Dear Dr. Turner:

Your reputation as a fine speaker and a knowledgeable presenter has found its way to our Fall conference committee. As a result, we would very much appreciate your talents at our Fall ACTION conference entitled "TOGETHER... for a change" in Denver, Colorado.

First, let me give you some information about the conference. This conference is actually sponsored by a group called Colorado in Action for Drug Free Youth. We are a coalition of parent group leaders, educators, doctors, police officers, health specialists and many others who have come together in an attempt to provide support to volunteers who are fighting drug abuse and to educate the people of Colorado about drugs, always with the bottom line of helping to prevent adolescent drug use. Our conference will be held in Denver from the morning of Thursday the 30th of September until noon on Saturday, October 2. We will have plenary sessions during each of the three mornings and group sessions Thursday and Friday afternoon. Conference participants will choose among eight different group sessions, each with a separate emphasis on one of the following categories: parents, youth, education, business, judicial/legislative, medicine/health/agency, law enforcement and religion.

We would appreciate your participation during one of the morning sessions and up to four of the afternoon sessions. We must have a clear budget to work with as soon as possible.

Thank you so much for considering our conference. We intend to recruit between 600 and 800 participants and your contribution will therefore have an enormous impact on the momentum and direction of our movement toward a healthier generation of young people not trapped by drugs in Colorado.
