I SUSPELT STRONGLY THAT YOU ARE INUNDATED WITH PEOPLE WANTING SOMETHING FROM YOU. RELAN, I WAS TEAL DISAPPOINTED THAT YOU DID NOT ANSWER MY LETTER TO YOU EARLIER LAST YEAR. SUCH IS LIFE FTHATS ALL BEHIND ME NOW.

DURING MY TENURE THERE, I WAS IN & OUT OF TROUBLE WITH MEMBERS OF THE ADMINISTRATION, HOWER, NOT ONE WAS THE GOUSTINOR EMPARGMED WHILE I WAS RUNNING FEPC. THAT PLACE WAS A 200. YOU PETRE WERE GREAT TO ME & I THINK I DID A JOB FOR ALL OF YOU. MEETING PIER GHERINI WAS BY FAR THE BEST THING THAT HARRINGS TO ME AT FER. HE WAS A GREAT BOSS & HE TREATED ME LIKE ONE OF MIS ICIOS. WESTILL STAY IN CONTACT & I TRIKE TO RETE DEZIMAN. 1 AT FEDC, MY JOB, BECAUSE OF THE NATURE OF THE LAW AND TO STAY CLOSE TO THE MINDRITY LEGISLATORS, LABOR & CIVIL RIGHTS PEDALE. I DIO THEN & STILL HAVE CLOSE CONTACTS IN THAT AREA. MOST OF THEM WILL SAY PRIVATERY THAT THE REALAN PEDALE OID A 6000 JOB IN CIVIL RIGHTS.

NOW TO THE POINT: RECENTLY (WITHIN LAST,
TWO WEEKS) I HEARD THAT, YOU OTHERS ON THE
