Viewing Presidential Events

I am concerned about the circumstances described in the attached memorandum since this occurrence is symptomatic of a problem we are experiencing with increased frequency.

There are agreed upon procedures established for the purpose of providing members of the staff, Secret Service agents, and other pass holders opportunities to view selected Presidential movements within the White House complex. These agreements enable pass holders and their guests to stand in preferred locations while maintaining a safe, controlled, and dignified environment for the President. I believe adequate deference is shown to members of the White House staff in attempting to accommodate particular requests – even those on the margin of the guidelines.

When a disagreement occurs during a Presidential event it unfortunately creates distractions for our personnel and risks potential embarrassment for everyone. When we must question the actions of a staff member which results in either challenges to, or actual defiance of, our authority, the outcome can only be counterproductive and serves to undermine unnecessarily the excellent working relationship we all have worked so hard to establish.

If the procedures we are currently using for these events are inadequate or ill-defined, I remain available to negotiate this issue with your staff to everyone's satisfaction. If this is not necessary, then I need your help in reaffirming the existing guidelines in order to emphasize the importance of adherence and to preclude further confrontations.

I bring this to your attention because mutual respect of our roles is so important.

Bear Mr. Secretary:

Last week on a cable television news program, I witnessed an event which I consider to be despicable.

One of the accredited newsmen accompanying President Reagan to China, when confronted by a situation which he apparently deemed to be over-reaction by security personnel, verbally harassed members of the Secret Service.

According to the account provided by the news tapes, Mr. Sam Donaldson of the ABC Network, when refused entry to certain areas became very upset and vented his anger at members of the Secret Service who were acting to protect the President. As I am able to remember the words he used on the tapes they were "this is not the actions of the Chinese; it is your doingnext you'll be kidnapping women and killing children". (Or words quite close to these.) All because he had been denied access to certain areas.

Must we condone this behavior in the name of a free press? I wonder what Mr. Donaldson would have reported had he observed such an event and not been part of it?

It appears to me that an apology is in order from Mr. Donaldson to the members of the Secret Service who were acting in the best interest of the United States.

It also appears that maybe a review of Mr. Donaldson's credentials are in order to insure that one who is privileged to accompany the President, particularly on a foreign trip, is able to act at a level which is above that expected from an unruly child. The Chinese kindergarten children appeared to act with more decorum.

Dear Mr. President:

With the most recent terrorist activity in the Nation's Capitol, it has come to my attention that a possibility exists during the State of the Union Message for a major catastrophe.

With the fact that the State of the Union Message gathers all 435 Congressmen, 100 Senators, including the majority and minority leadership of both houses, members of the Cabinet, the Vice President and all the Supreme Court justices, a terrorist act at this event could in essence leave our government with no possible successor.

I bring this matter to your attention for a two-fold purpose: One, that every possible security measure, both internally as well as externally, be provided for the security and safety of those on the House floor as well as those in the gallery. Two, that consideration be given that the Vice President not attend the State of the Union Message, so that there would be a leader in place should a catastrophe (God forbid) happen at this event.

I realize that we cannot cave-in to terrorist activity and ask that my request be viewed in that light. However, I feel it would be wise to make sure in this circumstance, as well as circumstances of a similar nature, that the necessary security measures be in place.

The White House Pass System is a necessary element in the security of the White House Complex. In order for the Pass System to work properly it requires the cooperation of all Staff Members with the following procedures:

- (1) All Staff Members, with the exception of full assistants to the President, are expected to display their White House or EOB Passes at all times while they are within any part of the White House Complex, including the Residence and East Wing.
- (2) All Staff Members clearing appointments into the East/West Wing Complexes shall meet the appointments in the appropriate lobby area. Appointments must be escorted at all times, including back to lobby when leaving the Complex. This includes Administration Officials from other Departments and Agencies.
- (3) All Staff Members bringing guests to the East or West Wings for a tour shall remain with the guests at all times, including back to the lobby at the conclusion of the tour.

The Secret Service has been asked to courteously enforce these procedures. Please cooperate with them.

I have asked the Secret Service to report any violations to John Rogers, Special Assistant to the President for Administration.
