

This is in reference to your letter of June 15, 1984, and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) comments regarding the proposed retransfer of 189 kilograms of fissile plutonium from France to Japan for use as fuel in the experimental fast breeder reactor, JOYO.

The Department of Energy (DOE) notes the NRC's agreement that this retransfer meets the statutory standard, set forth in Section 131b.(2) of the Atomic Energy Act, that the "retransfer will not result in a significant increase of the risk of proliferation beyond that which exists at the time that approval is requested." As required by Section 131, notice of the proposed retransfer will be published in the Federal Register and a report submitted to the appropriate congressional committees.

While this retransfer, as agreed, will not result in a significant increase in the risk of proliferation, we are concerned that the NRC questions whether DOE had given foremost consideration to timely warning. A careful reading of the analysis of this case establishes that foremost consideration was given to timely warning. As discussed in our analysis, effective International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) safeguards are being applied at the facilities where the plutonium will be located. In addition, we frequently consult with the Japanese on safeguards and physical security and both of us work with the IAEA to improve the application of safeguards to plutonium handling facilities.

Even though DOE is firmly of the belief that the timely warning criterion is met in this case, we note that Section 131 allows for approval even under circumstances which do not meet that standard. This was discussed in the Senate report on the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Act (Senate Report No. 95-467, p. 12). This retransfer to Japan, a country committed to a non-nuclear weapons policy, nuclear non-proliferation worldwide, and IAEA safeguards, would clearly be acceptable even if timely warning was less certain. Moreover, as has been discussed with members of the Commission, it has

long been our position that timely warning finding cannot, and should not, be made solely on the basis of technical considerations. Just as important, if not more so, are readily detectable factors such as significant changes in the non-proliferation posture of a country, including factors that may affect this posture such as military threats from neighboring countries. Given our close security relationship with the Japanese Government a fundamental change in their position would be readily apparent.

In regard to your request for safeguards information on the NFI (Tokai R&D) fabrication facility, it is now being safeguarded by the IAEA thru comprehensive ad hoc measures pending completion of the formal procedures which we understand are now under development.

Finally, in regard to the physical security plan, we wish to assure you that the arrangements will be reviewed and approved by the Executive Branch prior to shipment. Moreover, the contingency plan on the shipment at an appropriate level of detail and at a classification necessary to preserve its secrecy, will be provided to the NRC. As you know, the overall transportation arrangements exceed international standards and involve an armed force on the ship, constant communication with watch officers in Japan, and an appropriate response force.

As always, the DOE appreciates the serious concern which the NRC brings to these matters.


