

- I. PURPOSE: To assess the changed environment in Korea and develop policy guidance for the eight months leading to President Chun's planned departure from office. We need to plan ways to keep the current process moving toward accommodation. Korea must construct the elements vital to a functioning democracy, yet strong internal and external forces will resist political progress. There are significant gaps in our knowledge to be identified so as to improve the reporting from the field. We also need to reinforce the message that the U.S. Government speaks with one voice to the Korean people, government, and military.
- II. BACKGROUND: The ruling party's surprise decision to reverse course and offer direct elections for president has transformed the Korean political environment... for the moment. Radical elements have been divided from the moderate opposition and a first step to real dialogue has been taken. Our policy counseling restraint and compromise was a factor. This did not begin just yesterday, it began with your speech to the Korean Parliament in 1983. The U.S. has been given credit by opinion leaders here and abroad. The issue is how to sustain this momentum.

The miracle of last week can still be destroyed. Korea lacks many of the institutions that sustain the democratic process, such as an independent judiciary, strong parties, and local elections. The word compromise has negative connotations in Korean, and politicians tend to adopt intransigent positions.

Between now and next February, the Korean political agenda will throw up many hurdles. The opposition must sort out its leadership and overcome deep factionalism. It must then reach agreement with the government on the shape of a new constitution and the rules for direct presidential election, all within a few months. The military must be persuaded not to intervene in this process; the opposition must act with restraint toward the military. The voters must overcome their provincialism and suspiciousness and accept the results of the election. The radicals must be kept isolated.

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A refusal to compromise, new cases of official torture, the fate of political prisoners, coup plotting -- any of these could derail the process. We need to identify what we do not know and task the agencies to come up with the information. The media frequently tell us, moreover, that our military and civilian officials are reading from different scripts on Korea. I don't think this is the case, but we must show that it is not so through consistent behavior.

Our basic policy message needs to be reinforced during this period of widespread attention to Korean developments. The North should not mistake internal debate and compromise for weakness. Politicians and the military in the South will face disastrous domestic consequences if they allow themselves to resort to the old methods of force and confrontation. The government and opposition are moving toward moderate middle ground; our job is to keep them there.

- We can all be heartened by events in South Korea.
  - o The ruling party took a giant stride toward democracy, and the opposition seems to be reciprocating.
  - o The military acted with restraint.
  - o We too showed restraint. We reaffirmed our basic principles, gave some advice, but resisted the temptation to interfere.
- Restraint, compromise, and dialogue: these were our counsel, and the Koreans listened. But this is no time to be complacent.
  - o Democracy runs against the grain of old ways.
  - o Seoul has enemies -- to the North, and within -- who have no interest in seeing democracy take root.
- I am looking to you to take the long view, past today's euphoria.
- Frank, will you introduce the issues for us today?

- I asked for this meeting when many of us thought we were headed into a crisis with a high risk of a bad outcome.
  - o All of us have been surprised by the scope of Noh Tae-u's concessions since then, and by the calm they seem to have brought to Korea.
  - o It's nice to think people listen to our advice, but it would be a mistake to conclude that they did it for our sake.
- The leaders of the DJP, the ruling party, appear to have concluded they do not have to fear the ballot box after all.
  - o It was their choice to make, not ours.
  - o We tried to keep our recommendations as low key as we reasonably could. We did not want to back Chun into a corner and deny him the freedom to maneuver.
  - o But nonetheless we had to press for restraint against the use of military power -- and point to the only sensible path out of the crisis, the path that the ruling party took.
- Where do we go from here? There are many turns in the road ahead.

- o The military will view with great concern the prospect that Kim Dae-jung may come to power, either directly or behind-the-scenes.
  - o The opposition will be poised to confront the government if it suspects election-rigging.
  - o Radical student groups and North Korean agents will try to act as spoilers, seeing chaos as preferable to progress.
  - o President Chun may conclude he cannot safely step down after all.
  - o The opposition may seriously split, threatening a resurgence of provincialism and a return to disorder in the streets.
- I expect others here will have concerns to raise about the possibilities in the months ahead. Let me outline the issues as I see them:

  - o How do we keep debate and competition in the moderate middle and avoid polarization?
  - o How do we sustain pressure on the ruling party and the opposition to behave with restraint in the face of inevitable provocations?
