We need to develop a comprehensive policy with respect to Presidential delegations -- who determines whether a delegation will be at the Presidential level, who determines the numbers of a Presidential delegation, etc.

According to the Military Office, the responsibility for designating members of Presidential delegations has been delegated to Helene Von Damm. While the NSC does not wish to be involved in the day-to-day operations of Presidential delegations, the NSC staff should be involved in determining whether a delegation should be at the Presidential level and in the review of potential members of such delegations before a final selection is made.

RECOMMENDATION: That we convene a brief working level meeting, including a representative of the Military Office, to outline a general White House policy regarding Presidential delegations.

SUBJECT:

Delegations to International Conferences

This memorandum supplements my memorandum of March 27, 1981, on Presidential delegations. Following is specific procedural guidance on the handling of delegations to international conferences, assemblies and meetings.

- 1. TO/OTC, in coordination with all other bureaus in the Department, should provide M/WHL with a master list of all international conferences, assemblies and meetings to which U.S. delegations will be sent during the next 18 months. This list should include the date, location and nature of the event, size and type of U.S. delegation, and the source of the invitation to attend. This information will be transmitted to the White House by the Office of the Under Secretary for Management. As soon as IO learns of any new conferences not on the 18-month projected schedule, it should immediately notify M/WHL in writing and provide all the above information for transmittal to the White House.
- No later than 90 days prior to the date of any 2. such conference/assembly/meeting, IO (after consultations with H and S/CPR) should provide M through M/WHL with a memorandum describing fully the particulars of the conference: type, date, location, purpose, and background as well as a list of proposed U.S. delegations with a brief biographic statement on each and the source of the recommendation for such delegates. This memo should also state if Senate confirmation, security clearances, or conflict of interest clearances will be required for any members of the delegation. If personal ambassadorial rank is sought for any members of the delegation, a separate memorandum making such a request should be submitted with

the delegation memorandum. This request should give a justification for the conferral of such rank.

- 3. M/WHL will coordinate White House recommendations for such delegations and integrate them into the list provided by IO.
- 4. A complete, integrated list of prospective delegates in hand, M/WHL will then prepare a manorandum from the Under Secretary for Maragement to the White House with the concurrance of the Deputy Secretary describing the conference in detail and recommending that a U.S. delegation be sent. This memorandum will also include a master list of all individuals suggested for inclusion in the U.S. delegation and the source of such suggestions.
- 5. Once the White House has reviewed the recommendations and has made a final decision on mambership in U.S. delegations and/or conferral of personal ambassadorial rank, the White House will transmit to the Under Secretary for Management a list of the approved delegation and approval or distapproval of any request for ambassadorial rank.
- M/WHL will then notify IO or the appropriate bureau coordinating the delegation as well as H and S/CPR. M/WHL will also initiate paperwork on the delegation if Senate confirmation, security clearances, conflict of interest clearances, or personal ambassadorial rank is required for any members of the delegation.
- 7. In the conferral of personal ambassadorial rank, Section 302(2)(B) of the Foreign Service Act states that the Senate Foreign Relations Committee must receive a written report from the President at least 30 days prior to the President's conferral of personal ambassadorial rank. This report must set forth the following information:
 - (a) necessity for conferring rank,
 - (b) dates during which rank is to be held,
 - (c) justification for not submitting conferral as a nomination for Senate advice

and consent, and

(d) conflict of interest information on the candidate.

In addition, candidates for personal ambassadorial rank must receive security and legal clearances which will require at least 30 days to process. It will be the responsibility of the bureau requesting the conferral to prepare the report required by the Act, and to provide it to M for translittal to the White House. This can only be done after requests for conferral have been approved by the White House and security and legal clearances have been obtained.

U.S. Presidential Delegations

The following guidelines are to be utilized if a foreign government requests, and the U.S. Government accepts, the sending of a delegation to represent the President at an inauguration, funeral, wedding, or anniversary celebration.

- 1. The appropriate regional burcau office Director, in immediate phone or cable consultation with the mission, is responsible for the preparation of the following:
 - a. Recommended size of delegation

b. Suggested composition of delegation

(NOTE: These two steps should be resolved irrefistely.)

c. Proposed itinerary, including local hotel

- and transportation arrangements
- d. Briefing material for delegation
- Suggested security arrangements
- 2. Bureau recommendations on the size and composition of the delegation should be reviewed by the Chief of Protogol and the Assistant Secretary for Congressional Relations if the proposed delegation includes members of Congress. The Egreau then forwards the list of proposed delegates to M which will obtain the views of the Secretary.

- 3. M will then forward this delegation list to the White House for approval/acceptance.
- 4. The final list of proposed members of the delegation will be forwarded by M to S/CPR which will have the responsibility of communicating with the proposed delegates.
- 5. If the level or size of the delegation, or a critical time factor, is considered to warrant the provision of a U.S. aircraft to transport the delegation, S/CPR will be pasponable for transmitting to the White House a request for such an aircraft to darry the delegation from Washington, D. C. to the host country and return.
- S/CPR will be responsible for providing first-class arrangements for the delegation. If spouses are not included in the delegation but wish to accompany, and the feasibility of their attending the function has been approved by the host government, S/CPR will make all arrangements at the expense of the individual, including the cost of transportation on a U.S. aircraft.
- 7. S/CFR shall be responsible for handling the following arrangements on behalf of the delegation: transportation, passports, visas, innoculations, and information concerning approphiate clothing requirements.
- 8. The following is an indicative list of those who might be called upon to accompany the official delegation as appropriate and essential:
 - The appropriate regional burcau office Director and/or other officials.

- b. Protocol officers from S/CPR.c. An escort officer from Congressional*Relations, if the delegation is to include members of Congress.
- A representative from the office of the Under Secretary for Management.
- Additional escort officers, if any, should the situation warrant, from other appropriate bureaus.
- SY agents, as required.

If there is disagreement between the bureaus and offices about the size and/or composition of the accompanying party, this will be resolved by the Under Secretary for Management in consultation with the Secretary's office.

Under Secretary Kennedy has assigned overall action responsibility in M to Mr. Conrad K. Hausman, Special Assistant in charce of the White House Liaison Staff. He will be assisted by Patricia A. Lehmann. They are located in Room 6311, Ext. 29793.
