PRESS AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS PLAN

One of the president's six goals in the national crusade for a drug-free America is improved international cooperation to achieve full involvement by every country in defeating international drug trafficking. The two-day meeting of U.S. ambassadors to some of the countries which face or may face serious problems of narcotics production, trafficking or consumption will underline that goal.

Key Objectives of the Meeting

--Convey to ambassadors the sense of urgency with which the U.S. Government is approaching the issue of drug demand reduction.

--Provide opportunity to discuss increased regional cooperation which could lead to a more effective international narcotics strategy.

Themes

--The President and Mrs. Reagan are committed to a relentless effort to free the drug user from drugs and prevent others from becoming users.

--Success is possible when illegal drug use becomes unacceptable in American society. Public attitudes in the U.S. have strengthened against the use of illegal drugs.

--Mrs. Reagan has set the tone: "There is no moral middle ground. Indifference is not an option." We are committed to building a drug-free America.

--President Reagan has declared drug abuse a threat to our national security. It is a critical worldwide problem which requires increased regional cooperation and a higher level of international attention.
