



Dear Mike:

It has been almost a year since you were kind enough to come up to New York and share with some of our editors your unique view of the workings of the White House. I am reminded that it has been that long because the lunch with you was shortly before we began putting together our year-end issue, and here it is, that time again.

As I think you know, our year-end issue has always featured an interview with the President or the First Lady (and in the Reagans' case in 1981, with both of them at the same time). This year I am hoping that we can do something a little different that will be an even more intriguing look at the Presidency. I gather from remarks Mr. Reagan has made that he keeps a diary or daily journal of some sort, and I am hoping that he will consider sharing selected sections of that diary with PEOPLE'S 34 million readers of this special issue.

Few volumes have stirred more interest or shed more light on the personal qualities of a President than Harry Truman's letters written to Bess while he was in the White House. Mr. Reagan's enjoyment and appreciation of the Truman letters seemed apparent from his reference to them in a televised news conference a while back. What a delight it would be to present President Reagan's thoughts in a similar way that reflect his feelings on his own experiences throughout this year. The subjects covered would, of course, be those he is willing to share, but perhaps they could touch on favorite moments in the White House and at Camp David as well as from his travels. Photographer Harry Benson, who took the wonderful pictures at the Reagan ranch featured in this month's LIFE, told me how devoted the Reagans are to all the animals that they have accumulated there. What, I wonder, does he have to say about such un-presidential concerns as the care and feeding of these animals? I am not the only one who would treasure insights such as this.

I'm sure that you could suggest several events of the year that might be fascinating to read about from the president's journal, and I am eager to hear what you think about this idea. You can respond to me directly or through our Washington Bureau Chief, Garry Clifford.

Thank you again for your New York visit and for every cooperation you have shown to PEOPLE.
