Tuesday, February 13, 1984  
3:30 p.m.

### -- Major Objectives of POTUS Trip:

1. Expanding Sino-American relationship.
2. American concern for and interest in supporting China's modernization efforts through scientific, commercial, industrial and other forms of cooperation.
3. Our establishment of a consultative relationship between equals based on mutual respect and common interests in world peace and stability.

4. Helo assets would allow us to maximize POTUS time in accomplishing #3, but do we want to push the Chinese for the use of helos? Is the use of helos worth the trade off in number of bodies it would take to support such assets?

5. How much does MKD want to push the pace on Friday?

6. Evening optional events would only fit into schedule on Friday - no other time to schedule them. Latest cable traffic leads us to believe Chinese are considering small dinner - not something that is done as a matter of habit, so we may have to do. However, will let PRC introduce dinner idea.
