# RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE AAP TASK FORCE ON SUBSTANCE ABUSE TO THE AAP EXECUTIVE BOARD, June 18, 1984

The Directive to the Task Force was to advise the Executive Board on the most effective and reasonable activities the Academy should take against substance abuse.

The Task Force makes the following recommendations for Academy Goals, Objectives, and Projects:

GOALS:

The American Academy of Pediatrics should designate the problem of drug abuse, including alcohol, by young people and their families as a major area of concern and activity for the organization.

The Academy should create the mechanism to ensure the coordination and implementation of the following proposed objectives and projects.

### **OBJECTIVES:**

- Educate pediatricians how to interivew, identify and counsel/manage young people (and their families) who are using drugs, including alcohol. This objective should be extended step-wise to include the education of pediatric residents and medical students.
- 2. Become actively involved in the support and implementation of comprehensive educational programs for children, young people, their families, and the community regarding drug/alcohol use, in consort with liaison groups already engaged in that activity.

### PROJECTS:

1. Develop an educational program for practicing pediatricians to become knowledgeable concerning the subject of drug and alcohol abuse with emphasis on identifying problems in their patients and families and providing resources to deal with same. This would include:

AAP Annual and Spring Meetings, seminars, workshops
CME courses
PIR/PREP
PEDIATRICS, News&Comment
Video/Audio tapes

Substance Abuse Task Force Recommendations Page 2 June 19, 1984

- 2. Promote and support programs which would reduce the risk of accidents or injury in which drugs and/or alcohol is a contributing factor.
- 3. Promote through AMSPDC the development of teaching programs in medical training facilities to teach prevention, treatment and management of drug and alcohol abuse.
- 4. Develop reference guides which include printed materials on these subjects (drugs and alcohol); one list which would provide information for the professional and another which is directed to patients and families (e.g., an annotated bibliography).
- 5. Remain informed and become actively involved in legislation addressing the issue of drug and alcohol abuse.
- 6. Encourage and support research activities in the field of drug and alcohol use by children, adolescents and young adults.
