We are affiliated with the National Federation of Parents for Drug Free Youth and I would feel privileged to help by meeting with any of your staff.



Senator David Locke of Wellesley our state senator who ran your campaign in Massachusetts is well acquainted with my work in drug prevention here in Mass. Last year, against great odds we got a mandatory sentence for major drug traffickers passed. We are now working for good drug education. What we'd had has been horrendous.
