Dear Mike:

Thank you for asking. However, although the postmark is the 14th, it took a week to get here, so I hope this response is adequate and timely.

First, a couple of points. You have asked for possible events and forums for the President to improve his standing among Blue Collars, Women, Catholics, Hispanics, and Senior Citizens. One of the points I suggested to you last time was that we should give out the same signal over and over and over again. The day of EPCOT was also a religious symbol day; therefore guaranteeing that each event would dilute the other.

I strongly suggest that if you have determined that you must go after each of these segments (and I do not agree that you should, with equal interest), that you segment the groups into time frames by week or by month and not compete against those symbols, i.e., a series of blue collar events or a series of Hispanic events, but not both.

I. BLUE COLLAR

# 1) Stock Car Race -

Certainly okay. Seems to have limited potential. If there were a Stock Car Hall of Fame and the President hosted a salute to them, that would be a little classier. If the President would go to North Carolina and award a distinguished American medal to Richard Petty at Richard Petty's home, that would be dynamite. Mr. Michael Deaver March 23, 1983 Page Two

# 2) Baseball Game -

Always okay, never special. Perhaps the President could go on the birthday of Gaylord Perry, or better yet, Carl Yastrzemski, presenting him with a cake in a locker room - kidding Yastremski/ Perry about how old they are - and if Yastremski maybe presents him with ethnic cake or cookies (I don't know what Polish people eat, but they must eat something special).

3) Drop-by Bowling Alley -

Love it. It suggests the Pittsburg and Cleveland areas. Perhaps follow this up by doing a lunch or whatever with living members of the Bowling Hall of Fame (if one exists), even at the White House. In Florida there are a lot of Senior Citizen bowling groups. Perhaps the President could bowl a game with one of the teams.

- 4) Grand Ole Opry Terrific, but bring it out of Tennessee. If possible to the White House or Kennedy Center, making Minnie Pearl or some other notable figure, head of an entertainment committee. Do a State Dinner or simply invite every Senator and Congressman with their spouse to Kennedy Center or the White House for the performance. Nancy Reagan and Ronald Reagan could be asked to sing.
- 5) July 4th -

On July 4th, perhaps rather than a picnic, go to a public beach.

6) Rodeo -

Excellent thought. Baldridge should accompany the President. The President should ride a horse. Baldridge should actually perform. West Texas would be perfect.

7) Local Union Hall -

Terrific. Milwaukee. Bring a barrel of Milwaukee beer. Must be spontaneous or could be embarrassing.

8) McDonald's -

Don't like it. Too many comparisons to the clown, Ronald McDonald.

# 9) Fire Station -

Perhaps a volunteer Fire Station. Go for a ride on a fire truck wearing fireman's garb. Have him present or be presented with a dalmation. If you can go for real hokey stuff, bring the "Annie" with leukemia to sing 'Tomorrow' to the President, while holding dog.

10) Small Town Churches -

Okay. Southern -Perhaps you could tie into a church cemetary, where a local celebrity or a major American figure can be eulogized about?

11) "Coffee Klatch" -

I would rather the President invite the local town fathers to gather. I'd rather drop into a truck stop or a diner and ask the truckers what's bothering them.

12) Vietnam Veteran's Memorial -

Sure, but perhaps we follow it up with going to a home where a disabled veteran lives and speaking to the wife. Perhaps even it could be a disabled WAAC.

13) Hospital Wards -

If the President would take his grandchild, it would be dynamite. I have believed, for a long time, that there are two ways to deal with Senior Citizens: money and grandchildren.

#### FIXED FORUMS

On the Fixed Forums, I prefer #'s 1 and 3. If you must do 2, 5, & 6, 2 seems to be least objectionable. But I wouldn't do any.

#### ADDITIONAL THOUGHTS

 Go to the Atlanta Center for Communicable Diseases. Check into most recent research on various diseases and announce more funding for some. Include cancer, AIDS, and perhaps something like sickle cell anemia. AIDS, in particular, would be cross-cultural and would score huge points with the media - shows compassion. - 2) I still like going to Chicago, Boston, wherever, to the home of an honor policeman. Pin a medal on him. Have a barbecue. Have a beer with the men in blue and their families. Dynamite symbolism.
- 3) Making John Wayne's birthplace a national monument. It's in Winterset, Iowa. I don't know when his birthday is, but that would be an appropriate time or when he died. Bring Clint Eastwood (let Eastwood see the future).
- 4) Attend a high school class play in suburbia Levittown, any state is perfect. Go back stage afterwards. Congratulate the kids. Nancy could do this without the President.

#### II. WOMEN

I tend to think that we will be responsive to women within other subgroups, i.e., Catholics and Blue Collars. In our data Reagan's problem with women centers on a number of issues: Military Defense - I feel strongly that this remains the crux of Reagan's problem with women; 2) The Compassion Issue - A Republican problem more than a Reagan problem, but because it is a Republican problem it is a Reagan problem. This issue includes education; and 3) The Explicitly Women Issues - ERA, Abortion, etc. - simply places Reagan in an adversary position, particularly against the women of childbearing age who may not support abortion, but who think it's none of the President's business.

1) Visit an On-Site Child Care Center -

Reinforces the problem Reagan has with women by speaking to a peripheral issue and not a central one.

2) Visit a Privately Operated Home Day Care Center -

Same problem. It makes the female issues an economic issue, which is exactly what you don't want to do.

3) Visit a Church Sponsored Child Care Center -

Combines the religious right issue with the wrong side of women's issue. Deadly.

4) Host a White House Induction Ceremony -

Perhaps the women who are to be, or are, inducted into the women's Hall of Fame could have their portraits painted and hung in a special wing of the White House as part of a public exhibition. Perhaps as a side thought we could have an exhibit of great American female painters. Reagan owns a Grandma Moses painting and perhaps that could be the featured painting of the exhibit.

5) Host a series of White House Luncheons -

Absolutely! Having the President meet with women leaders of Industry, Business, Religion, Science, etc. is a good idea, but I'd rather he met those people outside of the White House. In the White House why not invite say housewives, women who have a certain commonality, five or more children, single heads of households, working mothers, and wives of policemen.

6) Tribute to Women in Armed Forces -

Fine.

7) NASA Space Shuttle Woman Astronaut -

Very important potentially.

- a) go to Space Museum and introduce her to the Nation, well in advance of liftoff.
- b) followed that evening or shortly thereafter by formal State Dinner with all of the astronauts at the head table who will be on this mission.
- c) invite all living astronauts and their families, including John Glenn, to dinner. Have a special moment of silence and eulogy for those members of the space team who have since passed away - include Jack Swiegert and the astronauts who died on the aborted take-off.
- d) proclaim a salute to American astronauts week with a stamp preferably before, but perhaps afterwards, commemorating America's first woman astronaut.

- e) perhaps have Nancy Reagan narrate a half hour film on the role of women in aviation - Amelia Earhart, etc.
- f) after shuttle flight, have President bring astronaut crew on television to introduce them to the Nation.
- g) invite family of woman astronaut to White House very early so they can say how excited they were to meet the President to interviewers. This could be a home run.
- 8) Meeting with Women Leaders Of All Major Organizations -

Okay.

9) WIFE -

Okay.

10) "E" Award -

Don't know what it is.

11) National Women's Employment Education Model Program -

Not crazy about it.

12) High Tech Company Owned and Run by a Woman -

If we were to visit that kind of company, we should take a junior high school class (boys and girls), suburbia, solidly middle class, to show them what's available.

# ADDITIONAL THOUGHTS

- 1) A symposium or a press conference on the women's issue with the President (perhaps a forum), where only female members of the press are invited-from Ann Landers to Mary McGrory.
- 2) Speaking of Ann Landers/Dear Abby, if the President were to write a response to some question she had, it would be given the whole column, and certainly would have high communication value among women. Find a letter to Landers that criticizes education and throw out some educational initiatives of the administration.
- 3) Have the President nominate Jean Kirkpatrick for a Nobel Prize. She's the best woman symbol we have in our administration (my view obviously).

## FIXED FORUMS

The ones I like in particular are - Business Women's Groups, the National Council of Catholic Women, Women in construction, The Women's Economic Club, The American Agriculture Women's Association, The American Medical Women's Association, The National Council of Women in Education, and The Financial Women's Association of New York.

# III. HISPANICS

Clearly a group we can make inroads with, but should not be at the expense of Catholic ethnics.

1) "Little Havana"-

Excellent. Just to walk from store to store and eat on the run.

2) Spanish Apostolate -

Okay, but not major media event.

3) Cuban Independence Day -

Good if and only if the President is going to unleash some demagoguery about Castro.

4) "Puerto Rican Day"

Stay away from. More downside than upside.

5) Hispanic Leaders -

No big deal.

6) Hispanic Owned Businesses -

Okay.

# 7) Mexican Meal -

I have felt for a long time that the President should have a meal in each ethnic community - at leastonce a month on a regular basis. That will fill each community with pride. (The meal with D'Amato in "Little Italy" served that function.) A German restaurant in Milwaukee. A Polish restaurant in Chicago. An Irish pub in Boston. A Jewish restaurant in New York. They all have the same impact.

8) The President and Mrs. Reagan at a Mass - Hispanic Catholic Church -

Love it if it's simple - not too strained and quickly in and out.

9) National Hispanic University -

If there is a female valedictorian, who the President can award an honor to and make a speech on how Hispanic women are leading the Nation in overcoming the gender gap, it would work.

10) Mexican-American Unity Council -

San Antonio's Mayor is a much admired Hispanic figure. If the President could surprise the Mayor of San Antonio during the visit with some grant, some honor, and kid about their political differences, he could strike some real points. Make sure Nancy is with him.

11) Edgewood School District -

Let's go to a middle class school district. Keep education an issue for women in the middle class.

12) Cinco De Mayo Event -

Can't comment.

13) "Star Park" -

A little patronizing for the President. Perhaps Mrs. Reagan would be more appropriate.

14) Teacher Award -

Excellent. Give the teacher an award in the classroom, then invite teacher and students to either West White House or bona fide White House. Mr. Michael Deaver March 23, 1983 Page Nine

15) Cuban Exiles -

Okay, only if the President is willing to demagogue the issue ..

16) Briefing Leaders -

Not crazy about it.

17) Conference of Hispanic Ministry -

Okay.

### FIXED FORUMS

- 1) American G.I. Forum I particularly like this because it is in El Paso. El Paso is suffering because of Mexican devaluation.
- 2) "The Emerging Role of the Hispanic Community in American Society" -If the President were to go down and stand on the border and talk about the need and the desire to work together to solve the problems that face Mexico and America, particularly if he can utter some phrase in Spanish, "We can work together. We are all Americans." It might benefit both the Hispanics, in general, West Texas and New Mexico in particular. Perhaps Nancy can do this by herself.

# SUBSTANTIVE PROGRAMS

- 1) Hispanic Enterprise Zone Again, El Paso would be perfect.
- 2) "Border Economic Task Force" Ditto.

# ADDITIONAL THOUGHTS

- Bring together a conference of all the Mayors of all the border cities - Mexican and American - key-noted by President Reagan and the Mexican President. Have them all to the White House to begin the discussions.
- Fernando Valenzuela Clearly a Mexican-American hero. A day, a dinner, a luncheon, an award, whatever.

> 3) Roberto Clemente Day - Clemente died I think going to Nicaragua for earthquake relief. If on the day of his death or his birth we went to Pittsburg and made a speech about freedom in Central America, it would be apropos.

# IV. CATHOLICS

1) Fraternal Office or Church Hall -

Always good. Sons of Italy, particularly good.

2) Courtesy Call on Bishops -

Calling on Catholic Bishops or Cardinals should be standard operational procedure, even if for five minutes.

3) Catholic Bazaars -

No big deal.

4) Visit to convent/seminary -

Certainly not a convent. A seminary only if the President were to talk about the role of parochial education in America. Otherwise a little tricky.

5) "Civics Lesson" -

I like the President going in and granting a civics lesson to kids. A Catholic school or a public school is fine. The neighborhood should be working class, middle class. (Has the President ever gone back to the town in which he was born or went to school and done an event? Nancy could certainly do the same and do a series of them throughout the country - on the evils of drugs - just to normal classes junior high school level, not even assembly programs.

6) Call on Neighborhood Pastor -

Rather than having the President call on the Pastor, let the Pastor take the President around his local neighborhood.

7) Catholic University -

Should be a Catholic University, and again try to get a university where there is a woman valedictorian - tie them together.

8) Reception for National Catholic Educators'Association -

No big deal. Fair.

9) Meeting with Bishops -

Certainly a meeting with the Catholic hierarchy is desirable. A forum at the White House, the right setting. The agenda should be a little broader than suggested here.

10) Chief Administrators of Catholic Education -

Not as good as some others.

11) Proclamation Signing Ceremony -

Terrific, if the setting is right. For example, Pulaski day signing could be in a Polish restaurant in Chicago - tie them together. It could be done in the same week as a Carl Yastrzemski event, and in the same week or month when the President goes to see Cardinal Krol.

12) Presidential television broadcast - XMAS

Christmas with the President and his family is relatively standard, include sons, daughters, brother, grandchildren, etc.

13) Editors of Catholic publications -

Fine.

14) Ceremony in conjunction with Holy Week

Can't comment.

15) Cardinal Spellman Center -

Should be standardized.

16) Food/Clothes Drive -

Food/clothes drives are always good. Too early to decide for what cause. Should be distinctly middle America.

# SUBSTANTIVE PROPOSALS

The substantive proposals contained lots ot opportunities for good media.

- There is probably a definable Lithuanian neighborhood in New York or elsewhere. There is probably a restaurant or a church.
- 2) Religious persecution behind the iron curtain The President can combine that speech with a speech to Christians and Jews, or even by bringing in religious leadership among the various faiths to the White House for a luncheon, then make a speech.
- 3) Investigation into Assassination of the Pope Is chock full of interesting positions, and if done in "Little Italy" with Senator D'Amato, who has been hot on it anyway, the President again can combine a couple of objectives as one.

Dear Mike:

As you know, there is a good deal of speculation over whether the President will or will not run for re-election. The President has strongly hinted that he will run, but, obviously, at some point a clear signal must be given.

I suggest to you an excellent occasion for such an historical move would be the second Tuesday in March, 1983, exactly one year in advance of the New Hampshire Presidential Primary.

Even if the President were unwilling to officially announce his candidacy at that point, his appearance in New Hampshire on that date would be a dramatic sign.

My motives are not entirely unselfish. I will be a candidate for re-election in 1984, myself. Therefore, I suggest combining our interests. I suggest the President come to New Hampshire on March 8, 1983, to speak at a fundraiser for my campaign. His presence

in the first primary state exactly one year before the primary will have an unmistakable significance. His presence would attract heavy news coverage. The benefit to me is obvious.
