1. THERE ARE OBVIOUS GAPS IN THE SOVIET INDUSTRIAL PERFORMANCE DATA FOR JANUARY PUBLISHED IN TODAY'S EDITION OF "EKONOMICHESKAYA GAZETA". AMONG THE MISSING WERE LAST MONTH'S PERCENTAGE GROWTH RATES FOR INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION AND LABOR PRODUCTIVITY. THE KEY ECONOMIC AGGREGATES NORMALLY PUBLISHED MONTHLY BY THE CENTRAL STATISTICAL ADMINISTRATION. ONE PRODUCT CATEGORY, COMBINED LIVESTOCK FEED, HAS ALSO BEEN DROPPED FROM THE STATISTICS. DATA FOR OTHER INDUSTRIAL AND AGRICULTURAL OUTPUT CATEGORIES IS PRESENT IN A NEW, SLIMMED-DOWN STYLE, WHICH OMITS THE ONCE-STANDARD PERCENTAGE COMPARISION WITH PRODUCTION PERFORMANCE IN THE CORRESPONDING PERIOD OF THE PREVIOUS YEAR.

2. A GLANCE AT SOVIET OUTPUT DATA FOR JANUARY. 1981, PROVIDES A READY EXCUSE FOR RETICENCE THIS TIME OUT: PRODUCTION IN A MAJORITY OF PRODUCT CATEGORIES WAS LOWER LAST MONTH THAN A YEAR AGO. THIS IS TRUE FOR COMMODITIES SPANNING THE SPECTRUM OF SOVIET ECONOMIC ACTIVITY: OUTPUT WAS LOWER LAST MONTH THAN A YEAR EARLIER FOR A VARIETY OF INTERMEDIATE INDUSTRIAL MATERIALS (OIL, COAL, STEEL, ROLLED STEEL, IRON ORE, MINERAL FERTILIZER, CAUSTIC SODA, CUT LUMBER, PAPER, CEMENT:, FOR MANUFACTURED CONSUMER GOODS

(PASSENGER CARS, RADIOS, REFRIGERATORS, WASHING MACHINES, TEXTILES) AND FOOD STUFFS (MEAT, SAUSAGES, BUTTER, MARGARINE). ALTHOUGH THE OFFICIAL SOVIET COMMENTARY ON THE STATISTICS SINGLES DUT THE MACHINE-BUILDING SECTOR AS BEING ESPECIALLY SUCCESSFUL LAST MONTH. THE OUTPUT DATA REVEALS THAT OUTPUT OF SEVERAL IMPORTANT MACHINERY CATEGORIES (COMPUTER EQUIPMENT, OIL INDUSTRY MACHINERY, DIESEL AND ELECTRIC LOCOMOTIVES. 3. THE STORY WAS MUCH THE SAME IN THE ENERGY SECTOR. NATURAL GAS PLAYED ITS ACCUSTOMED ROLE AS THE STAR SOVIET PERFORMER; PRODUCTION IS UP FROM JANUARY 1981, AS WAS THE DAILY EXTRACTION RATE. THIS WAS VIRTUALLY THE END OF THE GOOD NEWS FOR THE SOVIETS, HOWEVER. OIL OUTPUT WAS DOWN SLIGHTLY THIS JANUARY FROM A YEAR EARLIER, ALTHOUGH THE DAILY EXTRACTION RATE HELD RELATIVELY STEADY. THIS WAS THE FIRST JANUARY SINCE AT LEAST 1978 THAT PRODUCTION FELL FROM THE PREVIOUS YEAR. HOWEVER. COAL OUTPUT CONTINUES TO DROP, AS THE OFFICIAL COMMENTARY SOMEWHAT TESTILY NOTED. MORE ELECTRICITY WAS GENERATED THIS JANUARY THAN IN THE SAME MONTH LAST YEAR, BUT THE OFFICIAL COMMENTARY'S JOY AT THIS DEVELOPMENT WAS TEMPERED. THE CENTRAL STATISTICAL ADMINISTRATION NOTED THAT "THE MINISTRY OF POWER AND ELECTRIFICATION AND ITS LOCAL SUBSIDIARIES DID NOT TAKE THE NECESSARY MEASURES (LAST MONTH) TO GUARANTEE THE UNINTERRUPTED SUPPLY OF ELECTRICAL ENERGY TO MANY AREAS OF THE COUNTRY, INCLUDING AREAS OF SIBERIA, WHERE PRODUCTION OF HYDROELECTRIC POWER FELL AND THERMAL POWER STATIONS WERE ALLOWED TO STAND IDLE". THERE HAVE BEEN SEVERAL RECENT COMMENTS IN THE SOVIET MEDIA IN RECENT WEEKS CONCERNING POWER OUTAGES IN PROVINCIAL AREAS, A CIFCUMSTANCE WHICH APPEARS TO HAVE PARTICULARLY AFFECTED PROCESSING OF AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES.

I MITED OFFICIAL USE SECTION 02 OF 03 MOSCOW 01919 USDOC FOR BEWT EXAMPLES OF A STRIKING DOWNTURN COULD BE CITED. THE NUMBERS SUGGEST A SHARP DROP IN SOVIET ECONOMIC GROWTH, IF GROWTH THERE WAS AT ALL THIS JANUARY FAILURE TO PROVIDE OVERALL FIGURES ON INDUSTRIAL GROWTH AND LABOR PRODUCTIVITY ALSO SUGGEST THAT WITH SO MANY MAJOR ITEMS SLUMPING, THOSE FIGURES WERE SIMPLY TOO BAD TO PUBLISH, LIKE THE 1981 GRAIN HARVEST. WE HAVE NO READY EXPLANATION FOR THIS DOWNTURN IN SOVIET PRODUCTION ALTHOUGH WE NOTE THAT JANUARY 1981 HAD ONE MORE WORK DAY THAN JANUARY 1982. HOWEVER, THAT DAY WAS JANUARY 2, 1981 WHICH FELL AMID THE FOUR-DAY NEW YEAR'S WEEKEND, AND WE DOUBT THAT ANY GREAT PRODUCTION RESULTS WERE ACHIEVED THEN. JANUARY 1982 HAD NO ESPECIALLY BAD WEATHER CONDITIONS OR OTHER DEJECTIVE REASONS OF WHICH WE ARE AWARE TO EXPLAIN THESE RESULTS. WE ARE AT THIS STAGE RELUCTANT TO DRAW TOO SWEEPING CONCLUSIONS FROM FIGURES FOR ONE MONTH ONLY, AND WE WILL BE LOOKING FOR EXPLANATIONS OF HOW THE PICTURE APPARENTLY CHANGED SO QUICKLY IN SO MANY DIFFERENT SECTIONS OF PRODUCTION. END COMMENT.

Soviet Problems Worsening Food supplies in the USSR are becoming tighter, putting more pressure on the retail food network and on the special food distribution system. Agricultural production in 1981 was 10 percent below the record high of 1978. Despite unprecedented and costly imports of grain and other foodstuffs—accounting for some 40 percent of hard currency imports—supplies to the consumer have failed to keep pace with the continued growth in demand caused by steady wage increases. The system of distributing food supplies directly to workers in key industrial installations—which the government uses to minimize unrest over poor living conditions—is showing signs of strain. Government-sanctioned diversion of food to greater numbers of special customers and black-market siphoning have led to food rationing in retail outlets. Nearly 20 cities have rationing systems, and limits on purchases have been imposed in many others. (S)

Over the short term, the supply of quality foods probably will worsen. Increased supplies of meat will occur only if there is substantial distress slaughtering, and the resulting improvement in meat supplies would be only temporary. The supply of milk and other dairy items will not improve before summer. Shortages of potatoes and other vegetables will persist until spring. Reserves are low, and imports cannot offset production shortfalls. Some incidents of food-related unrest are likely. The government's technique of supplying emergency food, however, should help prevent local flareups from spreading or lasting long. The increasing stringency in food supplies, however, may further damage the growth in labor productivity. (C)
