Hezbollah Demonstration Urges Vengeance

BEIRUT, July 5—Members and supporters of the pro-Iranian Hezbollah faction marched through West Beirut today, vowing to avenge the victims of the downing of the Iranian airliner today.

Earlier, an unidentified caller to a radio station said that an American hostage would be killed in retaliation. But police said the call apparently was a hoax. A deadline set by the caller, purporting to speak on behalf of the Iran-linked Islamic Jihad organization, passed, apparently without incident.

"We will kill one of the two American captives and dump his body at Ramlet Baida at 8 p.m. Tuesday to take revenge for the shooting down of the Iranian jetliner in the gulf," the caller told the Sunni Moslemrun Voice of the Homeland radio station

Such calls cannot be verified, but the release of three French hostages May 4 was announced in a similar call by Islamic Jihad to the station.

Islamic Jihad, which has been linked to Iranian intelligence, claims to be holding two American hostages, journalist Terry Anderson and agronomist Thomas Sutherland, both kidnaped here three years ago.

Shiite security officials said tonight, however, that they doubted Iran would order the execution of American hostages in retaliation for the downing of the plane.

"This is just part of a war of nerves against the Americans. The hostages are worth too much to be expended in a retaliatory action," one Shiite security source commented.

In an interview published today, leading Shiite Moslem cleric Mohammed Hussein Fadlallah said that the hostages have "nothing to do with the plane and I don't find any justification for making the hostages accountable for a matter in which they are not involved."

Several hundred young people, led by four Hezbollah sheiks, gathered at the Lebanese University law school to stage the first rally in Syrian-controlled West Beirut since Syrian troops deployed in the southern suburbs—a haven for pro-Iranian fundamentalists.

The procession marched to the bombed-out U.S. embassy to call for "Death to America," and to pledge allegiance to Iran's Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini. Syrian plainclothesmen watched closely, sometimes directing Hezbollah organizers on how to proceed.

"Give us your signal, Khomeini, and we will bring volcanoes to erupt over the heads of Americans," marchers shouted.

But when the demonstrators reached the site of the former embassy, blown up in 1983, they discovered they had forgotten the American flag that was supposed to be trampled on and burned in front of television cameras.
