Dear Mr. Deaver:

I understand that Congress is currently considering the elimination of taxes on completed construction contracts as one method of reducing the federal deficit. As a concerned citizen directly involved in this field, I believe such a measure would have a damaging financial impact on the construction industry and the U.S. economy, as well.

Construction is a high risk business. Any requirement for such an industry to pay taxes on estimated income will increase the risk and result in companies being more conservative with their earnings. This tax change will lead to reduced earnings for publicly held companies, which will affect stock prices and the ability to raise new capital. Reduced earnings will also affect the ability of a company to obtain bonds for projects requiring funding.

Many construction contracts provide for the owner to retain a portion of the contract price until the project is completed. This retention is often equal to the earnings on the project, and the contractor does not receive this amount in cash until it is released by the owner. The new tax change would require the contractor to borrow money or use operating capital to pay the income tax.

The proposed tax would also be inflationary as the added risk costs would be passed on to consumers. Increased borrowing would force the interest rates to remain high. This proposed tax measure would only contribute to further unemployment due to business failures, and the high cost of money and projects due to the increased costs.

This is an important issue to the construction industry. Please consider the proposed tax change carefully and review the serious impact it would have. Your assistance in preventing this change is appreciated.





Dear Mr. Deaver:

Jimmy Carter must be laughing his simple-minded head off at those of us who voted for Reagan in the mistaken belief that we'd get something better. You can bet yer bippy we won't vote for Ronnie again. If you'd like to know why, just read on.

1. Asinine pro-Communist Polish loan bailout. See Wall St. Journal editorial 2/3/82. The so-called bankers involved should be confined in a mental or penal institution, preferably the latter.

2. Anyone who supports any segment of the so-called "civil rights" laws is either demented or a deliberately bestial enemy of civilization. Anyone familiar with racial history knows that the Negroids dropped out of the upward march of civilization over 3,000 years ago when they failed to match the achievement of the Caucasoids and Mongoloids in developing the art of writing. 
