2. ISSUE: VERSAILLES ECONOMIC SUMMIT -- A. BACKGROUND: MITTERRAND HAS TAKEN AN ACTIVE PERSONAL INTEREST IN THE PREPARATIONS FOR THE VERSAILLES HE IS INTERESTED FOR INTERNAL POLITICAL REASONS SUMMET IN MAKING IT A SUCCESS. HE IS ALSO INTELLECTUALLY INTRIGUED BY THE SUBJECT OF PARTICULAR FRENCH INTEREST. ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY, AND HAS BEEN WORKING PERSONALLY ON IDEAS FOR INTRODUCTION INTO THE COMMUNIQUE. - MITTERRAND WANTS TO AVOID CONFRONTATION ON SUCH THORNY SUBJECTS AS INTEREST RATES AND NORTH-SOUTH RELATIONS, WHERE FRENCH VIEWS AND INTERESTS DIFFER FROM OURS. ALSO WANTS SOMETHING POSITIVE TO COME OUT OF THIS SUMMIT. - -- AS THE NEXT SUMMIT HOST, THE U.S. HAS A SPECIAL INTEREST IN THE OUTCOME OF VERSAILLES AND IN PARTICULAR IN THE ISSUES SUCH AS ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY WHICH WILL FEED INTO THE U.S. SUMMIT IN 1983. - -- VERSAILLES WILL IN A SENSE BE UNIQUE IN THAT FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE THE SUMMITS BEGAN ALL THE PARTICIPAT-ING HEADS OF STATE AND GOVERNMENT WILL HAVE MET AT THE PREVIOUS SUMMIT; IN 1983 THERE MAY BE SOME NEW FACES.

--- WE RECOGNIZE THAT THERE HAS BEEN DISAGREEMENT ON SOME ISSUES -- PARTICULARLY INTEREST RATES AND NORTH-SOUTH RELATIONSHIPS -- AND WE APPRECIATE PRESIDENT MITTERRAND'S WILLINGNESS TO FIND CONSTRUCTIVE WAYS FOR BRIDGING OUR DIFFERENCES. -- THERE HAS BEEN VIRTUALLY UNIVERSAL IN RECENT YEARS THAT THE SUMMIT PREPARATION SHOULD BE

LIGHTER AND LESS BUREAUCRATIC, BUT NEITHER THE CANADIANS

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NOR THE FRENCH SEEM TO HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFUL IN CUTTING BACK ON THE PREPARATORY WORK. DOES PRESIDENT MITTERRAND HAVE ANY INSIGHTS THAT HE MIGHT PASS ON TO US?

ISSUE: NATO SUMMIT BACKGROUND: THE LEVEL OF FRENCH PARTICIPATION AT Α. THE NATO SUMMIT IS EXPECTED TO BE THE HIGHEST IN RECENT HISTORY. MITTERRAND WILL ATTEND THE DINNER FOR CHIEFS OF STATE AND HEADS OF GOVERNMENT ON JUNE 9. PRIME MINISTER MAUROY WILL ATTEND BOTH THE DINNER AND PLENARY MEETINGS JUNE 10. FOREIGN MINISTER CHEYSSON WILL ALSO ATTEND THE PLENARY. WE WANT TO ENCOURAGE MITTERRAND TO ATTEND THE CEREMONY OF SPANISH ACCESSION AND GENERALLY TO EVOKE A FORTHCOMING POLITICAL STANCE FROM MAURDY AND CHEYSSON AT THE MEETINGS THEMSELVES.

5. ISSUE: MIDDLE EAST

-- A. BACKGROUND: SINCE MITTERRAND'S VISIT TO ISRAEL
AND HIS LAST MEETING WITH THE PRESIDENT, THERE HAS BEEN
NO APPARENT MOVEMENT TOWARD RENEWED FRENCH INVOLVEMENT
IN THE MIDDLE EAST PEACE PROCESS. FRENCH RELATIONS WITH
SYRIA HAVE PLUMMETED, PRIMARILY AS A RESULT OF SYRIA'S
ROLE IN ANTI-FRENCH TERRORISM BOTH IN LEBANON AND IN

- -- WE WILL BE MAKING A MAJOR EFFORT IN THE COMING

- -- WHAT IS MITTERRAND'S PERCEPTION OF THE SITUATION
IN THE MIDDLE EAST AND POSSIBILITIES FOR FURTHER PROGRESS?

6. ISSUE: U. S. MILITARY RELATIONS WITH MOROCCO A. BACKGROUND: THE FRENCH ARE CONCERNED ABOUT THE DEVELOPING U.S. MILITARY RELATIONSHIP WITH MOROCCO. OSTENSIBLY, THIS CONCERN DERIVES FROM A BELIEF THAT TOO CLOSE AN EMBRACE OF KING HASSAN BY THE U.S. (E. G. FREQUENCY OF HIGH-LEVEL VISITORS AND PUBLICITY GIVEN TO THEM) COULD (A) DO HIM HARM WITHIN HIS OWN COUNTRY, (B) UNDERCUT HIS POTENTIAL AS A REGIONAL "NON-ALIGNED" LEADER AND (C) DETRACT FROM HIS ROLE AS A RELIGIOUS LEADER. IN FACT, THE FRENCH CONCERNS PROBABLY ARISE ONLY IN PART OUT OF THE FOREGOING. THEY LIKELY SEE OUR RELATIONSHIP DOING HARM TO THEIR ALREADY TARNISHED RELATIONS WITH MOROCCO AND MOST IMPORTANTLY UPSETTING FRANCE'S EFFORTS TO WORK OUT CLOSER TIES WITH ALGERIA. THE ALGERIANS, THEY PROBABLY FEAR, MIGHT BE PUSHED CLOSER TO THE SOVIETS IN ORDER TO COUNTERBALANCE US INFLU-ENCE IN MOROCCO OR, ALTERNATIVELY, TO IMPOSE DEMANDS IN THE MILITARY FIELD ON THE FRENCH THAT MIGHT BE DIFFICULT TO MEET.

-- B. POINTS TO MAKE:

- -- WE ARE NOT SEEKING TO COMPETE WITH FRANCE IN MOROCCO.

- -- OUR MILITARY RELATIONSHIP WITH MOROCCO IS LIMITED TO CONTINGENCY ARRANGEMENTS FOR ENROUTE ACCESS AND MORE REGULARIZED CONSULTATIONS.

ISSUE: TERRORISM BACKGROUND. THE LONG-STANDING AND CYNICAL FRENCH ATTITUDE OF AVOIDING THE PROBLEM OF TERRORISM SO LONG AS THE VICTIMS ARE NOT FRENCH IS CHANGING IN THE WAKE OF A SPATE OF INCIDENTS WHICH HAVE KILLED FRENCH CITIZENS. TERRORISM HAS NOW BECOME A MAJOR POLITICAL ISSUE IN FRANCE, AND THE INITIAL FALLOUT HAS BEEN NEGATIVE FOR MITTERRAND AND THE SOCIALISTS. THE GOVERNMENT HAS MITTERRAND AND THE SOCIALISTS. ANNOUNCED A SERIES OF ANTI-TERRORISM MEASURES --TIGHTENING UP ON IMMIGRATION POLICIES, INCREASING POLICE POWER PUTTING PRESSURE ON EMBASSIES KNOWN TO HAR-BOR TERRORISTS, DOWNGRADING OF RELATIONS WITH SYRIA BY EXPELLING TWO OF HER DIPLOMATS, AND RECALLING THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR TO DAMASCUS. IMPORTANT ASPECT OF THE PROBLEM, THE LIBERAL FRENCH TRADITION OF POLITICAL ASYYUM, IS IDEOLOGICALLY IMPORTANT TO THE SOCIALISTS, AND THEY HAVE SO FAR FAILED TO FACE UP TO ITS REFORM. IN SPITE OF MITTERRAND'S OWN COMMITMENT TO GET TOUGH AND THE GOVERNMENT'S NEW ANTI-TERRORISM MEASURES, WE HAVE NOT YET SEEN A CHANGE IN THE NEGATIVE FRENCH ATTITUDE TOWARD BROADER INTERNATIONAL DISUCSSION IN THE FIGHT AGAINST TERRORISM. THE FRENCH HAVE OPPOSED OUR EFFORTS TO INSCRIBE TERRORISM ON THE VERSAILLES SUMMIT AGENDA AND HAVE RESISTED OUR CALL FOR

MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

A PRE-SUMMIT MEETING OF TERRORISM EXPERTS.

- B. POINTS TO MAKE:
- -- WE APPRECIATE THE RECENT CHANGE IN FRENCH POLICY REGARDING TERRORISM AND THE FRENCH GOVERNMENT'S STEPPED UP EFFORTS TO COMBAT IT. THE FIGHT MUST BE WAGED ON AN INTERNATIONAL LEVEL, AND WE STAND READY TO LEND OUR SUPPORT.

- -- WE APPRECIATE EFFORTS TO APPREHEND THE MURDERERS OF OUR ASSISTANT MILITARY ATTACHE IN PARIS, LT. COL RAY, AND CONTINUED POLICE PROTECTION OF OUR EMBASSY AND ITS PERSONNEL. BUT WE CANNOT REALLY SOLVE THE PROBLEM UNLESS WE ATTACK ITS ROOT CAUSE -- THE FACILITY WITH WHICH INTERNATIONAL TERRORISTS OPERATE INFRANCE. -- WHILE WE RESPECT THE FRENCH TRADITION OF POLITICAL ASYLUM, IN AN AGE OF RAMPANT INTERNATIONAL TERRORISM IT HAS BECOME NECESSARY TO PROTECT THE LEGITIMATE RIGHT OF POLITICAL ASYLUM WITHOUT GIVING ENCOURAGEMENT TO

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THOSE WHO SUPPORT TERRORISM.

- -- WE AGREE THAT THE SYRIANS HAVE FOR SOME TIME SUPPORTED INTERNATIONAL TERRORISM. WE ALSO CONTINUE TO BELIEVE THAT THE LIBYANS CONTINUE TO PLAY AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN TRAINING, SUPPLYING AND HARBORING INTERNATIONAL TERRORISTS.

ISSUE: A. BAG DEALING WITH ALLIANCE PUBLIC OPINION BACKGROUND: IN RECENT MONTHS THERE HAS BEEN A SURGE OF PACIFIEST AND NEUTRALIST THINKING IN EUROPE, WHICH HAS BEEN NOTABLY ABSENT IN FRANCE. THIS HAS E THIS HAS BEEN FOCUSSED ON THE PENDING INSTALLATION OF PERSHING AND CRUISE MISSILES. AND HAS BEEN MIRRORED IN THE UNITED STATES BY GROWING NEO-ISOLATIONIST SENTIMENT FAVORING WITHDRAWAL OF U.S. FORCES FROM EUROPE AND PROPOSALS FOR A USG DECLARATION OF NON FIRST-USE OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS. WITH ITS BROAD CONSENSUS IN FAVOR OF A STRONG INDEPENDENT NUCLEAR DETERRENT-BASED DEFENSE, FRANCE HAS BEEN RELATIVELY IMMUNE FROM SUCH SENTIMENTS. -- B. POINTS TO MAKE: -- WE ARE CONCERNED ABOUT GROWING PACIFIST SENTIMENT IN EUROPE. ESPECIALLY IN GERMANY. -- THIS PHENOMENON STRENGTHENS DESIRES AMONG SOME SEGMENTS OF AMERICAN PUBLIC OPINION FOR WITHDRAWAL OF U.S. FORCES FROM EUROPE. WE WANT TO COUNTER THIS, WE ARE CONVINCED THAT HAVING OUR FORCES IN EUROPE IS IN OUR FUNDAMENTAL INTEREST AS WELL AS IN THAT OF EUROPE. -- I KNOW THAT YOU AND YOUR GOVERNMENT HAVE ALREADY

Meeting with Attali Representatives on French President's Technology Report

Bob Hormats, Beryl Sprinkel, and I met for two hours with Pierre Morel and Marc de Brichanbault of Jacque Attali's office, to discuss the French President's report on technology. This was the first detailed presentation of the contents of the report.

The report will contain three parts:

- -- First part identifies the new technologies of the future, micro-electronics, bio-technology, new material, space and oceans, and emphasizes the social and political problems which these technologies will create.
- The second part identifies five major areas in which Summit leaders have political interests at stake in the new technologies -- employment consequences, protectionism, risk of concentration and monopolies, inequality with developing countries spawned by technology, and consequences for the social and cultural identity of individual nations.
- The third part proposes cooperative efforts to achieve new growth through technology, to develop human resources through greater cooperation in vocational training, etc., and to cope with the impact of technology on culture. The centerpiece here is a study group of prominent industrial and government leaders that would develop cooperative projects and report back to Summit leaders at the next Summit.

In our response, we emphasized the political attractiveness of the subject because it deals with the longer-term and represents a more fundamental approach to our economic problems and because it offers hope in the midst of the present recession. We urged that the report be positive about the benefits of technology and not overemphasize centralized management of technology either by government or

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industry. We supported the ideas of a study group as long as its work was closely integrated with existing institutions and activities already underway in these institutions.

- BEGIN TEXT: DEAR MR. AMBASSADOR: AS I INFORMED YOU IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE RECEIPT OF MR. PERLE'S LETTER, WE HAVE TAKEN CAREFUL NOTE OF THE AGREEMENT REACHED FOR THE DELIVERY OF THE CRAY ONE COMPUTER, WHICH RESULTED FROM THE DECISION TAKEN BY THE CHIEFS OF STATE OF OUR TWO COUNTRIES AT THE TIME OF THEIR RECENT MEETING IN WASHINGTON. THEREFORE, THERE SEEMS TO ME TO BE NO OBSTACLE TO THE DELIVERY OF THE COMPUTER. WITH RESPECT TO THE OTHER QUESTION WHICH IS MENTIONED IN MR. PERLE'S PAPER, I WOULD LIKE TO REITERATE THAT THIS MATTER IS UNDERGOING AN IN-DEPTH EXAMINATION BY THE

GOVERNMENT IN ORDER THAT THE SAID CONTRACT WILL PRESENT NO MILITARY RISKS. MR. PERLE IN HIS LETTER HAS TAKEN NOTE OF WHAT HAS ALREADY BEEN ABLE TO BE DONE IN THIS DIRECTION. AS I INDICATED AT THE TIME OF MY VISIT TO WASHINGTON LAST JANUARY, THIS MATTER WILL BE PRESENTED BILATERALLY (AND IF APPROPRIATE, IN COCOM) WHEN THE MANNER OF EXECUTION WILL HAVE BEEN COMPLETELY REVIEWED. (COMPLIMENTARY CLOSE) SIGNED CHARLES HERNU END TEXT.

2. SECRETARY REGAN AND I MET AT THE RESIDENCE WITH FINANCE MINISTER DELORS ON MAY 9. DELORS STATED THAT FRANCE, IN THE INTERESTS OF HARMONY WITH THE UNITED STATES AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE ALLIANCE, IS PREPARED TO TAKE MEASURES FOR THE CONTROL OF EXPORT CREDIT TO THE SOVIET UNION WHICH WERE NOT IN FRANCE'S COMMERCIAL INTEREST. SPECIFICALLY, FRANCE WILL AGREE:

A) TO PLACE RUSSIA IN CATEGORY I OF THE CONSENSUS;

DELORS SAID FRANCE EXPECTS TO LOSE (TO GERMANY, JAPAN AND ITALY) ABOUT FF FIVE BILLION OF EXPORTS AS A RESULT OF THEIR NEW POLICY. THEY ARE NOT ASKING A QUID PRO QUO FROM THE U.S.
- 3. AT A SUBSEQUENT INFORMAL MEETING WITH SECRETARY REGAN AND MESSRS. SPRINKEL AND LELAND AFTER DINNER, TREASURY DIRECTOR CAMDESSUS REVIEWED THESE POINTS AND PROMISED TO PUT THEM IN WRITING FOR THE NEXT MEETING

OTHER POINTS MADE BY DELORS: A) FRANCE FORESEES TWO DIFFICULT ECONOMIC YEARS AHEAD. THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS, LACK OF INVESTMENT INFLATION. AND THE DEFICIT IN THE SOCIAL SECURITY SYSTEM HEAD THE LIST. HE HOPES TO ATTACK INFLATION SUCCESSFULLY ALBEIT SLOWLY (DOWN TO 10 PERCENT BY END OF 1982) LIST. PRINCIPALLY BY LIMITING WAGE INCREASES, AND ALSO BY STABILIZING THE FRANC. DURING THIS TWO-YEAR PERIOD. FRANCE WILL NEED EXTERNAL FINANCING. (SECRETAR REGAN AND I SAID LOANS FROM THE U.S. WOULD COME (SECRETARY FROM PRIVATE BANKS WHICH TODAY ARE READY TO DO BUSINESS WITH FRANCE. OUR BOND MARKET IS ALSO OPEN AND RECEPTIVE.) B) AS TO INVESTMENTS BY FRENCH COMPANIES IN THE U.S. HE REITERATED HIS UNDERSTANDING WITH ME THAT HE WOULD ADVISE THE EMBASSY OF ANY PROPOSED PURCHASES. SECRETARY REGAN AGREED THIS WAS A GOOD ARRANGEMENT. C) A NUMBER OF AMERICAN COMPANIES WANT TO BUY HOWMET TURBINES, THE U.S. SUBSIDIARY OF THE RECENTLY NATIONALIZED ENTERPRISE PUK (AND A PRIME DEFENSE THE GOF DOES NOT WANT TO SELL BUT WOULD CONTRACTOR) BE WILLING TO DISCUSS HAVING A PARTNER. WITH RESPECT TO LOANS TO THE USSR AND EASTERN EUROPE, THE GOF IS DIVIDED INTO TWO CAMPS: THOSE THAT WISH TO DIFFERENTIATE AMONG THEM AND THOSE THAT DO NOT. DELORS REGARDS HIMSELF AS A DIFFERENTIATIONIST.

MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

(COMMENT: ALTHOUGH THE DISTINCTION WAS NOT ALTOGETHER CLEAR, HE WAS PRESUMABLY DEFINING NON-DIFFERENTIATIONISTS AS THOSE THAT WOULD LIKE TO CONTINUE TO GIVE CREDIT WITHOUT REGARD TO POLITICAL CONSIDERATIONS.)

E) DELORS MADE A POINT OF TELLING US THAT FRANCE LINKS TOGETHER ECONOMIC, MILITARY AND POLITICAL ISSUES INVOLVING THE USSR, E.G. THEIR ATTITUDE ON CREDITS COULD BE INFLUENCED BY THE GENEVA INF TALKS. HE FEELS THIS APPROACH SHOULD BE SHARED BY ALL THE ALLIES AND FEELS THE VERSAILLES SUMMIT IS A GOOD PLACE FOR THIS MATTER TO BE DISCUSSED. I INFORMED HIM OF THE BILATERAL LUNCH AT THE ELYSEE OF JUNE 3 AND HE THOUGHT THIS MIGHT BE A SUBJECT TO BRING UP.

MINISTER CHEYSSON

- 2. SUMMARY: DEPUTY SECRETARY STOESSEL MET WITH FORMIN CHEYSSON ON MAY 11, ACCOMPANIED BY DCM MARESCA. SUBJECTS COVERED INCLUDED FALKLANDS, VERSAILLES SUMMIT, AND MIDDLE EAST. CHEYSSON URGED THAT HE AND THE SECRETARY MAINTAIN CLOSE CONTACT DURING THE NEXT FEW DAYS, IN CASE THERE IS A BRITISH LANDING IN THE FALKLANDS. END SUMMARY.
- 3. FALKLANDS: CHEYSSON BEGAN BY REITERATING HOW USEFUL IT IS FOR HIM TO HAVE A CLOSE WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITH THE SECRETARY. HE THEN TURNED TO THE FALKLANDS SITUATION, AND NOTED THAT, EXCEPT FOR ARGENTINA'S ACT OF AGGRESSION, THE BRITISH CASE IS VERY WEAK. NEVERTHELESS, BECAUSE OF THIS AGGRESSION, FRANCE STANDS FIRMLY WITH THE BRITISH ON THIS ISSUE. THERE WAS NO PUBLIC PRESSURE IN FRANCE TO CHANGE THIS STANCE AND CHEYSSON FULLY EXPECTED IT TO CONTINUE. CHEYSSON SAID THIS SHOWED HOW CLOSE THE FRENCH AND BRITISH PEOPLES ARE IN THEIR VALUES AND ATTITUDES. HOWEVER, CHEYSSON SAID, THE BRITISH

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

SHOULD NOT TRY TO LINK THE FALKLANDS WITH OTHER ISSUES, AS HE SAID THEY WERE NOW TRYING TO DO WITH THE AGRICULTURE DISPUTE WITHIN THE EC. THERE WAS NO LOGIC IN SUCH LINKAGE AND BRITAIN'S EC PARTNERS WOULD REJECT IT. AT THE END OF THE MEETING, CHEYSSON RETURNED TO THE FALKLANDS ISSUE. HE TOLD STOESSEL IT WOULD BE VERY IMPORTANT FOR HIM AND SECRETARY HAIG TO REMAIN IN CLOSE CONTACT DURING THE NEXT FEW DAYS, IN CASE THERE SHOULD BE A BRITISH LANDING IN THE FALKLANDS. CHEYSSON SAID THURSDAY AND FRIDAY OF THIS WEEK WOULD BE ESPECIALLY IMPORTANT. STOESSEL INDICATED THE SECRETARY WOULD BE TRAVELLING TO ANKARA AND ATHENS, BUT IT WOULD BE POSSIBLE TO REACH HIM.

4. VERSAILLES SUMMIT: CHEYSSON SAID IT WOULD BE IM-PORTANT TO HAVE A SINGLE, SIMPLE AND POSITIVE IDEA WHICH PAGE 02 OF 02 PARIS 6744

WOULD BE ARTICULATED AFTER THE VERSAILLES SUMMIT, SINCE THE PEOPLE IN WESTERN EUROPE WERE DISCOURAGED AND NEEDED "TO SEE THE END OF THE TUNNEL." CHEYSSON CITED THE EXAMPLE OF THE TOKYO SUMMIT, WHEN A STRONG SINGLE THEME EMERGED. THIS NEED NOT BE AN AGREED POLICY. IN RESPONSE TO STOESSEL'S QUESTION AS TO WHETHER THE FRENCH HAVE SOMETHING SPECIFIC IN MIND, CHEYSSON SAID THE FRENCH THOUGHT A SYSTEM FOR CONSULTATION ON EXCHANGE RATES WOULD BE A POSSIBILITY. THE FRENCH BELIEVE THERE SHOULD BE CONSTANT CONSULTATION AMONG THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DOLLAR, THE YEN, AND THE ECU. STOESSEL SAID HE THOUGHT WE WOULD BE OPEN TO FRENCH SUGGESTIONS, WHICH WE WOULD STUDY CAREFULLY.

CHEYSSON CITED THE PROBLEM FACING THE AD-MIDEAST. DITIONAL FRENCH TROOPS BEING ADDED TO THE UNIFIL CON-TINGENT, AND THE FRENCH REQUEST FOR A U.S. DEMARCHE TO THE ISFAELIS ON THIS SUBJECT. HE NOTED THAT HADDAD'S FORCES IN PROXIMITY TO THE NEW PROPOSED FRENCH POSITIONS COULD BE REPLACED BY LEBANESE FORCES, IF THAT WOULD HELP. CHEYSSON WAS TOLD THAT FOLLOWING HIS MESSAGE TO THE SECRETARY ON THIS SUBJECT, NEW INSTRUCTIONS HAD BEEN SENT FROM WASHINGTON, AND WE WOULD NOW BE SUPPORTING THE FRENCH WITH THE ISRAELIS. CHEYSSON WAS CLEARLY VERY HE ASKED THAT THIS REMAIN BETWEEN THE U.S. GRATEFUL. THE ADDITIONAL FRENCH TROOPS WOULD EMBARK AND FRANCE. IN ABOUT A WEEK FOR LEBANON ON THE ASSUMPTION THAT A SATISFACTORY ARRANGEMENT COULD BE REACHED ON THIS POINT.

MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

- BEGIN AND CAMP DAVID: CHEYSSON SAID BEGIN HAD BE-COME IMPOSSIBLE TO DEAL WITH AND SEEMED BLIND TO THE PALESTINIAN RESISTANCE, THOUGH HE HIMSELF HAD BEEN A PALESTINIAN RESISTANCE, THOUGH HE HIMSELF HAD BEEN A RESISTANCE FIGHTER AND SHOULD UNDERSTAND THE SITUATION BETTER. HE SAID THAT BEGIN HASN'T UNDERSTOOD THE MEANING THE RESISTANCE IN THE LEFT BANK AND THAT IT WOULD INCREASE IN INTENSITY BECAUSE OF ISRAELI POLICIES. STOESSEL SAID WE WOULD BE PRESSING THE AUTONOMY TALKS IN THE COMING MONTHS, AND HOPED IT WOULD BE POSSIBLE TO RESOLVE THE ISSUE OF JERUSALEM AS A SITE FOR THOSE TALKS. CHEYSSON SAID THE FRENCH ATTITUDE ON THE PEACE MOVES WAS WELL UNDERSTOOD IN WASHINGTON. HE ASKED WHETHER IT WOULD NOT BE POSSIBLE TO EXPAND THE CAMP DAVID PROCESS SO THAT ONE SIDE MIGHT CONSIDER IT A PROLONGATION OF CAMP DAVID, WHILE THE OTHER MIGHT SEE IT AS A NEW INITIATIVE. IT WAS ESSENTIAL TO INCLUDE JORDAN IN THE PROCESS, AND THIS MIGHT BE A WAY TO MAKE THAT POSSIBLE. STOESSEL NOTED THAT IT HAD ALWAYS BEEN THE INTENTION TO INCLUDE JORDAN; THIS DID NOT SEEM TO BE A REAL POSSIBILITY RIGHT NOW BUT MIGHT DEVELOP IN THE FUTURE.
- 7. CHEYSSON WAS FORCED TO CONCLUDE THE MEETING AT THIS POINT WHEN HE RECEIVED A SERIES OF PHONE CALLS APPARENTLY RELATING TO URGENT DEVELOPMENTS IN BRUSSELS ABOUT THE

- SUMMARY: IN MAY 10 MEETING AT THE MARGINS OF THE OECD MINISTERIAL IN PARIS, DEPUTY SECRETARY STOESSEL AND DANISH FOREIGN MINISTER OLESEN REVIEWED OUTSTANDING ISSUES, THE DANISH WELCOMED RECENT U.S. INITIATIVE ON NUCLEAR ARMS QUESTIONS AND TOOK "MODEST" CREDIT FOR STOESSEL STRESSED RAISING THEIR DEFENSE BUDGET SLIGHTLY. THAT DANISH PM JORGENSEN'S RECENT CRITICISMS OF THE U.S. IN THE PRESS WERE UNHELPFUL. OLESEN ACKNOWLEDGED THE

MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

DIFFICULTY BUT STRESSED THE TRADITION OF "NOT SO DIPLO-MATIC PUBLIC DEBATE" IN DENMARK AND VERY STRONG U.S. -DANISH FRIENDSHIP. IN THE MIDDLE EAST, OLESEN SAW AN EC TENDENCY TOWARDS RECOGNIZING THE PLO AND HAS ADVISED THE ISRAELIS TO TAKE THE DIPLOMATIC OFFENSIVE. REGARD-ING THE FALKLANDS, OLESEN REPORTED HIS "GUESS" THAT THE EC WOULD NOT RENEW SANCTIONS AGAINST ARGENTINA WHEN THEY EXPIRE MAY 17. END SUMMARY.

DANISH ATTITUDE TOWARDS NUCLEAR ARMS TALKS. PRAISED PRESIDENT REAGAN'S MAY 9TH SPEECH FOR TAKING THE OFFENSIVE. OLESEN SAID THAT THE DANISH WERE "REALISTIC BUT POSITIVE" ON ARMS NEGOTIATIONS AND CONSIDERED THAT THE U.S. REACTION TO THE ISSUES HAD BEEN GOOD. IN RESPONSE TO OLESEN'S ASSUMPTION THAT INF AND "START" NEGO-TIATIONS WOULD BE COMBINED, STOESSEL SAID THAT INF NEGO-

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TIATIONS WOULD BE SEPARATE FROM, BUT IN THE FRAMEWORK OF, "START": WHETHER OR NOT A COMBINATION OF INF WITH
"START" WOULD OCCUR AT SOME FUTURE DATE REMAINS TO BE
SEEN. OLESEN NOTED THAT THE ONGOING NUCLEAR DEBATE IN
DENMARK REFLECTED A BROADLY-BASED, SPONTANEOUS MOVEMENT,
ALTHOUGH THERE HAD BEEN SOME COMMUNIST INFILTRATION. ON
THE POSITIVE SIDE, THE DEBATE, FORMERLY CONCENTRATED ON
WESTERN ARMS, NOW INCLUDED ARMS IN BOTH EAST AND WEST.
HE ALSO NOTED THAT IT WAS CLEAR THAT A BUILDUP IN CONVENTIONAL WEAPONS WOULD BE NEEDED IF THERE WERE LESS
RELIANCE ON NUCLEAR ARMS (L.E., A NON-FIRST-USE AGREEMENT).

- 4. DEFENSE BUDGET. OLESEN SAID THAT THE DANISH GOVERN-MENT TOOK "MODEST" CREDIT FOR RAISING THE DEFENSE BUDGET AND OBSERVED THAT ITS ACCOUNTING IN THESE MATTERS WAS ACCURATE AND HONEST, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT 20 PERCENT INFLATION LAST YEAR. HE SAID THAT THE DANISH PARLIAMENT HAD AGREED ON DEFENSE EXPENDITURES FOR THE NEXT THREE YEARS AND THIS PLAN, WHICH HAD A BROAD BASIS OF SUPPORT IN PARLIAMENT, WOULD BE CONTINUED BY ANY FUTURE GOVERNMENT.
- 5. PRIME MINISTER JORGENSEN'S COMMENTS. STOESSEL RAISED THE ISSUE OF RECENT PUBLIC COMMENTS BY PRIME MINISTER JORGENSEN, INCLUDING PARTICULARLY UNFORTUNATE COMPARISON BETWEEN U.S. ACTIVITIES IN EL SALVADOR AND SOVIET ACTIONS IN POLAND. OLESEN REPLIED THAT THE DANISH TRADITION WAS ONE OF VERY OPEN AND "NOT SO DIPLOMATIC" DEBATE. IN HIS

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

VIEW, THE PRIME MINISTER'S REMARKS HAVE NOT DAMAGED FUNDAMENTALLY GOOD RELATIONS BETWEEN THE U.S. AND DENMARK. AFTER STOESSEL REITERATED THAT COMMENTS IN THE MEDIA LIKE THE PRIME MINISTER'S ARE TROUBLING, OLESEN SAID THAT HE "SAW THE POINT." HE WENT ON TO NOTE HOWEVER, IN GENERAL, MORE CONSULTATION AND LESS TRANSMISSION ONLY OF INFORMATION ABOUT U.S. INTENTIONS WOULD BE HELPFUL. OLESEN CONCLUDED THAT VERY STRONG DANISH FRIENDSHIP FOR THE UNITED STATES WAS BASED ON WIDE POPULAR UNDERSTANDING RESULTING FROM PUBLIC DEBATE AIRING THE ISSUES BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES.

6. MIDDLE EAST. OLESEN SAID THAT AT THE INFORMAL WEEKEND MEETING IN BELGIUM ON MAY 8-9, EC FOREIGN MINISTERS AGREED THAT BELGIAN FOREIGN MINISTER TINDEMANS WILL VISIT THE MIDDLE EAST AND NORTH AFRICA SHORTLY AND WILL REPORT BACK ON THE SITUATION TO EC FOREIGN MINISTERS IN JUNE. OLESEN NOTED THAT THERE WERE NO CONCLUSIONS FROM THE EC DISCUSSION, BUT HE FELT THERE IS A "TENDENCY" TOWARDS RECOGNIZING THE PLO. GREECE HAS ALREADY RECOGNIZED IT, AND

FRANCE IS "ON THE WAY." OLESEN BELIEVES THAT THIS TREND WILL PUT ISRAEL IN A "BAD POSITION" AND HAS ADVISED THEM TO UNDERTAKE A DIPLOMATIC OFFENSIVE TO BRING THE PLO TO THE TABLE, WHICH, IF THEY WERE TO ACCEPT, WOULD MEAN THAT THEY HAD IN REALITY RECOGNIZED ISRAEL. OLESEN ACKNOWL-EDGED THAT HIS DISCUSSIONS WITH BEGIN WERE WITHOUT SUCCESS ON THIS POINT, AND HE HAS TRIED TO PRESS GOOD FRIENDS IN THE LABOR PARTY TO ADVOCATE THIS POSITION. STOESSEL BRIEFED OLESEN ON HIS RECENT DISCUSSION IN THE MIDDLE EAST AND EXPLAINED THAT OUR NEXT TASK WAS TO GET AUTONOMY TALKS GOING AIMED AT ACHIEVING AN AGREEMENT ACCEPTABLE TO BOTH SIDES. REGARDING LEBANON, OLESEN SAID THAT THE FRENCH ARE READY TO SEND A BATTALION TO UNIFIL BUT THAT THEY DO NOT WISH TO DO SO UNTIL AN ISRAELI TANK 300 YARDS AWAY FROM THE NIGERIAN COMMAND POST IS MOVED. (SEE SEPTEL FOR FURTHER DISCUSSION OF THIS POINT IN STOESSEL'S TALKS AT QUAI D' ORSAY.)

EC POSITION ON FALKLANDS. OLESEN SAID THAT THE IRISH DO NOT WANT TO PROLONG EC SANCTIONS AND THAT THE DANISH AND DUTCH HAD JOINED SANCTIONS HOPING TO AVOID A MILITARY CONFRONTATION. ACCORDINGLY, THE TIME AT PRESENT WAS NOT RIPE FOR A DECISION TO PROLONG SANCTIONS AND OLESEN'S "GUESS" IS THAT THERE WILL BE NO PROLONGATION ON MAY 17. HE OBSERVED THAT ARMED CONFLICT OVER THE FALKLANDS WAS WORRISOME AND NOTED THAT THE BRITISH EXTENSION OF ZONE OF INTERDICTION TO TWELVE MILES OFF THE ARGENTINIAN SHORE WAS NOT HELPFUL AT A TIME WHEN THE UN WAS TRYING TO RESOLVE THE PROBLEM. ACCORDING TO OLESEN, UK TOUGHNESS ON THE BUDGET ON AGRICULTURAL PRICES HAS UPSET THE OTHER COUNTRIES, AND HE FORESAW THE POSSIBILITY OF A DECISION BY NINE OF THE TEN COUNTRIES ON AGRICULTURAL PRICES WHICH WOULD BE AN HISTORIC PRECEDENT WITH POLITICAL CONSEQUENCES. COMMENT: THE CONTEXT OF OLESEN'S REMARKS IMPLIED THAT THERE COULD WELL BE A LINK BETWEEN THE WILLINGNESS OF SOME COUNTRIES TO SUPPORT SANCTIONS AGAINST ARGENTINA AND UK STUBBORNNESS ON AGRICULTURAL PRICES. 

2. AT OUR SUMMIT PREPARATORY MEETING, I MENTIONED TO YOU AND MIKE DEAVER THE DESIRE OF THE JAPANESE FOR A PRESUMMIT MEETING WITH THE PRESIDENT IN PARIS OR AT VERSAILLES. SUMMARY. IN THE PARIS CONTACT GROUP MEETING, OUR ALLIES REACTED WITH LESS APPREHENSION AND MORE ENERGY THAN WE HAD ANTICIPATED TO SOUTH AFRICA'S VENTURESOME PROPOSAL THAT WE MOVE FORWARD AT A RAPIDLY ACCELERATED PACE ON NAMIBIA AND ANGOLA. ALTHOUGH THEY ARE PREDICTABLY UNCOMFORTABLE ABOUT THE INCREASINGLY EXPLICIT ANGOLA/ CUBAN WITHDRAWAL SIDE OF THE AGENDA, THEY SEE NO CHOICE BUT TO TAKE UP THE SOUTH AFRICAN CHALLENGE, IF THE SAG IS WILLING TO PRIME THE PUMP WITH A DECISON ON THE ELECTORAL SYSTEM WHICH WOULD ALLOW US TO CONCLUDE PHASE I. I BEGAN THE MAY 12-13 CONTACT GROUP MEETING WITH A DETAILED ORAL DEBRIEF IN RESTRICTED SESSION ON THE RESUTS OF OUR SESSIONS IN GENEVA WITH THE SOUTH AFRICANS. I LAID OUT THE CHALLENGE THE SAG HAS PUT ON THE TABLE FOR US, EMPHASIZING THAT IN ESSENCE THE SAG, FOR DOMESTIC POLITICAL REASONS, WANTS A CONSUMMATION OF THIS PROCESS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. IN PARTICULAR, WE HAVE FRAMED PROPOSALS ON BOTH ISSUES WHICH ARE DESIGNED TO MEET SAG CONCERNS--AS REFORMULATED AT GENEVA--WITHOUT RAISING TOO MANY COMPLICATIONS WITH EITHER THE AFRICANS OR THE UN. THE GERMANS, WELL AWARE OF GENSCHER'S STRONG VIEWS ON THIS ISSUE, REMAIN GLOOMILY CONVINCED THAT IT SIMPLY CANNOT BE PULLED OFF. BRITISH ARE SUPPORTIVE BUT KNOW THAT LONDON IS TOTALLY PREOCCUPIED BY THE FALKLANDS. I AM NOT SURE THAT THE CANADIANS UNDERSTAND WHAT IS HAPPENING, BUT WANT GENERALLY TO BE PART OF IT. I SPECIFICALLY RAISED A NUMBER OF WAYS IN WHICH OUR ALLIES COULD HELP PUSH FORWARD THE ANGOLA TRACK: BY INDICATING THEY SHARE OUR OBJECTIVE, BY CONFIRMING THAT FACTUALLY THERE WILL BE NO NAMIBIA IF THERE IS NO ANGOLA BY ADDING TO THE IMPRESSION OF POTENTIAL WESTERN ECONOMIC CARROTS, BY PUSHING FRIENDLY AFRICANS TO WEIGH IN WITH THE MPLA, AND BY THINKING CREATIVELY ABOUT BUILDING ON THE EANES VISIT A SECURITY DIMENSION THAT WOULD SIGNAL ALTERNATIVES TO THE CUBANS. THE ALLIES TOOK COPIOUS NOTES ON ALL THIS. I BELIEVE YOU SHOULD NUDGE THEIR THINKING FURTHER ALONG THESE LINES.

7. IN SUM, OUR ALLIES RECOGNIZE THAT THE SOUTH AFRICAN

8. BETWEEN NOW AND SUNDAY EVENING IN LUXEMBOURG, THERE WILL BE AMPLE TIME FOR SECOND THOUGHTS AND GROWING DOUBTS AMONG THE ALLIES. THUS, YOU WILL NEED TO REINFORCE TENTATIVE CONSENSUS WITHIN THE CG WHICH HAS DEVELOPED IN PARIS AND STRESS THAT EVERYONE IS GOING TO HAVE TO PULL ON HIS OAR IF THIS ENTERPRISE IS TO SUCCEED. SIMILARLY, YOU WILL HAVE TO UNDERLINE FOR THE ALLIES THAT ANGOLA IS NO LONGER A SPECTATOR SPORT FOR THEM. Policy Vagueness (C)

While it may be some time before we see any precise contours to a Mitterrand Presidency in France, a sampling of his campaign rhetoric could be useful as a clue to probable foreign policy positions. With that in mind, I have put together the attachment, which provides a quick rundown of relevant direct and indirect quotes from Mitterrand himself. (0)

If these quotes strike you as vague, there is good reason: Mitterrand's political career has been built on pragmatism (some would say opportunism), and he was particularly careful in his most recent campaign to avoid definitive stands on foreign issues. Indeed, French commentators early on labeled him "an artist of ambiguity" - a characterization which Giscard tried and failed to exploit by pointing to his rival as a front for a Communist takeover. (C)

Mitterrand's very evasiveness on foreign issues in a campaign directed primarily toward internal discontent may be in our favor; it suggests a leader who is coming to power unencumbered by firm promises which he must now redeem at our expense. (C)

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Mitterrand and the Presidential campaign: Foreign Policy Statements

- -- On his approach to the Presidency: "If you are dreaming of a Socialist who would not practice socialism, then count me out."
- -- On the possibility of a center-right legislature: "If the French find pleasure in not being logical with themselves, then I will govern accordingly."
- -- On the Soviet military buildup: "Moscow seeks to neutralize Europe with its SS-20s, a move France will adamantly resist;" but "The Brezhnev proposal is worth studying as a possible initial negotiating position" and "The U.S. and its allies should consider abandoning the plan to install Pershing missiles in Europe."
- -- On East-West relations: "France will be firmly anchored in Western Europe and will build bridges to the other Europe."
- -- On Europe: "France under Socialism will defend its interests inside the Community, notably in the agricultural sector."
- -- On the Middle East: "I support Israel's right to exist within secure and recognized frontiers" and "I support the Palestinian people's right to a homeland; the Camp David accords offer a possible avenue to a settlement which should not be discarded."
- -- On the Third World: "A Socialist-led France will be responsive to human rights and revolutionary struggles" and "U.S. interference in El Salvador is intolerable."
- -- On the Atlantic Alliance: "Soviet threats against Poland make the Alliance increasingly necessary for a free Europe" and "As French President I would place our nuclear deterrent at the West's disposal in case of war; but "There is a need to redefine French interests vis-a-vis the Atlantic Alliance and vice versa."
- -- On relations with the U.S.: "It's only by saying no to your friends that you merit their friendship and esteem" (He coupled this on a number of occasions with the assertion that "France will play an independent role vis-a-vis the superpowers and resist both U.S. and Soviet imperialism.")

ON THE SUBJECT. THEY PROMISED TO GIVE US A FORMAL RESPONSE TO OUR PRESENTATION. LATER OUR AMBASSADOR, SAMUEL LEWIS, WHO HAD BEEN IN HAIFA AND WAS UNABLE TO MAKE THE DEMARCHE HIMSELF, UNDERSCORED OUR POSITION WITH THE ISRAELIS.

IN ALL CANDOR, CLAUDE, I MUST INFORM YOU THAT AS ON PREVIOUS OCCASIONS OUR DIPLOMATS WERE LEFT WITH THE IM-PRESSION THAT THE ISRAELIS ARE NOT INCLINED TO EXERT

PRESSURE ON HADDAD TO PULL BACK FROM ENCROACHMENTS IN UNIFIL'S ZONE. SUCH A RESPONSE WAS NOT UNEXPECTED, BUT WE WILL CONTINUE TO PURSUE THIS MATTER VIGOROUSLY WITH SENIOR ISRAELI OFFICIALS.

AS YOU ARE WELL AWARE, EVENTS OF THE PAST SEVERAL WEEKS HAVE RAISED TENSIONS ALONG THE ISRAELI-LEBANESE BORDER

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AND ERODED OBSERVANCE OF THE CESSATION OF HOSTILITIES WHICH AMBASSADOR HABIB SO PAINSTAKINGLY NEGOTIATED LAST JULY AND NURTURED EVER SINCE. IN VIEW OF THIS SITUATION WE BELIEVE IT MORE IMPORTANT THAN EVER THAT UNIFIL BE STRENGTHENED. FRANCE IS THE IDEAL COUNTRY TO DO THIS GIVEN ITS TRADITIONALLY CLOSE TIES WITH THE ARABS OF THE AREA, THE CURRENT STATE OF FRANCO-ISRAELI RELATIONS FOLLOWING PRESIDENT MITTERAND'S VISIT, AND THE RESPECT ACCORDED THE FRENCH ARMY WHOSE PROFESSIONALISM AND PERFORMANCE ARE SO JUSTLY ADMIRED AND RESPECTED.

AS A SOLDIER, I FULLY APPRECIATE YOUR CONCERN ABOUT PLACING FRENCH TROOPS IN A POSITION SUCH AS THIS. AT THE SAME TIME WE HAVE ALL BEEN FORCED TO RECOGNIZE AND LIVE WITH CONSIDERABLE AMBIGUITY AND LESS THAN IDEAL CIRCUMSTANCES IN THIS AREA AND OTHERS IN THE ARABISRAELI CONFLICT.

I WAS HEARTENED BY WALT STOESSEL'S REPORT OF HIS CONVERSATION WITH YOU ON THIS SUBJECT. IT IS MY HOPE, CLAUDE, THAT FRANCE WILL NOT ALLOW THE ISSUE OF THESE ENCROACHMENTS TO INTERFERE WITH THE TIMELY DEPLOYMENT OF FRENCH TROOPS WITH UNIFIL. YOU HAVE MY ASSURANCE THAT WE WILL CONTINUE TO PURSUE THIS MATTER WITH THE ISRAELIS SHOULD THEIR FORMAL RESPONSE TO OUR DEMARCH PROVE UNSATISFACTORY.

THE STARK FACTS ARE THAT DESPITE FINANCE MINISTER DELORS EARLIER ASSURANCES OF COOPERATION TO SECRETARY REGAN, PRIME MINISTER MAUROY INSTRUCTED PAYE THURSDAY NIGHT TO TELL US THAT GOF WOULD NOT JOIN IN ANY REGIMEN SPECIFICALLY AIMED AT SOVIETS AND WOULD WORK TO REDUCE OFFICIAL INTEREST SUBSIDIES ONLY THROUGH OECD CONSENSUS MECHANISM.
- 4. PAYE RELAYED THESE INSTRUCTIONS AT FRIDAY MEETING. QUANTITATIVE LIMIT ON OFFICIAL CREDIT SUPPORTS EVEN THOUGH THIS AFPROACH IS PERMITTED UNDER PROTOCOL. ALL OTHER PARTICIPANTS INDICATED INTEREST IN SOME VARIATION OR OTHER OF STEEG INITIATIVE.

5. UNDER CIRCUMSTANCES IT IS DIFFICULT TO SEE HOW ANY MEANINGFUL RESTRAINTS ON OFFICIAL CREDITS CAN BE ACHIEVED UNLESS FRENCH REVERSE THEIR POSITION OR FIND A WAY AROUND THE PROTOCOL. THEREFORE, I SUGGEST YOU ADVISE CHEYSSON OF OUR DISAPPOINTMENT IN STRONGEST TERMS ESPECIALLY IN LIGHT DELORS EARLIER ASSURANCES AND FAILURE OF FRENCH SIDE TO ADVISE OF PROTOCOL IMPEDIMENT DURING THE THREE WEEKS WHEN STEEG INITIATIVE WAS UNDER ACTIVE DISCUSSION. HE SHOULD ALSO BE ADVISED THAT THERE IS NO POSSIBILITY OF RESOLVING CREDITS ISSUE PRIOR TO SUMMIT UNLESS FRENCH MAKE NECESSARY CHANGES IN POSITION AND ADVISE US OF THAT FACT WITHIN NEXT WEEK.
