With the Quebec City meeting between the Prime Minister and the President just eight weeks away, I would like to propose that Derek Burney and I, together with Ambassador Gottlieb, meet soon with you and Robert McFarlane to discuss the substantive aspects of the visit. We would wish to go over in as much detail as possible at this stage what can be achieved at Quebec City both in terms of the issues and, more generally, the future of our bilateral relationship.

We would propose coming to Washington on January 31, by which time we will have the benefit of the Prime Minister's preliminary views on the progress of our preparations.

After our meeting, if you agree, it would be useful to follow up with a round of discussions with U.S. officials directly involved in the agenda items and possible agreements referred to in the Prime Minister's and President's recent exchange of letters. Five or six officials from Ottawa could come to Washington for these sessions, and stay over to February 1 if further time is needed.

I look forward to hearing from you. If this proposed timing and approach to a first meeting is acceptable, our embassy will be in touch with Mr. McFarlane to work out a full program.
