Dear Mr. Deaver:

Having served as Special Assistant to President Ford for Minority Affairs, I am acutely aware of the potential for misunderstanding of change in policy and its impact on the minority community.

I am of the opinion that a recent action by the Small Business Administration may adversely and unfairly impact upon the Reagan Administration. SBA's action means that 7,000 employees of 20 minority-owned firms who do work for the Federal Government, will be put in the street because of an abrupt policy change.


In capsule, GAO recommended that SBA remove minority-owned firms from the 8(a) Program if they exceed SBA's size standard for a small company.

These 20 companies had already received their graduation notices from SBA during periods ranging from 18 months to three years. They were prepared to accept this termination, and probably could survive if the promised time for graduation is restored by immediate SBA administrative action.

It will not cost the Federal Government a single dime to immediately promulgate a regulation from the SBA and permit these companies to graduate as scheduled. I have nothing to gain in this matter since I have no government contracts; however, as a loyal supporter of the President and lifelong Republican I know the Party will suffer.

Your immediate action is requested.

Dear Mike:

Attached is the picture your secretary asked the Brazilian Embassy in Washington to get signed. Somehow it ended up with me and I was happy to carry it over and get President Figueiredo to sign it. In the meantime, I lost your secretary's note, so I am sending it back directly to you.

Figueiredo's trip to Washington was the apogee of our relations with Brazil; the post-Falklands attitude is sobering, but the economic challenges they face in an election year is really what is causing the problem. Unlike Mexico and others who are (or were) on an oil "high", Brazil's economy--larger than Mexico's, Argentina's, and Venezuela's combined--is a broad-based one. They are suffering from the world recession. As normally happens in situations like this, people tend to blame the high U.S. interest rates and our "protectionist" policy, i.e. sugar, steel, etc. I have been taking to the stump quite a bit with the facts and figures, and while it slows the wave down, relations are deteriorating. I know that Shultz et al are up to their necks in CBI, Lebanon, etc. but my tap dance here is waning and we are going to have to give Brazil some sustained cabinet-level attention and stroking soon or we will risk further serious erosion in our relations.
