2. I ACCOMPANIED MICHAEL DEEVER AND MICHAEL MCMANUS FOR WHAT WAS TO BE A FIFTEEN-MINUTE COURTESY CALL ON PRESIDENT CHUN DOO-HWAN (M-R: CHON TU-HWAN) AT 1000 HOURS ON FRIDAY, OCTOBER 7. PRESENT ALSO WERE SECRETARY GENERAL HAHM PYONG-CHOON (M-R: HAM PYONG-CH'UN) AND SENIOR PROTOCOL SECRETARY (INTERPRETER) MIKE KIM (KIM PYUNG HOON) (M-R: KIM PYONG-HUN). THE SESSION, MARKED BY GENUINE WARMTH, LASTED FOR THIRTY-FIVE MINUTES ON THIS BUSY DAY BEFORE THE PRESIDENT'S DEPARTURE FOR SOUTH ASIA AND OCEANIA.

EMISSARY AND MISSION BY PRESIDENT REAGAN HAD STRUCK JUST THE RIGHT NOTE WITH THE KOREANS, AND THIS WAS COMMENTED UPON BEFORE THE PRESIDENT ENTERED THE ROOM AND CONVEYED BY THE PRESIDENT IN HIS FORTHCOMING MANNER.

4. MR. DEEVER IN PRESENTING PRESIDENT REAGAN'S LETTER TO PRESIDENT CHUN STRESSED HOW PLEASED WE ALL ARE THAT THE VISIT TO THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA IS STILL ON. HE BEGAN BY EXPRESSING HIS CONDOLENCES AND SENSE OF OUTRAGE OVER THE KAL 007 SHOOTDOWN.

5. PRESIDENT CHUN RESPONDED THAT THE KOREAN GOVERNMENT AND PEOPLE AND HE HIMSELF ADMIRERD THE FORTHRIGHT MANNER IN WHICH PRESIDENT REAGAN HAD HANDLED THE INCIDENT AND IN WHICH HE HAD RALLIED THE FREE WORLD'S PEOPLE AROUND HIM.

6. MR. DEEVER STATED THAT THERE WERE SOME IN THE UNITED STATES WHO FELT THAT THE PRESIDENT HAD NOT ACTED WITH ENOUGH FORCE TO SHOW THE STRENGTH OF THE U. S. POSITION. DEEVER NOTED THAT THE PRESIDENT FELT THAT THE PROPER REACTION WOULD BE TO BUILD THE UNITED STATES STRENGTH AND THAT THE PRESIDENT HAD BEEN ABLE TO ACHIEVE THE PROPER REACTION THROUGH HIS ACTIVE SUPPORT FOR THE MILITARY BUDGET, THE MX PROGRAM, AND A NEW APPROACH ON THE WAR POWERS ACT. PRESIDENT CHUN SAID HE APPLAUDED THE MEASURED AND DETERMINED APPROACH BY THE AMERICAN PRESIDENT, AND CONTINUED TO SUPPORT WHOLEHEARTEDLY REAGAN'S "PEACE THROUGH STRENGTH" APPROACH TO DEALING WITH THE SOVIETS.

7. WARMING TO THE PROSPECT OF THE VISIT, THE KOREAN HEAD OF STATE SAID THAT HE WANTED TO DO EVERYTHING IN HIS POWER TO MAKE IT AS SUCCESSFUL AS POSSIBLE. HE HAD INSTRUCTED HIS CABINET TO LEAVE NO STONE UNTURNED TO MAKE ANY ARRANGEMENTS WHICH PRESIDENT REAGAN DESIRED. CHUN REMINDED DEEVER THAT THERE WOULD BE AN OUTPOURING OF

ENTHUSIASM FOR PRESIDENT REAGAN WHO IS ADMIRER BY THE KOREAN PEOPLE. HE ASSURED US THERE WOULD BE NO SECURITY PROBLEMS STATING HE HOPED PRESIDENT REAGAN WOULD FEEL FREE TO STOP ALONG THE WAY AND MEET AND GREET THE PEOPLE. HE WOULD BE ABLE TO SENSE THEIR FRIENDSHIP.

8. COMMENT: I HAD OBSERVED TO DEEVER AND MCMANUS PRIOR TO THE MEETING HOW PRESIDENT CHUN LOOKS UP TO PRESIDENT REAGAN, AND THAT BECAME APPARENT DURING THE SESSION. DEEVER'S WORD ABOUT THE PROPER BUILDING OF STRENGTH AS A REACTION TO THE KAL SHOOTDOWN OBVIOUSLY HIT JUST THE RIGHT NOTE WITH CHUN. THE VISIT WAS OF OBVIOUS HELP TO US AS WE PLAN THE FINAL DETAILS OF THE PRESIDENT'S STAY IN SEOUL, BECAUSE WE WILL BE ABLE TO REMIND OUR KOREAN COLLEAGUES OF CHUN'S PLEDGE TO DO ANYTHING TO MAKE IT CONGENIAL AND SUCCESSFUL.

2. MR. DEEVER'S SPECIAL MISSION ARRIVED AT 1900, OCTOBER 6 AND DEPARTED 1100 OCTOBER 7, FOLLOWING CORDIAL MEETINGS WITH THE FOREIGN MINISTER, SECRETARY-GENERAL OF THE PRESIDENTIAL STAFF, AND PRESIDENT CHUN DOO HWAN (M-R: CHON TU-HWON). (MR. DEEVER, MR. MCMANUS, AND AMBASSADOR WALKER ONLY MET THE PRESIDENT. THIS MEETING IS BEING REPORTED SEPARATELY).

3. MR. DEEVER'S PARTY WAS MET AT KIMPO AIRPORT BY VICE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS ROH JAE WON (M-R: NO CHAE-WON) AND AMBASSADOR WALKER. A BREAKFAST MEETING WAS HOSTED THE FOLLOWING MORNING BY FOREIGN MINISTER LEE BUM SUK (M-R: YI POM-SOK). MR. DEEVER OFFICIALLY INFORMED THE FOREIGN MINISTER OF THE CHANGES IN PRESIDENT REAGAN'S EAST ASIAN TRAVEL PLANS, AND OUTLINED AN ALTERNATIVE SCHEDULE FOR KOREA.

4. SECRETARY GENERAL TO THE PRESIDENT HAHM PYONG CHOON (M-R: HAM PYONG-CH'UN) MET AT THE BLUE HOUSE WITH MR. DEEVER, AMBASSADOR WALKER AND MR. MCMANUS BEFORE CHAIRING A MEETING OF THE KOREAN AND U.S. WORKING GROUPS AT 0915. DR. HAHM NOTED MR. DEEVER'S PROPOSALS AND SAID THEY SEEM QUITE FEASIBLE. HE PROMISED TO GET A FORMAL REPLY TO MR. DEEVER ASAP. MR. DEEVER SAID THIS IS IMPORTANT AS THE VISIT DATES SHOULD BE ANNOUNCED SOON. THEY AGREED ON A SIMULTANEOUS ANNOUNCEMENT IN BOTH CAPITALS.

5. IN RESPONSE TO A QUESTION FROM THE KOREAN SIDE, MR. DEEVER STATED THAT PRESIDENT REAGAN WILL STAY AT THE CHOSUN HOTEL IN SEOUL. HAHM ALSO SUGGESTED AN HOUR-LONG SPECIAL CULTURAL EVENT TO BE HELD AT THE SEJONG CULTURAL CENTER FOLLOWING THE STATE DINNER PRESIDENT CHUN WILL HOST P.M. NOVEMBER 12. MR. DEEVER EXPLAINED HOW IMPORTANT IT WILL BE FOR THE PRESIDENT TO AVOID ANY LENGTHY POST-DINNER SCHEDULE.

3. BEGIN TEXT:

PRESIDENT REAGAN: AS I TOLD YOUR WIFE AT THE LUNCH  
TABLE, WE AND THE WHOLE WORLD ADMIRE YOUR RESTRAINT IN  
THE FACT OF THE PROVOCATIONS IN RANGOON AND OVER SAKHALIN  
ISLAND. , HAD THE SAME FEELING REGARDING THE BEIRUT  
SITUATION. YET TO DO WHAT SOME WANTED US TO DO WOULD  
HAVE MEANT WAR. I WAS PLEASED WHEN I TALKED WITH  
NAKASONE TO LEARN THAT THEY ARE DOING WHATEVER THEY CAN  
TO PUNISH THE NORTH KOREANS.

PRESIDENT CHUN: AS I SAID DURING LUNCH, WE'VE SUFFERED  
TRAGEDIES TWICE THIS YEAR. IN BOTH INSTANCES YOUR  
SUPPORT AND THAT OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE WAS TRULY  
APPRECIATED BY KOREANS. WHEN I MET YOU IN 1981 I NOTED  
THAT TODAY'S INTERNATIONAL SITUATION IS VERY UNCERTAIN.  
TODAY IT IS EVEN MORE DANGEROUS. THE TIMES CALL FOR A  
GREAT STATESMAN OF COURAGE AND LEADERSHIP. WE ARE

YOUR POLICY OF PEACE THROUGH STRENGTH.

YOUR STEPS IN GRENADA WERE CRITICIZED BY SOME, BUT I

LONG RUN. SO I'LL NOT SPARE SUPPORT FOR YOU. AND I  
BELIEVE ALL PEACE-LOVING PEOPLE THROUGHOUT THE WORLD WILL

PRESIDENT REAGAN: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. ONE DAY BEFORE I

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EXPERIENCE TO SEE THOSE YOUNG PEOPLE TOGETHER. IN GRENADA WE FOUND WAREHOUSES FILLED WITH ALL KINDS OF SOVIET WEAPONS, MILLIONS OF ROUNDS OF AMMUNITION AND REVEALING DOCUMENTS. WE BROUGHT THEM TO ANDREWS AIR FORCE BASE FOR PUBLIC EXHIBITION. WE ARE GOING TO SHOW THEM TO THE AMBASSADORS POSTED TO WASHINGTON FOR EVERYONE TO SEE. CAN YOU IMAGINE? THIS LITTLE ISLAND OF ONLY 100,000 PEOPLE HOUSED 15,000 MILITARY UNIFORMS. WE FOUND SOME DOCUMENTS THAT REFUTE THE CUBANS' INSISTENCE THAT THE SEVERAL HUNDRED CUBANS IN GRENADA WERE JUST CONSTRUCTION WORKERS. ONE DOCUMENT IS A ROSTER THAT IS SOMEWHAT UNUSUAL FOR A CONSTRUCTION CREW. THE MEN ARE LISTED BY COMPANIES. FIRST ANTI-AIRCRAFT COMPANY, SECOND MORTAR COMPANY, ETC. AND THE DESIGNATIONS IN THE BARRACKS WHERE THEY LIVED WERE ALL MILITARY DESIGNATIONS.

PRESIDENT CHUN: I BELIEVE IT IS TIME FOR YOU TO GO NOW AND GET SOME REST. BUT BEFORE YOU GO TO THE FRONT TOMORROW, I WOULD JUST LIKE TO ADD ONE FINAL WORD. OUR COMBINED FORCES COMMAND IS IN BETTER SHAPE TODAY THAN EVER BEFORE; IT IS VERY BATTLE-READY. MUCH OF THE CREDIT FOR THAT MUST GO TO GENERAL SENNEWALD AND AMBASSADOR WALKER. THEY UNDERSTAND OUR CULTURE, OUR CUSTOMS, OUR SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES. I'M VERY SATISFIED ABOUT THE CFC. I BELIEVE IT IS A COOPERATIVE ARRANGEMENT UNIQUE BETWEEN ANY TWO ARMED FORCES IN THE WORLD.

PRESIDENT REAGAN: THANK YOU FOR CONFIRMING WHAT I'D ALREADY HEARD ABOUT THE RELATIONSHIP.
