SUBJECT:

CANCELLATION OF WHITE HOUSE TOURS

On any given day (Tuesday - Saturday) somewhere between 8,000 and 10,000 people go through the White House on tour. Of this number, almost 2,000 have confirmed reservations for Congressional, VIP, or Group tours. Thus, any event which closes the White House to tours, results in 8,000 - 10,000 disappointed people. The number of days the Residence is open for tours has already dropped about 10 percent in the first five months of this year, compared to the same period last year. While this decrease is a matter for concern, it is not really the major problem.

The real problem occurs when the Residence is closed to tours on short notice. This means that the 2,000 or so people who have reserved tours must be contacted and informed of the closing. During the busy time of year, they can rarely be accommodated at another time. When the notice of the closing is very short, it is often impossible to contact the people and they must be turned away at the gate.

While I realize that it is not possible to avoid last minute events which close the Residence to tours, I hope that you will weigh the effects of the closing when measuring the benefits of that particular event. The more advance notice that is given, the less of a problem there will be.

I know you get hit from all sides about the President's schedule and I don't mean to add to your burdens, but I felt I should let you know.


