Born in Shreveport, Louisiana, and taught the piano by his mother at age three, Van Cliburn played his first public performance at age four. He made his orchestral debut with the Houston Symphony at age twelve and his Carnegie Hall debut as winner of the Mational Music Festival Award the following year. A graduate of The Juilliard School, Van Cliburn won the Edgar M. Leventritt Foundation Award in 1954; he was the first recipient of the award since 1949. 

Born in Shreveport, Louisiana, and taught the piano by his mother at age three, Van Cliburn played his first public performance at age four.
