SEOUL, SOUTH KOREA CUPID -- MORE THAN 1 NILLION MOURNERS, SUMMONED BY THE WAIL OF SIRENS, BOWED THEIR HEADS IN PRAYER THURSDAY AT A STATE FUNERAL FOR 17 SOUTH KOREANS KILLED IN THE WEEKEND BONBING IN BURNA.

THE BEATH TOLL IN THE BOMBING -- WHICH SECUL BLANED ON NORTH KOREAN COMMANDOES -- ROSE TO 17 SHORTLY BEFORE THE SERVICES BEGAN IN YOLDO PLAZA.

OFFICIALS SAID VICE MINISTER OF FINANCE LEE KI-UK: 47: BIED FROM CHEST AND HEAD INJURIES AT CLARK AIR FORCE BASE IN THE PHILIPPINES WHERE HE WAS FLOWN FOR TREATMENT FOLLOWING THE BLAST IN RANGOON SUNDAY.

THE OFFICIALS SAID HE WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE MEMORIAL SERVICE ALTHOUGH HIS BURIAL WILL NOT OCCUR UNTIL MONDAY.

DEFENSE SECRETARY CASPAR WEINBERGER LED A U.S. DELEGATION AT THE FUNERAL AND OFFICIALS SAID 1,000 PEOPLE IN DELEGATIONS FROM 28 OTHER NATIONS ATTENDED.

SIRENS WAILED NATIONWIDE FOR ONE MINUTE TO MARK THE DAY OF MOURNING AND THE START OF SILENT PRAYERS AT 10 A.M. (9 P.M. EDT WEDNESDAY).

THE SERVICE PRECEDED BURIAL AT THE BONGJAK-BONG NATIONAL CENETERY.

THE FINAL RESTING PLACE FOR SOUTH KORER'S NATIONAL HEROES AND WAR

BEAD.

POLICE SAID THE CROWD EXCEEDED 1 MILLION PEOPLE NEARLY TWO HOURS BEFORE THE CEREMONY BEGAN. PRESIDENT CHIM BOO HUAN. WHO SURVIVED THE BOMBING BECAUSE A TRAFFIC JAM DELAYED HIS ARRIVAL AT A WREATH-LAYING CEREMONY AT BURNA'S NATIONAL CENETERY. DID NOT ATTEND THE SERVICE.

"INCREDIBLY: THIS HEINOUS ATROCITY ... WAS PERPETRATED BY THE NORTH KOREAN COMMUNISTS WHO ARE OF THE SAME BLOOD AS WE: SAID PREMIER KIN SANG-HYUP.

- "THEY MUST REALIZE THAT THERE IS A LIMIT TO OUR PERSEVERANCE AND MAGNANIMITY."

A LARGE, BLACK-RIBBONED PHOTO OF EACH OF THE DEAD WAS PLACED ON AN ALTAR SURROUNDED BY YELLOW AND WHITE CHRYSANTEHNUMS, INCENSE BURNERS AND THE MEDALS THE GOVERNMENT AWARDED THEM.

"THIS CURSED TRAGEBY CANNOT BE THE REAL INTENTION OF HEAVEN," KIN SAID, CALLING THE VICTIMS "THE PROUD PILLARS OF THIS COUNTRY, MEN OF GREAT CHARACTER, OUTSTANDING ABILITY AND BURNING PATRITOTISM."

BEREAUED FAMILY MEMBERS. CLAD IN WHITE OR BLACK MOURNING DRESS. QUIETLY SHED TEARS DURING THE SERVICE.

ON WEDNESDAY, NORTH KOREA DENIED AS "PREPOSTEROUS AND RIDICULOUS" SOUTH KOREAN CHARGES THAT IT WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE BOMBING, FOUR SOUTH KOREAN CABINET MEMBERS WERE AMONG THOSE KILLED, ALONG WITH FOUR BURNESE NATIONALS.

THE DEAD INCLUDED FOUR CABINET MEMBERS: DEPUTY PREMIER ECONOMIC PLANNING MINISTER SUH SUK-JOON, FOREIGN MINISTER LEE BUM-SUK, COMMERCE INDUSTRY MINISTER KIM DONG-WHIE, AND ENERGY RESOURCES MINISTER SUH SANG-CHUL.

ALSO KILLED WERE CHIEF PRESIDENTIAL SECRETARY HAHM PYONG-CHOON, AND SENIOR PRESIDENTIAL ECONOMIC ADVISER KIN JAE-IK.

THE 600.000-STRONG SOUTH KOREAN ARMY WAS PUT ON ALERT, AND NORTH KOREA ALSO STEPPED UP COMBAT READINESS ON THE 151-MILE BORDER WHERE 40.000 U.S. SOLDIERS ARE BASED. NO INCIDENTS WERE REPORTED, BUT THE REGION REMAINED TENSE.

PICKUP 11TH GRAF: THE SOUTH UPI 10-12-83 10:49 PED BURMA WILL, WITHOUT FAIL, FERRET OUT THE CRIMINALS AND PUNISH THEM, THE SOURCES QUOTED HLAING AS SAYING.

PRIME MINISTER KIM SAID KOREA HAS EVIDENCE THAT THE EXPLOSION WAS COMMITTED BY NORTH KOREAN TERRORISTS, AND IT HOPES THE BURMESE GOVERNMENT WILL TAKE RESOLUTE ACTION AFTER CONFIRMING THE EVIDENCE.

HLAING WAS QUOTED AS SAYING THAT HE WOULD DO HIS BEST AND TAKE "ALL NECESSARY STEPS" ONCE NORTH KOREA'S INVOLVEMENT IS CONFIRMED.

THE SERIOUSLY INJURED KOREAN TERRORIST ARRESTED BY BURMESE AUTHORITIES WEDNESDAY STILL REFUSES TO SPEAK, HE SAID.

BURMA IS EXERTING ITS UTMOST EFFORT TO SAVE HIS LIFE AND DISCLOSE HIS IDENTITY, HLAING SAID, ADDING THAT BURMESE AUTHORITIES WILL COOPERATE WITH SOUTH KOREAN INVESTIGATORS IN RANGOON TO REVEAL HIS IDENTITY.

ACTING FOREIGN MINISTER NO CHAE-WON ALSO TOLD HLAING KOREA EXPECTS BURNA TO TAKE RESOLUTE ACTION AGAINST NORTH KOREA, WHICH HE SAID IS SURE TO HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN THE INCIDENT.

MEANWHILE, FOREIGN ENVOYS STARTED TO ARRIVE IN SECUL WEDNESDAY TO ATTEND THE JOINT NATIONAL FUNERAL.

U.S. SECRETARY OF DEFENSE CASPAR WEINBERGER, JAPANESE FOREIGN MINISTER SHINTARO ABE, AND KEN YASUI, CHAIRMAN OF THE JAPAN-KOREA PARLIAMENTARY UNION WERE AMONG THE ENVOYS.
