Dear CT:

As promised, I enclose the confidential draft report of the U.N. Administrative Management Survey's review of the operations of the drug bodies in Vienna. The U.N. is extremely sensitive about documents such as this being released and, therefore, I would appreciate your not giving this copy to anyone else (although I think the State Department also has one). Please return it when you have had a chance to look at it.

The major conclusion of the study is that the U.N. should set up a Narcotic Drugs Centre which basically would merge the Division of Narcotic Drugs and U.N. Fund for Drug Abuse Control. I find this recommendation rather peculiar in that approximately five years ago a similar administrative set-up existed and was severely criticized by several governments at the Commission on Narcotic Drugs, including the United States. This led to the appointment of separate directors of the Division and the Fund.

I think it would be useful for you and me to discuss this report in the near future with Betty Gough, the U.S. member and Vice President of the International Narcotics Control Board in order to determine whether action should be taken, either through the INCB or the U.S. government, to support or object to any of the AMS' recommendations. I will call you in the beginning of next week to arrange such a meeting.
