I. PURPOSE

To review, strengthen, and build greater public and Congressional support for our policy in the Persian Gulf.

II. BACKGROUND

Our strategy in the Persian Gulf, particularly our reflagging arrangement with Kuwait, has become a major test of the Administration's ability to conduct steady, consistent policies at home and abroad. The stakes are high. If we are perceived to retreat, our credibility with our friends in the Gulf will further erode; Iran will become even more aggressive; the Soviets will expand their influence; Allied doubts about our reliability will increase; and Congress will be emboldened to restrict our room for maneuver on a whole range of issues.

It is essential that we continue to move ahead carefully and coherently in defending our interests in the Gulf, keeping the focus on our overarching objective of ending or at least containing the Iran-Iraq war and helping our friends withstand the pressures it creates. Protection of a limited number of ex-Kuwaiti tankers under U.S. flag is one means of pursuing that objective--and of blocking Iranian and Soviet gains at our expense. Using our report to Congress as a foundation, the Administration must speak with one voice as we seek to build greater public and Congressional support for our policy.

Diplomatic Strategy

Mike Armacost will review the status of our initiative at the UN Security Council, as well as our efforts to follow up on the Venice Summit declaration and broaden Allied cooperation to end the war and enhance Gulf security. This remains a difficult task--and we need to continue to cast as

wide a net as possible, emphasizing the importance of political support at the UNSC rather than less likely and less necessary forms of military cooperation. Mike will also assess the current attitudes of the Gulf Arab states, particularly Saudi concerns in the wake of the decision to temporarily withdraw the MAVERICK sale.

#### Military Planning

Technical requirements for reflagging all eleven Kuwaiti tankers could be completed by the end of June. To escort those tankers, as well as other U.S. flagships, the Navy plans to have eight PHALANX-equipped surface combatants (plus the flagship LaSalle) in the Gulf by about July 3. However, reflagging and protection of the first of the eleven new U.S. flagships could begin whenever you choose.

Air cover for convoys transitting the Strait of Hormuz will be provided by U.S. carrier-based aircraft, as necessary to deal with the threat. The Saudis have agreed in principle to support expanded AWACS coverage, but this needs to be confirmed after the MAVERICK fallout. Cap Weinberger and Bill Crowe will provide an update on the adequacy of cooperation from the GCC states; the current status of the Iranian threat, particularly SILKWORM developments; and our plans for countering those threats.

#### Public Diplomacy and Congressional Issues

At the NSPG, Cap Weinberger and Mike Armacost will briefly review their Hill appearances over the past week. Cap will send forward our report to Congress late on the afternoon of June 15. We will then use this as the basis for a renewed effort to build better Congressional understanding for what we are trying to accomplish in the Gulf, including Saudi arms sales, as well as protecting Kuwaiti tankers. Both of these are essential to our policy. The NSPG provides an opportunity to stress the need for and formulate an Administration game-plan to win the fight with Congress. This will require your personal involvement and individual high-level briefing of key individuals. It will also require the Administration to speak as one, and forcefully, on this issue.

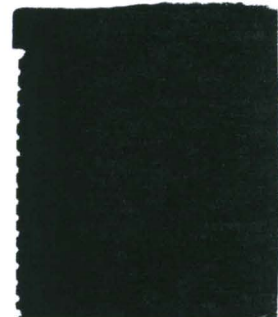

As the attached memorandum to the President suggests, you should aim at tomorrow's NSPG to clarify several questions. Where do our diplomatic efforts to help end the Iran-Iraq war stand and how can we accelerate them? Where does our planning for protection of reflagged Kuwaiti tankers stand and when could we/should we begin to implement it? What more should we ask of the Allies? The GCC states? How best do we build on the June 15 report to Congress to elicit greater public and Congressional support?

This latter question is particularly important. We can't afford to appear to send conflicting or confusing signals; the Administration has got to speak with one voice on Gulf policy.

Several other issues deserve close attention but can best be dealt with in more private, follow-on conversations with Cap, Bill Crowe, and Armacost. One is the question of adding an AEGIS cruiser to MEF. JCS plans to do so "periodically"; we need to pin this down more concretely and look again at the merits of adding an AEGIS to MEF now, for the indefinite future. Another issue that we need to work on with DOD and State is contingency planning and response scenarios for the whole range of possible Iranian threats--from terrorist attacks on U.S. facilities to mining to suicide small boat attacks to use of SILKWORM. A final, sensitive question is further communication with Iran, on what we will do in the Gulf and what they should not do.
