SUBJECT:

Korea Rice Sales

At Tab A is a State Department information memo on the subject of rice sales to Korea. As noted in the memorandum, Korea is committed to buy 500,000 tons of 1981 California crop rice.

The telegram you noted at Tab B is a request of Comet Rice Inc. to allow 1982 California crop rice to be shipped in fulfillment of the contract since they have access to this rice through the coops. The current crop rice and 1981 crop rice is, according to USDA, co-mingled in silos, thus indistinguishable. State is formulating a reply to the telegram this week. The Korean government course of action is not yet clear, but a decision should be forthcoming reasonably soon.

Subject: U.S. Rice Sales to Korea

Background

Korea is committed to buy 500,000 tons of 1981 crop California rice. The commitment results from USG agreement in 1980 to an exception to the U.S.-Japan rice agreement (restricting the sale of highly subsidized Japanese rice) to allow the ROK to buy Japanese rice to offset a shortage. Pursuant to that commitment, the ROKG signed contracts with two companies in early 1982 for the shipment of a total of 130,000 tons, all of which has been delivered. In May, Korea contracted with Comet Rice Inc. for the purchase of the remaining 370,000 tons.

Two large California cooperatives (which together control about 75% of the California crop) have refused to sell to COMET except at a price substantially in excess of COMET's contract price, presenting COMET with the choice of losses or default on the contract. The co-ops have to date insisted on a sale to Korea through their long-time agent, Connell Rice and Sugar Company. Korea has said it will not deal with Connell because Korea deeply resents Connell's tactics. This impasse has continued since last May. As a result, COMET has supplied only 115,000 of the 370,000 tons required by its contract.

The Korean government understands, however, that although we are neutral as to particular contractual arrangements, we expect Korea to take promptly the full 500,000 tons of 1981 crop rice and to begin shipments as quickly as possible. Korea is exploring alternatives through which this can be accomplished. Reflecting the growing surplus of California rice and declining market opportunities, the co-ops recently have shown interest in a direct sale to the ROKG, but have yet to communicate this position directly to the Koreans.

Congressional Interest

Congressman Alexander and a number of other representatives from rice growing states have expressed strong dissatisfaction over the long delay in the fulfillment of Korea's commitment to the USG. Many have claimed that the contract with COMET was not a good faith step by Korea (we have no evidence to support this claim), and have urged us to press Korea to make other arrangements. Some apparently believe that the Koreans should buy from Connell, which has ready access to the remaining 1981 rice stocks. Congressman Alexander has recently indicated his awareness that some compromise solution may be necessary.

Deputy Secretary Dam has been in frequent contact with interested Congressmen. Mr. Dam met with a group of Congressmen and Senators in late September, spoke with Congressman Alexander by phone yesterday, and is scheduled to meet with Alexander and others on Wednesday. Mr. Dam told Alexander that we were continuing to urge Korea to act promptly while remaining neutral on the commercial competition. signs of movement in the market, and stated that we had urged the Koreans to take action leading to prompt shipment. He passed on a request from the Korean Ambassador that Alexander encourage the co-ops to contact Korea directly.

Conclusion

We have sought a solution to this problem which will result in prompt action by Korea to fulfill its commitment. We have done so in a manner which avoids State Department involvement in the competitive process as well as damage to the U.S.-Korea relationship. We have told Korea, which believes it has acted properly and in good faith throughout the process, that we are neutral as to the contractual arrangements by which it fulfills its commitment, but that we expect it to make arrangements to begin shipments by January. We have made our position known to the ROKG at the highest levels both here and in Seoul. The Deputy Secretary has raised this matter twice with the Korean Ambassador, and, at his request, it has been raised several times at high levels in Seoul. Realistically, unless all parties demonstrate a willingness to compromise a resolution would be difficult. We are working to facilitate a resolution while avoiding involvement in the commercial process.
