicated this was just the kind of support the White House was anxious to have, and that you were enthusiastic about the idea.

The White House speechwriting office subsequently helped draft the text of such a message, and it was taped by Mr. Efrim Zimbalist, Jr. at his home in California late in the fall. Mr. Zimbalist was happy to do this for the President, and his participation was arranged through Mr. A.C. Lyles, a long-time friend of both the President and Mr. Zimbalist.

Many of these stations did run the message. We understand it is scheduled to run on station WJLA in Washington on February 24, 25 and 26, in a time slot between the local evening news and the network news, and we thought you would like to know this in case you wished to have someone monitor the tape.

I know that Stanley Hubbard, a great admirer and supporter of President Reagan, would be deeply appreciative if the President would drop him a short note, thanking him for his efforts in support of the economic recovery program and noting that he is aware of the wide distribution the Zimbalist tape received.
