### I. PURPOSE

To maintain contact with leading French opposition leader, a likely Presidential candidate for 1988.

#### II. BACKGROUND

Giscard d'Estaing, former President of France and a leader of the French opposition, is rebuilding his domestic political base and refurbishing his image as an influential figure in international affairs. George Shultz, who worked very closely with Giscard in the past, strongly advocated a meeting with you. His visit will enable you to maintain contact with a French political figure who may again gain the Presidency and to demonstrate that we do not favor one opposition leader. You met earlier this year with Paris Mayor Jacques Chirac, Giscard's political rival, but had to cancel a planned meeting with Giscard because of scheduling problems.

We expect Giscard to demonstrate extensive interest in your perspectives on the American economic recovery and on the 1984 elections. He will likely note that European economic recovery will be tied to the U.S. performance, although it would take some time for the full impact to be felt. He can be expected to ask about U.S. budget deficits and interest rates, but has noted that his views on economic policy are very close to those of this Administration. Giscard may also push for more international cooperation on monetary policy and refer to the Williamsburg Declaration. He will stress that chiefs of government must show greater economic leadership.

Giscard's political standing is presently lower than that of the other two leading opposition leaders (Chirac and Barre) and it is likely that he will be attempting to identify issues on which he might base his attempted resurgence. He may seek to distance himself from American policy in Central America and in the Third World in general, but has registered strong support for INF deployment.

#### TALKING POINTS FOR GISCARD D'ESTAING

-- <u>Welcome</u> to the White House. Regret that scheduling conflicts prevented meeting this Spring. How was your week in Bohemian Grove.

## -- INF Negotiations/Deployment

- o Thank you for your firm support of INF Dual-Track decision. Deployments will proceed on schedule in absence of agreement.
- o Kremlin has backed-off from previous statements that deployment would mean possible end to Geneva talks and bring immediate Soviet retaliatory measures. (cite Kohl visit)
- o Believe that USSR now better appreciates the resolve, cohesion and unity of the Alliance; we hope they will be prepared to negotiate more seriously.
- o Let me ensure you of my personal commitment to genuine arms control measures and particularly to deep reductions of nuclear arsensals.

# -- International Monetary Conference

- o Williamsburg declaration strengthened a process of close consultation that can lead to improved global economic performance.
- o We are confident that existing international institutions fortified through closer consultation among the major countries, are adequate to the task.

### -- Economic Recovery

- o Evident that U.S. economic recovery well underway.
- o American economic performance will assist global recovery; lead to enhanced political cooperation.
- o I remain committed to pursuing strong, non-inflationary growth in U.S.; this approach best contributed to worldwide recovery.

Visit of Valery Giscard d'Estaing, former French President Tuesday, July 26, 2 p.m

#### I. SETTING AND OBJECTIVES

Former French President Valery Giscard d'Estaing will be in the United States during the period July 20-26. Prior to coming to Washington for his meeting with the President (preceded by a private luncheon with Secretary Shultz), Giscard will have spent the period July 20-25 in California, attending the Bohemian Grove encampment as the guest of Henry Kissinger. Giscard was last in the United States in late April to lecture in New York and at Harvard. The President's schedule precluded his meeting with Giscard during that visit. At that time, elements of the French press portrayed Giscard's non-reception in Washington as a deliberate rebuff on our part. We were unfairly charged with favoring Paris Mayor Jacques Chirac (who is Giscard's political rival and with whom the President met last January) as our privileged interlocutor in the French political opposition. Subsequently, Secretary Shultz met with Giscard in Paris during the course of the North Atlantic Council Ministerial meeting in early June.

The President's objective in this meeting is to maintain contact with a significant French political figure who may again play a leadership role in the future. A second objective is to show courtesy to a former President of a country which is a major ally. Third, the President's meeting with Giscard will dispel the notion that we are favoring one major French opposition leader over another.

Giscard himself is in the early phase of trying to rebuild his political image. Over the past several months he has been mending political fences, giving interviews, making public appearances and, in particular, speaking out on international issues. He clearly has presidential ambitions for 1988 and remains one of the three leading contenders for the French presidency on the opposition side.

#### II. ISSUES TO BE RAISED

In a recent conversation with Ambassador Galbraith in Paris, Giscard said he would be particularly interested in hearing the President's views on the nature and extent of the US economic recovery, prospects for the 1984 presidential campaign and the question of INF deployment.

With regard to economic recovery, Giscard noted that his views on economic policy were very close to those of President Reagan. He believed, however, that it would take some time for the US recovery to be felt in Europe. He asked what hopes we had for the Williamsburg Summit's "international monetary concept". He also stressed how important it was that a concerted effort be made to foster international cooperation on monetary policy and suggested that chiefs of government must show greater economic leadership.

Regarding INF deployment, Giscard said he was very impressed that a common declaration on defense had come out of the Williamsburg Summit. Noting that the Soviet aim was the "finlandization" of Europe, he said it was essential that we go ahead with INF basing in Europe. He agreed that the Soviets were likely to make a dramatic propaganda effort later in the year to forestall deployment.

As time permits, the President may also wish to ask Giscard for his analysis of current political and economic developments in France.

Attached is a memorandum from you to the President (Tab I) in preparation for the visit of former French President Giscard d'Estaing. Our objective in this visit is to maintain contact with a significant French political figure who will likely be a major contender for the Presidency in 1988. Giscard is in the process of rebuilding his political image and is expected to stress international issues. In his meeting with the President, Giscard will likely focus on INF deployment, the U.S. economic recovery, and measures designed to foster international cooperation on monetary policy.

Your memo to the President tracks closely to Secretary Shultz's memo, but also notes that Giscard may be expected to stress the impact of U.S. economic performance, particularly deficits and interest rates, on European recovery. The memo also recommends that the President strongly encourage Giscard to speak out publicly more often in support of INF deployment and against Soviet intransigency at the Geneva negotiations.

TALKING POINTS FOR THE PRESIDENT'S MEETING WITH FORMER FRENCH PRESIDENT VALERY GISCARD D'ESTAING

## Courtesy Talking Point:

-- Regret my schedule precluded our meeting during your visit to the United States this spring.

### Economic Recovery:

- -- Mounting evidence that US economic recovery is well underway.
- -- I remain determined to pursue economic policies characterized by key principles of non-inflationary growth, open markets, adequate liquidity and economic stability.
- -- By ensuring strong, non-inflationary growth in the US economy, we can best contribute to world economic recovery.

### International Monetary Conference:

- -- As noted, believe the path to greater exchange rate stability must lie in convergence of economic performance toward sustainable, non-inflationary growth.
- -- Williamsburg Declaration starts a process of consultation in order to define the conditions for improving the monetary system. Williamsburg did not define the outcome of that process.
- -- We are confident that the existing international institutions, fortified by closer consultations among the major countries, are up to the job.

#### INF Deployment:

- -- Decision to deploy failing agreement at Geneva is a very firm decision. Deployments will proceed on schedule in absence of an agreement obviating this necessity.
- -- Since the NATO decision was taken in 1979 the USSR has continued a relentless and extensive deployment process.
- -- Hope that as the USSR deepens its appreciation of the resolve, cohesion and unity of the Alliance, it will decide it is better to have a negotiated outcome.
- -- Williamsburg Declaration on defense was important in showing Soviets the firmness of Western resolve in face of Soviet threats world-wide, not just in NATO area.

QADHAFI BELIEVED THAT THEY HAD LANDED AT CHAD CAPITAL AND CALLED IN FRENCH AMBASSADOR IN PANIC-STRICKEN MOVE, SAYING "TELL ME WHICH OF MY AIRFIELDS ARE YOU GOING TO ATTACK. WHY ARE YOU DOING THIS? #### Help for Habre

Embassy Paris was asked by a senior Elysee adviser if we could help provide Habre with VABs (vehicle avant blinde, which are French large wheeled APCs) which is what Habre needs for the long term. Our embassy notes:

French officials on several occasions have alluded to French economic problems and hinted it would make sense logistically if the U.S. could purchase French equipment for the Chadians.

Since our embassy understands that the \$25 million in U.S. support is for drawdowns from U.S. military inventories, it asks if a legal way could be found to make funds available to possibly purchase some French VABs for Habre, especially if France assumes a more direct role in Chad.

1. (S) - ENTIRE TEXT.

PLACE SINCE AUGUST 7. THE FRENCH HAVE NOT YET REQUESTED THE US TO FLY SURVEILLANCE MISSIONS, NOR GIVEN ANY INDICATION OF ANY INTENTION TO DRAW ON THE AWACS CAPABILITY. ONGOING SECURITY CONCERNS AND THE CONSIDERABLE EXPENSE ENTAILED IN KEEPING THE—TWO AWACS. OTHER AIRCRAFT AND SOME LOD MEN IN KHARTOUM, CONJOINED WITH THE ABSENCE OF ANY EXPECTATION OF THEIR USE TO SUPPORT FRENCH FORCES IN CHAD NOW MILITATE IN FAVOR OF REDEPLOYING THE AWACS. WE WOULD LIKE YOU TO DISCUSS WITH FRANCE AND SUDAN OUR OWN INTENTION TO REDEPLOY.

3. FOR PARIS: CHARGE SHOULD CONTACT ELYSEE {GENERAL SAULNIER OR, IF HE IS UNAVAILABLE, OTHER APPROPRIATE OFFICIALS} AND INFORM HIM THAT BASED ON CURRENT MILITARY SITUATION AND REASONS DESCRIBED PARA. 2, THE US PLANS TO RETURN AIR FORCE UNITS NOW IN SUDAN NEXT WEEK. WE WOULD, OF COURSE, CONSIDER FRENCH REQUEST EXTENDING THEIR STAY IN SUDAN IF WE RECEIVED AN

AUTHORITATIVE FRENCH REQUEST THAT PROVIDED RATIONALE NLT 1200 AUGUST 23 YOUR TIME. YOU SHOULD EMPHASIZE IN YOUR DISCUSSION THAT WE COULD RETURN APPROPRIATE.ASSETS TO THE AREA ON VERY SHORT NOTICE SHOULD THEY BE NEEDED.

- 4. FOR KHARTOUM: YOU SHOULD DRAW ON THE MATERIAL ABOVE, AS APPROPRIATE, WITH THE GOS AND INDICATE OUR PLANS FOR THE AWACS, INCLUDING OUR DISCUSSING THIS WITH THE FRENCH BEFORE MOVING. IN ADDITION TO POINTS ABOVE, YOU SHOULD MAKE THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONAL POINTS WITH GOS:
- -- THE POSITIONING OF THE AWACS IN SUDAN HAS BEEN A VALUABLE EXERCISE IN ESTABLISHING EXPERIENCE AND PROCEDURES FOR MOVING APPROPRIATE ASSETS RAPIDLY WHEN OUR FRIENDS ARE THREATENED.
- -- WE WILL WANT TO CONSULT WITH YOU ON EXACT ARRANGEMENTS FOR WITHDRAWING THE AWACS WITH CONSIDERATION OF ANY STEPS THAT WOULD FACILITATE REDEPLOYMENT OF APPROPRIATE ASSETS SHOULD THAT PROVE DESIRABLE.
- -- WE RECOGNIZE THAT LIBYAN PRESENCE IN NORTHERN CHAD RAISES THE DANGER OF LIBYAN SUBVERSION AGAINST WESTERN SUDAN FROM CHAD. WE WILL WANT TO CONSULT WITH YOU ON THAT DANGER AND WAYS WE CAN HELP STRENGTHEN GOS! ABILITY TO DEFEND AGAINST IT.
- -- WE ARE CONTINUING OUR MILITARY ASSISTANCE TO THE HABRE GOVERNMENT AND ARE TAKING DIPLOMATIC STEPS TO PUT INTERNATIONAL PRESSURE ON LIBYA TO WITHDRAW. WE KNOW WE CAN COUNT ON SUDAN'S ACTIVE DIPLOMATIC ACTIVITY TOWARD THAT END.
