

On behalf of the President, thank you for your recent letter concerning your interest in competing on behalf of the United States in international rhythmic gymnastics competition.

We have reviewed your situation thoroughly and regret to inform you that, even if you were to become a citizen today, there is still a three year waiting period before you would be eligible for membership on the United States Olympic Team. There are some exceptions to this rule, however, and we recommend that you contact the United States Olympic Committee in Denver, Colorado, for further guidance in this regard. While the President is adhering to a strict policy of not becoming involved in citizenship matters, we have forwarded your letter to the appropriate officials in the Administration for consideration and response. You should be hearing directly from them in the near future.

We wish you every success in rhythmic gymnastics competition and hope that you will continue to work toward eligibility for international competition on behalf of the United States.

I am writing to urge that you do what you can to see that Marvin R. Weatherly be appointed to the upcoming vacancy on the Federal Communications Commission. I have met you at several Chamber of Commerce receptions and am requesting your assistance in obtaining the backing of the Office of The President in support of Mr. Weatherly's appointment. He is currently serving as a commissioner for the Alaska Public Utilities Commission.

Because dramatic changes are being imposed upon the telecommunications industry, it would serve the best interests of the nation and the local ratepayer to have an FCC Commissioner who is thoroughly conversant with the regulatory, operational and technical aspects of the business. All too often, appointments to the FCC have been made from the Washington D.C. inner-circle. At this stage of the industry's transformation, it is imperative that at least one FCC Commissioner be familiar with the realities that exist, particularly within the more sparsely settled sections of our western states.

The FCC has taken an aggressive posture in deregulating the telephone industry and consequently generated enormous concern at the state and local level. Dear Friend:

Yesterday, President Reagan announced his intention to dismiss three Commissioners of the six-member U.S. Civil Rights Commission, including the Commission's only Hispanic, Blandina Cardenas Ramirez, a San Antonio educator. I am deeply concerned that President Reagan's new appointments do not include an Hispanic Commissioner, and have asked the President to reconsider his proposal.

If the Senate confirms the President's nominations, the Commission will not include an Hispanic for the first time since 1968. I find that unacceptable. The Commission was created in 1957 to combat discrimination and denial of equal protection under the law because of race, religion, sex, age, or national origin. It is therefore important that all groups affected by discrimination in our society, particularly a group as large as the Hispanic population, be represented on the Commission.

The U.S. Civil Rights Commission, having no enforcement authority, relies exclusively upon the persuasiveness of its findings and recommendations. It is therefore important that the Commission maintain its political independence so that its future effectiveness is not reduced.
