Dear Mr. Deaver:

I prevailed on my long-time friend Ed Allison of Senator Laxalt's office for advice regarding how Almaden Vineyards might possibly be represented in the wine cellar of the White House.

Ed, who apparently discussed this with you or a member of your staff, suggested that we send some wine directly to you. That makes a great deal of sense. Your reputation as a connoisseur of fine wines is widely established, and we at Almaden would be honored to have you review our wines.

Accordingly, I have arranged for delivery to you of an assorted case of Almaden and also Charles Lefranc Founder's Wines. The latter brand is made with the choicest grapes, all from our own vineyards, is aged extensively in French oak and is extremely limited in production. Our answer to "boutiques," as it were.

I hope you enjoy the wine and consider it appropriate for the wine cellar in the White House. That would recall our immense pride when Almaden Blanc de Blancs Champagne (1,200 cases of it) was donated to be served as the official champagne on President Reagan's Inauguration.

I hope to hear from you, or through Ed, about any one or several of our wines being sent to you. Meanwhile, thank you very much for providing Almaden this opportunity.

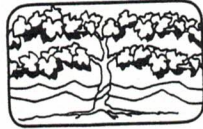

Dear Mr. Sittman,

Following our conversation yesterday morning, I would like to confirm the visit to the White House of the Sonoma County Wine Growers Association on Wednesday, March 9 , at 10 a.m.

I have attached a list containing the names of the participating wineries, the wines they would like to contribute to the President's wine cellar (one case from each winery,) and the representatives from each winery (in most cases, the owner/s and/or wine maker.

Subject to your approval and suggestions, may I suggest the following format for our visit?

The winery representatives, plus myself, will come from the Shoreham, probably by bus if this is convenient.

Weather permitting, we would like a few photographs of our group outside against the backdrop of the White House.

The presentation ceremony would be at 10 a.m. with Mr. Deaver. Each winery representative would bring one bottle of the wine being donated. Wherever the presentation will take place, we suggest that Mr. Crawford Cooley make a few appropriate remarks about the occasion, then autograph and present one bottle of wine to Mr. Deaver.

The other bottles would be autographed and held by the others present during the ceremony, then placed on a large table afterwards. We could thus arrange the wine for appropriate photographs.

The Sonoma County (CA) Wine Growers Association would like to acquaint you with an important project of ours that we believe may be of interest to the White House.

Our organization represents 63 premium wineries in Sonoma County. Each year our winemakers and principals sponsor tastings in 3-4 major wine markets across the country, enabling wine writers, trade members, and the general public to become familiar with the quality and diversity of Sonoma County wineries and their wines.

Our 1983 schedule is as follows:

- March 6: Los Angeles
- 8: Washington, D.C.
- 10: New York
- 14: Boston

In Washington, the Association and our co-sponsor, Les Amis du Vin, will present two tastings at the Shoreham Hotel. One, from 4-6 p.m., will be for the writers and the trade; the second, from 7 to 9 p.m. will be for the general public. Tickets will be \$15.00 to the public; we expect an attendance of about 1,000.

We would like to present our wines not only to Washington but, if possible, to the White House, and, more specifically, to President Reagan's wine cellar. We are aware of, and very much appreciate, the fact that the President has served at official functions wines from some fifteen of our members. We would like to take advantage of our presence in Washington by presenting the President with wines for his use from all the Sonoma County wineries participating on the tour (list attached).

"California's Oldest Premium Winery"

December 9, 1982

Specifically, each winery would like to donate one case of its best wine to the President's cellar. While we would naturally look to you for direction in this matter, I would hope that the wine-maker/principal (one per winery) present to the President, or to you, a representative bottle of the wine donated. Such a presentation, if possible at the White House, would certainly be for us the highlight of our tour and would be much appreciated by the entire wine community of Sonoma County. The President would be the recipient of some of the finest wines this country produces, for his personal or official use.

I hope that this proposal meets with your approval and I look forward to exploring it with you.

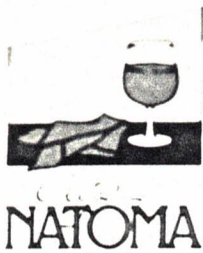

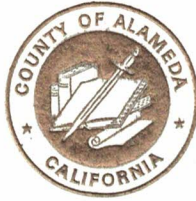
