Dear Carlton:

This is to invite you to be the Guest Speaker in a special section on drug abuse prevention in the Spring issue of Synergist, a technical assistance journal for educators published by ACTION's National Center for Service-Learning.

Each issue carries a special section that includes articles on how student volunteers are helping their local communities cope with a national problem. The purpose of these sections is to give educators models that they may adapt and to make them aware of the needs they may find in their own communities. The Guest Speaker is a recognized expert in the field under discussion, someone who can give an overview of the scope of the problem and encourage educators to try to deal with it. That is why we would greatly appreciate your taking on this assignment. The article would be approximately 900 words, and it would be due December 2.

As you may not be familiar with Synergist, I am enclosing copies of the last two issues. Published three times a year, Synergist goes to some 20,000 secondary and postsecondary educators working with student volunteer and service-learning programs. (Service-learning is the integration of coursework and community service.) Some 3,000 volunteer coordinators (such as Red Cross staff members) also receive the journal.

The special section will include articles on a Channel One program in Rhode Island and the efforts of parents' groups to curb marijuana use in conjunction with students. We also will have several short pieces on programs of various types and a listing of organizations that may provide resources to educators.

I hope that you find our project worthwhile and can find the time to add your voice to this call for initiating new and expanding old drug abuse prevention programs. Please let me know by November 13 whether you will be able to contribute this article.
