Date: November 26, 1984

The Press Conference on Wednesday, November 28, would ideally start with Mike Deaver reading an opening statement, prior to both your opening statement and the questions for the press. For both you and Mr. Deaver, the press office would prepare either a formal statement or talking points, whichever are preferred. However, in either format, we would put together quotes for the press release which, among other things, will be included in the press kit.

Aside from introducing the theme of the Inaugural
-- "We the People ... An American Celebration" -Mr. Deaver would address the following:

- * The Inaugural as a people's celebration in which all can participate.

 - k. The 50th American Presidential Parade
 - 1. American Inaugural Balls

(In addition to the above events, I would think you should touch briefly upon the American Inaugural Information Galleries.

In discussion of all events, you should mention -- and we'll prepare the necessary handouts for the press kits -- the dress code, how many of the events are free, how much the tickets are for specific events. The question of who will be invited is addressed below.)

- 3. The unveiling of the Official Logo (which will be on the press kits.)
- 4. The unveiling -- in whatever form is available -- the memorabilia that will be marketed by Doug Blaser, as well as a description of how it will be marketed.
- 5. The means by which the Inaugural Committee will be inviting people to various functions, including:
 - a. The 400,000 Commemorative Announcements
- b. The work done at the state level to make certain as many people as possible are invited.
