



SUBJECT: Women's Issues -- June 28 Meeting

At Olympia Snowe's request, I met yesterday with the Republican Members who met in March with the President.

Predictably most of their comments were aimed at the lack of follow-up since that meeting, and I think we've put that aside now. They are ready to get on with the business of working the issues -- legislative and administrative initiatives, as well as symbolic ones.

I've agreed that we will hold several sessions aimed at discussing with them our policies/recommendations in regard to the issues they raised with us and aimed at identifying ways we may resolve perceived and real problems of the "gender gap."

I've proposed a July 13 meeting to discuss elements of the women's economic equity act and pension reform. These two items include many of the legislative issues they raised with us, including:

- o child care/dependent care tax credits
- o spousal IRAs
- o insurance non-discrimination.

There is a time factor on these issues because Senate Finance has requested Administration testimony on both, and has agreed to wait until after the July recess to reconvene hearings to receive such testimony.

Dear Mr. Deaver:

Recently the Washington Post featured an article indicating the formation of a task force, under your auspices, to address the problem of the "gender gap". I want to applaud your efforts and offer my assistance.

Since resigning from the Ohio House of Representatives and joining the Administration I have maintained a schedule of speeches before various women's organizations. Let me tell you that the "gender gap" is real and should be addressed before the election. Part of the gap I believe can be closed simply by increasing the visibility of the ninety four women appointed to full-time top policy positions. I just returned from an Olympic coin promotional tour in Frankfurt, Brussels and The Hague and I found that the European press and public were intrigued to learn that the Mint Director was a woman. They were further impressed when they learned of the other women serving in key posts here in the United States. I am sure an effort to educate the American public would result in the same positive reactions as I encountered in Europe.

As the Co-chairman of the 1980 Reagan Campaign in Ohio I am looking forward to working on the President's re-election. Part of this effort I believe will be the necessary closing of the gender gap. I look forward to working with your task force on this problem soon; however, for several months now I have had a vacation scheduled in Kenya but will return to Washington on July 11th.


