Dear Mr. Deaver:

I would like to request your participation in our tenth annual survey of national leadership.

Because you are a leader in your own field, your views on the quality of leadership, the importance of the country's institutions and your perceptions of the men and women who run America by virtue of their influence on national life are important to any evaluation of leadership.
