The Texas Rangers of the American League will be playing the Chicago White Sox in Arlington Stadium, just halfway between Dallas and Fort Worth, on August 20, 21 and 22 at 7:30 p.m. Fran and I would very much like to have you and Mrs. Reagan attend a ball game and sit in the owner's box with us.

I know how very busy you will be, and how difficult it is for you to move from place to place, but I just wanted you to know you are invited. Your presence at such an event would be a great thing for the whole State of Texas, one that would certainly get lots of good publicity.





'Mother power' can help win drug war, Mrs. Reagan says

First lady Nancy Reagan was in Dallas Tuesday and called for "mother power" as a major deterrent to drug abuse.

"When a woman gets aroused, watch out," she told committee members of the Texans War on Drugs, meeting in a private luncheon.

"A woman is like a teabag: You never know her strength until she's in hot water. A woman whose child is involved in drugs is in hot water."

The first lady was in Dallas as part of a 2-day anti-drug crusade in. Florida and Texas.

In an interview with The Dallas Morning News, she said, "You've got to start your concern over drugs as soon as your child can walk or talk. All you have to do is The drug problem "crosses all social, economic and color lines."

Nancy Reagan

go to some of these treatment centers or read in the paper to know that children are sniffing cocaine at 5 years old."

Mrs. Reagan called the drug struggle a "very democratic problem that crosses all social, economic and color lines."

No minorities were apparent among the well-dressed group that dined on pate, asparagus and raspberry sherbet at the luncheon at the Anatole Hotel. Nor were there any at her next stop in University Park where she met with representatives of a group called "Richardson Families in Action."

She acknowledged that she has been meeting just with middleclass whites on this trip. "It just happened that way," she said. "I've talked to many others that are not middle-class whites."

Mrs. Reagan said young people in low-income areas with drug problems face a "whole different set of problems."

"We don't know the answer to those problems yet," she said, "but we are certainly going to figure out something."

Mrs. Reagan said she did not feel cuts in federal funds will have any effect on drug-abuse programs.
