Correspondence From Kim Costanza on Behalf of Her Father Who Has Been Involved in Entrapment Cases With State Police and the F.B.I.

Kim Costanza of Bricktown, New Jersey has written the President two identical letters, requesting an investigation into the F.B.I. undercover operation that resulted in the conviction of her father. According to Costanza's letter, her father is required to report to begin serving his sentence October 5 -- the letter is dated October 4 -- while his appeal is pending before the Supreme Court. The case is being handled by Ramsey Clark, but Costanza notes that "as usual" he has been "called to El Salvador" and the matter is being handled by one of his law clerks. Costanza asks that her father be permitted to remain at home while an investigation is conducted.

The White House should not become involved in this pending criminal case. I have prepared a memorandum for your signature, referring the correspondence to the Department of Justice.

Request for Use of the Presidential Box at the Kennedy Center for an Auction Item to Benefit Community Service to the Mentally Retarded/Emotionally Handicapped Young People

The Rock Creek Foundation, a local charitable organization active in the mental health area, has written you to request the use of the President's box as an item to be auctioned off to raise funds. An auction of celebrity items to benefit the Foundation will be held on December 1.

It is our established policy not to approve the use of Presidential memorabilia as auction items, since the lending of such items would constitute endorsement of the fundraising. The White House adheres to a policy of generally not endorsing particular fundraising efforts, because we receive so many requests and cannot fairly approve some but not others. In addition, the White House has no capability to supervise fundraising by private entities, which would be necessary to some extent were the White House to endorse the fundraising. Finally, auctioning off Presidential memorabilia is basically selling the prestige of the Office, and that is not for sale, not for any price, not for any cause.

Dear Ms. Falgitano:

Thank you for your letter of October 1, 1984. In that letter you requested permission to use the Presidential box at the Kennedy Center as an auction item to raise funds to benefit The Rock Creek Foundation.

I must decline to grant your request. The White House generally adheres to a policy of not lending items associated with the President to be auctioned off to raise funds, no matter how worthy the cause. As you might imagine, the President receives countless requests for such items. He cannot grant them all, and fairness dictates that he not arbitrarily grant some while denying others. In addition, the White House has no capability to supervise the activities of private charitable organizations, which would be necessary to some extent were the President to endorse particular fundraising projects.

I trust you will understand the reasons for our response, and that it in no way constitutes an adverse reflection on the fine work of The Rock Creek Foundation.

NAME AND PURPOSE OF PROGRAM

Founded in 1973, The Rock Creek Foundation provides psychiatric, vocational, socialization and residential programs and services to people in the Greater Washington Metropolitan area, who are both mentally retarded and emotionally disturbed. Rock Creek's comprehensive program combines the disciplines of mental retardation and mental health to move clients from emotional dependency to emotional well being and independence.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Rock Creek was founded to meet the needs of mentally retarded/emotionally disturbed individuals in the community for whom programs and services were either fragmentary or non-existent.

Many mental health professionals believed the bizarre behavior exhibited by mentally retarded individuals was symptomatic of the retardation and nothing could be accomplished through psychotherapy. Mental retardation services did not include psychotherapy, and mental health services did not treat mentally retarded people (According to Dr. Frank Menoloscino, researcher and mental health clinician, a mentally retarded person-IQ below 70--is three times as likely to experience serious emotional problems as is a member of the general population, and less likely to receive services.) Consequently, dually handicapped individuals were consistently overlooked, neglected and ignored.

To address this problem, Rock Creek, with a staff of three mental health professionals, began a program of psychotherapy for six clients that was destined to shatter the old stereotyped attitudes toward mental retardation. Emotional stabilization of clients through psychotherapy allowed long suppressed needs to be expressed. To meet these essential human needs, Rock Creek developed a program, that combined the disciplines of mental retardation and mental health to treat the whole personality the client.

The clients of Rock Creek come from all walks of life. Some clients have remained with their families throughout their lives, while others have been institutionalized for years before coming to Rock Creek. Once enrolled in a program at Rock Creek, each client is travel trained and encouraged to interact with his/her peers and to actively participate in the communities in which they live. Many clients are employed part or full-time, and live in minimally or fully supervised group homes.

JOB PLACEMENT

Clients receive vocational training to develop work skills, a sense of responsibility and independence. Often, for the first time in their lives, our clients experience the pleasure and satisfaction of achievement.

Accompanied by staff members, work groups go to various business locations throughout the area for on-the-job training. Our clients are employed by such businesses as Leaner, Mackie Space Cleaners, Carey-Winson, Allied Reproductions, and Government Services, Inc. Many clients graduate from our comprehensive program to become partially or fully employed members of society.

RESIDENCES

Rock Creek has six residences in which our clients live with their peers in small compatible groups. Interaction between clients in the family-type setting encourages group identity, companionship, feelings of security and independence which are impossible to achieve in large institutionalized settings. Residences are minimally or fully supervised by live-in and/or visiting' counselors according to need.

FUNDING

From 1973 to 1978, Rock Creek experienced great difficulty in obtaining state and federal funding for its programs and services for the dually handicapped. Mental health authorities would not pay for services delivered to mental retarded individuals, and mental retardation authorities would not authorize payment for mental health services. Rock Creek was forced, therefore, to rely upon fee for service and insurance coverage. Rock Creek continued to operate under this system until 1978, when the Department of Health and Human Services recognized the relevance of Rock Creek's pioneer program for dually handicapped people.

Since 1978, Rock Creek has developed a diverse funding package that includes federal, state, third party payors, District of Columbia and fee for service. Monies to underwrite the program are also raised through corporate and private grants as well as special fund-raising activities.

SPECIAL BENEFITS

Special fund-raising events are planned throughout the year to support the programs and services to the dually handicapped During the past four years, we have undertaken two major fund-raising events as well as a variety of other fundraising activities. In 1981, our benefit was held at the lovely estate of Louise Gore and in 1982, the New England Embassy was the selected site. Both affairs were hosted by popular media personalities such as Hardin and Weaver of WMAL radio and attended by prominent social, political and media people such as George and Madeleine Will, Fred and Theresa Thomas of Channel 4 and 7 respectively, Paul Reece of Channel 9 TV and Barbara Harrison of Channel 4.

Among the smaller fund-raising events were the 1982 Hexagon Reception and Theatrical presentation at the home of Mrs. F. Edward (Patty) Cavin; the 1984 Vera Cristina fashion show hosted by Mrs. Harry H. (Betty) Straus at her Potomac home—events that were notable for their elegance and charm—and the 1982 Corporate Reception hosted by C&P Telephone and Merriot Corporation.

The Rock Creek Foundation is holding a gala benefit in the fall to celebrate 10 years of service to people in the Greater Washington Metropolitan area, who are both mentally retarded and emotionally disturbed. At this time, we are making a preliminary approach to the business community to gain support for the coming event, and we are requesting you to donate a gift to be auctioned during the evening festivities. Your tax deductable donation will be listed as you wish in our brochure, which will be widely distributed in the Greater Washington area.

This year, we want to make our 10th year celebration an even more spectacular event than the elequant sophisticated benefits that have taken place in the past and with your help, we can succeed. Your help will go directly to a local non-profit agency to help people in your community realize goals were once thought impossible and live with dignity.

Request for President and Mrs. Reagan to Co-Chair National Salute II to Veterans_

You have asked for our views on a request from George Sullivan of National Salute II that the President and Mrs. Reagan agree to serve as honorary co-chairs of National Salute II. It is our understanding, based on conversations with you and Richard Childress, that National Salute II is coordinating veterans observances in connection with the transfer of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial to the Department of the Interior and the installation of the statue to complete the Memorial. The President and Mrs. Reagan served as co-chairs of the first Salute in 1982.

There is no legal prohibition to the President and Mrs. Reagan serving as honorary co-chairs of this event. Our office, of course, is in no position to evaluate the policy question of whether the President and Mrs. Reagan should so serve. That decision must be made by those involved in and more familiar with veterans affairs. If the President and Mrs. Reagan do agree to serve as honorary co-chairs, those individuals coordinating National Salute II must be made aware of the limited ceremonial nature of this role.

SUBJECT:

Request for President and Mrs. Reagan to Co-Chair National Salute II to Veterans

The letter at Tab A was received by us requesting President and Mrs. Reagan to accept and act as co-chairs of the Salute.

This year's Salute is separate from the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund, but many of the activities will be held at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial and the national ceremonies will coincide with the erection of the statue which completes the Memorial.

The Director, George Sullivan, emphasized that the Salute was to all veterans, not just Vietnam, but will obviously have a primary focus on Vietnam due to the location and events. He is working out of Paralyzed Veterans of America and is coordinating closely with the other major veterans groups and the Veterans Administration (VA).

A commemorative candlelight ceremony to honor POW/MIAs is also planned, sponsored by the National League of Families. Ev Alvarez, Deputy VA Administrator, and the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs are expected to participate.

Mr. Sullivan, when asked what participation would be expected from the President and Mrs. Reagan responded that a photo opportunity with the President presenting a proclamation would be ideal, but a simple letter that accepted co-chairmen for publication would be fine also.

We are supportive of the request and forward it to you to ensure it would conform to White House guidelines on such matters.

Dear Mr. Hoffman:

Thank you for your letter of October 5 to the First Lady, along with the invitation to the Quality of Life Ball. In that letter you advised us that the First Lady had been selected to receive the first "Quality of Life Award of Merit." The printed invitation to the ball indicated that the ball was being held "to honour First Lady Nancy Reagan and to benefit The Northern Kentucky Diabetes Association And the Paul I. Hoxworth Blood Center."

We appreciate the kind and supportive sentiments expressed in your letter, and applaud your charitable activities and commitment to voluntarism. The community spirit you and the organizations involved have demonstrated is in the finest tradition of basic American values.

I am certain you did not intend the result, but it strikes me that the invitation to the Quality of Life Ball could be construed by some as suggesting that the First Lady is directly associated with the ball, the Dixie Jaycees, the Northern Kentucky Diabetes Association and the Paul I. Hoxworth Blood Center. Some recipients of the invitation might also assume that the First Lady will be attending the ball. It is unfortunately probable that some individuals decided or may decide to attend the ball on the basis of these unintended impressions.

Established White House policy generally prohibits use of the President's or First Lady's name in connection with particular private charitable fundraising efforts. As you might imagine, we receive countless requests that the President or First Lady participate in such efforts. We cannot accept them all, and out of fairness it has been necessary to adopt a policy of uniformly declining such requests, no matter how laudable the objectives of the charitable organizations involved. When individuals or organizations ask us if they may use the President's or First Lady's name in connection with charitable fundraising, we are constrained to deny their requests.

In this case it is necessary to correct the unfortunate impressions that may have inadvertently been created by the use of the First Lady's name. I would suggest that anyone who has received an invitation be contacted, to the extent that is possible, and advised that Mrs. Reagan will not be at the ball, and that she has not been involved with the organizations sponsoring or benefitting from the ball. It would also seem appropriate to offer to refund donations to any invitees who may have thought otherwise.

We certainly regret that action of this sort is necessary, and the last thing we want to do is add to the heavy burdens you have assumed in organizing this benefit for charity. I trust, however, that you will appreciate the reasons we must adhere to our policy of avoiding associations with particular fundraising efforts. Our adherence to the policy in this instance should in no way be construed as an adverse reflection on you or the Dixie Jaycees. You have our best wishes for what I am confident will be a successful event.

Bankruptcy Case

Joseph C. Hill has sent the President a "report and petition" of some 567 pages, alleging "massive violations" of Federal law, the Constitution, and civil rights in connection with a bankruptcy case pending in North Carolina. In his cover letter Mr. Hill states that "the facts will shock and outrage the American public" and that they "are of extreme importance to every person in the free world."
