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1. SST - ENTIRE TEXT.

WE APPRECIATE THE EXCELLENT SCHEDULE PROPOSALS SET 5. FORTH IN REFTEL, AND THE THOUGHTFUL PRESENTATION OF OBJECTIVES THAT MIGHT BE ACHIEVED THROUGH THE PRESIDENTIAL VISIT. WHILE WE WILL WANT TO REFINE OUR THINKING CONCERNING THOSE OBJECTIVES IN A DIALOGUE WITH YOU OVER THE NEXT FEW WEEKS, WE SHARE YOUR VIEW THAT, IN ADDITION TO THE FUNDAMENTAL SYMBOLISM OF THE VISIT FOR OUR OVERALL RELATIONSHIP AND AS AN AFFIRMATION OF OUR SECURITY COMMITMENT, THE VISIT SHOULD ALSO BE AN OCCASION TO SIGNAL OUR SUPPORT FOR THE DEMOCRATIC PROCESS AND OUR RECOGNITION OF THE GROWING IMPORTANCE OF OUR ECONOMIC TIES. THE SCHEDULE YOU HAVE OUTLINED IS CLOSELY RELATED TO THESE OBJECTIVES, AND SHOULD PERMIT US TO FURTHER EACH OF THEM, WITHOUT STRESS AND {CONCERNING HUMAN RIGHTS} JITH DUE REGARD FOR ROKG SENSITIVITES.

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3. WE ARE A BIT CONCERNED NOT TO OVERLOAD THE PRESIDENT'S SCHEDULE, AND BELIEVE THAT IT MIGHT BE BEST TO LEAVE THE EVENING OF ARRIVAL FREE FOR REST. ON THE FOLLOWING MORNING, A MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT WITH ROKG ECONOMIC MINISTERS AND, PERHAPS, A FEW PRIVATE BUSINESS LEADERS MIGHT OFFER A BETTER FORUM FOR THE PRESIDENT TO STRESS OUR INTERESTS IN KOREA'S ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT THAN AN AERIAL OVERVIEW OF THE SEOUL/INCHON INDUSTRIAL AREA.

MORE SPECIFIC COMMENTS ON YOUR PROPOSED SCHEDULE, AND 4. RESPONSES TO CERTAIN QUESTIONS YOU HAVE RAISED {E.G., REGARDING THE POSSIBILITY OF ADVANCING THE KIMPO ARRIVAL BY AN HOUR OR SO?, WILL BE DISCUSSED IN DETAIL AT THE TIME OF THE DEAVER MISSION. IN THE MEANTIME, YOU SHOULD CONTINUE TO REGARD THESE PROPOSALS AS ONLY TENTATIVE, AND SUBJECT TO CONSIDERABLE POTENTIAL REVISION AS MR. DEAVER AND THE WHITE HOUSE STAFF BEGIN TO FOCUS ON SPECIFICS OF THE SECUL STOP AND OTHER PORTIONS OF THE ITINERARY. SHOULD ATTEMPT TO DISSUADE THE ROKG FROM LOCKING IN TOO YQU FIRMLY ON THE DETAILS OF PARTICULAR EVENTS, SUCH AS THE-ARRIVAL CEREMONY VENUE, OR PLANS FOR A STAG EVENING PARTY FOR THE PRESIDENT, PENDING FURTHER WORD.

5. WE ARE NOT CERTAIN THAT POST'S SUGGESTION (REF B PARA 2) FOR DIVISION OF LABOR IS REALLY FEASIBLE SINCE MR. DEAVER AND OTHER KEY MEMBERS OF HIS PARTY WILL PROBABLY BE CONCERNED WITH ALL ASPECTS OF THE VISIT. WE WILL PROVIDE FURTHER GUIDANCE ON THIS QUESTION AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. YYY

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3. WE ARE A BIT CONCERNED NOT TO OVERLOAD THE PRESIDENT'S SCHEDULE, AND BELIEVE THAT IT MIGHT BE BEST TO LEAVE THE EVENING OF ARRIVAL FREE FOR REST. ON THE FOLLOWING MORNING, A MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT WITH ROKG ECONOMIC MINISTERS AND, PERHAPS, A FEW PRIVATE BUSINESS LEADERS MIGHT OFFER A BETTER FORUM FOR THE PRESIDENT TO STRESS OUR INTERESTS IN KOREA'S ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT THAN AN AERIAL OVERVIEW OF THE SEOUL/INCHON INDUSTRIAL AREA.

4. MORE SPECIFIC COMMENTS ON YOUR PROPOSED SCHEDULE, AND RESPONSES TO CERTAIN QUESTIONS YOU HAVE RAISED {E.G., REGARDING THE POSSIBILITY OF ADVANCING THE KIMPO ARRIVAL BY AN HOUR OR SO}, WILL BE DISCUSSED IN DETAIL AT THE TIME OF THE DEAVER MISSION. IN THE MEANTIME, YOU SHOULD CONTINUE TO REGARD THESE PROPOSALS AS ONLY TENTATIVE, AND SUBJECT TO CONSIDERABLE POTENTIAL REVISION AS MR. DEAVER AND THE WHITE HOUSE STAFF BEGIN TO FOCUS ON SPECIFICS OF THE SEOUL STOP AND OTHER PORTIONS OF THE ITINERARY. YOU SHOULD ATTEMPT TO DISSUADE THE ROKG FROM LOCKING IN TOO. FIRMLY ON THE DETAILS OF PARTICULAR EVENTS, SUCH AS THE ARRIVAL CEREMONY VENUE, OR PLANS FOR A STAG EVENING PARTY FOR THE PRESIDENT, PENDING FURTHER WORD.

2. I ACCOMPANIED MICHAEL DEAVER AND MICHAEL MCMANUS FOR WHAT WAS TO BE A FIFTEEN-MINUTE COURTESY CALL ON PRESIDENT CHUN DOO-HWAN (M-R: CHON TU-HWAN) AT 1000 HOURS ON FRIDAY. OCTOBER 7. PRESENT ALSO WERE SECRETARY GENERAL HAHM PYONG-CHOON (M-R: HAM PYONG-CH'UN) AND SENIOR PROTOCOL SECRETARY (INTERPRETER) MIKE KIM (KIM PYUNG HOON) (M-R: KIM PYONG-HUN). THE SESSION. MARKED BY GENUINE WARMTH. LASTED FOR THIRTY-FIVE MINUTES ON THIS BUSY DAY BEFORE THE PRESIDENT'S DEPARTURE FOR SOUTH ASIA AND OCEANIA.

3. IT WAS QUITE APPARENT THAT THE DISPATCH OF A PERSONAL

3. MR. DEAVER'S PARTY WAS MET AT KIMPO AIRPORT BY VICE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS ROH JAE WON (M-R: NO CHAE-WON) AND AMBASSADOR WALKER. A BREAKFAST MEETING WAS HOSTED THE FOLLOWING MORNING BY FOREIGN MINISTER LEE BUM SUK (M-R: YI POM-SOK). MR. DEAVER OFFICIALLY INFORMED THE FOREIGN MINISTER OF THE CHANGES IN PRESIDENT REAGAN'S EAST ASIAN TRAVEL PLANS, AND OUTLINED AN ALTERNATIVE SCHEDULE FOR KOREA.

4. SECRETARY GENERAL TO THE PRESIDENT HAHM PYONG CHOON (M-R: HAM PYONG-CH'UN) MET AT THE BLUE HOUSE WITH MR. DEAVER, AMBASSADOR WALKER AND MR. 3. BEGIN TEXT:

PRESIDENT REAGAN: AS I TOLD YOUR WIFE AT THE LUNCH TABLE, WE AND THE WHOLE WORLD ADMIRED YOUR RESTRAINTIN THE FACT OF THE PROVOCATIONS IN RANGOON AND OVER SAKHALIN ISLAND., HAD THE SAME FEELING REGARDING THE BEIRUT SITUATION. YET TO DO WHAT SOME WANTED US TO DO WOULD HAVE MEANT WAR. I WAS PLEASED WHEN I TALKED WITH NAKASONE TO LEARN THAT THEY ARE DOING WHATEVER THEY CAN TO PUNISH THE NORTH KOREANS.

PRESIDENT CHUN: AS I SAID DURING LUNCH, WE'VE SUFFERED TRAGEDIES TWICE THIS YEAR. IN BOTH INSTANCES YOUR SUPPORT AND THAT OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE WAS TRULY APPRECIATED BY KOREANS. WHEN I MET YOU IN 1981 I NOTED THAT TODAY'S INTERNATIONAL SITUATION IS VERY UNCERTAIN. TODAY IT IS EVEN MORE DANGEROUS. THE TIMES CALL FOR A GREAT STATESMAN OF COURAGE AND LEADERSHIP. WE ARE GRATEFU TO HAVE A LEADER SUCH AS YOURSELF. I SUPPORT YOUR POLICY OF PEACE THROUGH STRENGTH.

YOUR STEPS IN GRENADA WERE CRITICIZED BY SOME, BUT I BELIEVE THEY WERE THE BEST WAY TO PRESERVE PEACE IN THE LONG RUN. SO I'LL NOT SPARE SUPPORT FOR YOU. AND I BELIEVE ALL PEACE-LOVING PEOPLE THROUGHOUT THE WORLD WILL UNDERSTAND YOUR MOTIVES AND THE JUSTICE OF YOUR ACTIONS.

PRESIDENT REAGAN: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. ONE DAY BEFORE I LEFT WASHINGTON SOMETHING HAPPENED THAT MAY HAVE TURNED OFF A LOT OF AMERICAN CRITICS. OVER 400 MEDICAL STUDENTS WHO WERE RESCUED IN GRENADA CAME TO THE WHITE HOUSE TO MEET WITH THE YOUNG SOLDIERS AND SAILORS WHO HAD SAVED THEM. THE MEDICAL STUDENTS ALL SAID, "YES, WE WERE IN DANGER. YES, WE ARE GRATEFUL." IT WAS QUITE AN DECLASSIFIED

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EXPERIENCE TO SEE THOSE YOUNG PEOPLE TOGETHER. IN GRENADA WE FOUND WAREHOUSES FILLED WITH ALL KINDS OF SOVIET WEAPONS, MILLIONS OF ROUNDS OF AMMUNITION AND REVEALING DOCUMENTS. WE BROUGHT THEM TO ANDREWS AIR FORCE BASE FOR PUBLIC EXHIBITION. WE ARE GOING TO SHOW THEM TO THE AMBASSADORS POSTED TO WASHINGTON FOR EVERYONE TO SEE. CAN YOU IMAGINE? THIS LITTLE ISLAND OF ONLY 100,000 PEOPLE HOUSED 15,000 MILITARY UNIFORMS. WE FOUND SOME DOCUMENTS THAT REFUTE THE CUBANS' INSISTENCE THAT THE SEVERAL HUNDRED CUBANS IN GRENADA WERE JUST CONSTRUCTION WORKERS. ONE DOCUMENT IS A ROSTER THAT IS SOMEWHAT UNUSUAL FOR A CONSTRUCTION CREW. THE MEN ARE LISTED BY COMPANIES. FIRST ANTI-AIRCRAFT COMPANY. SECOND MORTAR COMPANY, ETC. AND THE DESIGNATIONS IN THE BARRACKS WHERE THEY LIVED WERE ALL MILITARY DESIGNATIONS.

PRESIDENT CHUN: I BELIEVE IT IS TIME FOR YOU TO GO NOW AND GET SOME REST. BUT BEFORE YOU GO TO THE FRONT TOMORROW, I WOULD JUST LIKE TO ADD ONE FINAL WORD.
