# Trying to Make Sense of Premature Death

Monday was a lost and forlorn day for dogs in the San Gabriel Valley, for purebred dogs with families as distinguished as Burke's Peerage and for the Pasadena. Humane Society's most recent tatterdemalion.

And it was a day of desolation as boundless as the black holes in space for the people who own dogs.

Lynn Morrow died, 32 years old and full of love and life. For nine years, Lynn owned and ran a dog grooming shop in Pasadena and those of us who knew her are left wandering among the shards trying to find a scrap of reason to hold on to.

She was a brave girl, gallant and generous. As a child, she had a number of operations with long recuperations and her mother, Mary Cozens, said, "She always came out smiling. She liked to ride horseback through the woods as a little girl, always bareback because she said that was the way the horse felt most free."

Lynn loved all animals but she had a leaning toward whippets. Whenever or wherever a whippet was in trouble, Lynn hurried to rescue it. I had been in the shop many times when she had driven all night to pick up a dog, sick, frightened or hurt in a city maybe 300 miles away.

She had a sheaf of awards and letters of acclamation for her work for the Pasadena Humane Society. One was from the National Dog Groomers Association of America.

Lynn said that there were purebreds and mixed breeds in the pound that didn't stand a chance of adoption because they looked so scruffy and forlorn.

Lynn took them to the shop and gave them the most debonair clips, long into the evenings after her regular days work was finished. Then, when they went back to the Humane Society, Lynn said, "They do better about finding homes when they know they look good. They walk with a prance. They toss their heads. And then they are taken by people who will love them."

Everyone talked about the freedom Lynn gave her clients. They strolled around the floor, nodding and chatting with each other, like members of a club, meeting at a posh resort. If one of the dogs started to growl, one soft word from Lynn stopped it. They seemed to know that antisocial behavior was simply unnacceptable at Dogs' Best Friend.

Lynn stayed at our house often when Patsy and I were out of town, house guesting with Bixby, the schnauzer, and Cuchulain, the cat. She and David put our Christmas tree ornaments up in the attic for us after the 1980 season and had planned to get then down last Saturday. By that time, Lynn's heart was somehwere else. David, her dear friend, was going to make us his special crepes for breakfast.

There will be a memorial for Lynn at 6 p.m. Friday at Harris Hall Chapel of the La Canada. Presbyterian Church.

All her friends are invited and the dogs will do their own, I am perfectly sure.

There are no answers for early death in the midst of joy. Maybe St. Francis needed some special help getting the animals ready for the Nativity scene. Camels can be crotchety, it is said. Lynn will be of special help with the gentle barn creatures. She used to have a pygmy goat named Peanut Butter that scampered around the shelves of the shop.

In the honor guard to meet her in heaven will be a foursome of her friends who must already have tried the patience of the good saint, Misty and Bixby, Aldoon and Sazerac. Lynn Morrow; dogs' best friend? Oh, my,


