- 1. THIS IS A JOINT EMBASSY/USIS RESPONSE
- 2. WE CONCUR WITH THE PROPOSED PUBLIC DIPLOMACY STRATEGY WITH EXCEPTION OF TV/FILM DOCUMENTARY FOCUSED ON TRANS ATLANTIC COOPERATION WHICH WOULD HAVE LITTLE PROGRAM HES IN RELIGIUM.
- 3. THIS MISSIGN HAS PURSUED A VERY ACTIVE ROLE IN DEMOUNCING MR. QADHAFI'S ROLE IN INTERNATIONAL TERRORISM. THE FACT THAT EELGIUM REPRESENTS USG INTERESTS IN LIBYA, MEANS THAT THE BELGIAN PUBLIC IS KEENLY INTERESTED IN WHAT TRANSPIRES BETWEEN LIBYA AND THE USG. THIS MEANS THAT ON A GOVERNMENT TO GOVERNMENT LEVEL, THIS MISSION IS IN DAILY CONTACT WITH HIGH LEVEL GOB OFFICIALS TO EXPLAIN OUR POLICIES AND TO EXCHANGE INFORMATION. WE CONSIDER THE RELATIONS BETWEEN OUR TWO GOVERNMENTS IN THIS AREA TO BE OUTSTANDING.
- 4. THAT DOES NOT, HOMEVER, MEAN THAT WE SEE EYE-TO-EYE WITH THE BELGIAN GOVERNMENT OR THE BELGIAN PUBLIC ON ALL ISSUES SURROUNDING TERRORISM AND OUR RESPONSE TO LIBYA. THIS EMBASSY HAS MAINTAINED A HIGHLY VIGOROUS PRIVATE AND PUBLIC DIPLOMACY PROGRAM AT ALL LEVELS TO CONVINCE BELGIANS THAT OUR ANALYSES OF THE CAUSES OF TERRORISM AND OUR RESPONSES HAVE BEEN CORRECT.
- 5. THE FOLLOWING ARE A FEW EXAMPLES OF WHAT WE HAVE DONE OVER THE LAST SEVERAL MONTHS:
- A. - 2. BACKGROUND. IN JANUARY, FOLLOWING OBSERVED SURVEILLANCE OF EMBASSY BY SUSPECTS WHO WERE FOLLOWED TO LIBYAN PEOPLES' BUREAU. GOV ORDERED A SWEEP OF LIBYAN FRIENDSHIP ORGANIZATIONS, CLOSING MOST AND PUBLICLY DISPLAYING SUBVERSIVE MATERIAL SEIZED. PUBLIC EXPOSURE OF ACTION BY VENEZUELAN STATE SECURITY POLICE RECEIVED NO LASTING PUBLIC ATTENTION. Whence Terrorism?

U.S. Image as a Belligerent

Recent tensions between the U.S. and Libva obscured the fact that most of the acts of terrorism committed against American lives and property since 1982 have been byproducts of the Arab-Israeli conflict, the war in Lebanon and the U.S. policy of supporting Israel's position in both these conflicts.

One essential component of an anti-terrorist strategy is a covert intelligence ca-pability able to monitor the activities of radical terrorist groups such as Abu Nidal's Arab Revolutionary Council and to interdict or give sufficient advance warning of terrorist plots against American tar-

One reason why no American lives were lost to attacks by Middle East terrorist groups between 1976 and 1982 was because of covert contacts between U.S. intelligence and representatives of Yasser Arafat's Palestine Liberation Organization. That liaison was one of the most serious casualties of American support for Israel's invasion of Lebanon in June 1982.

Attempts by Abu Nidal to target American lives did not begin with the attacks in the Vienna and Rome airports in 1985. They began shortly after he broke with Mr. Arafat in 1974, But after the killing of U.S. Ambassador to Lebanon Francis Meloy by radical Palestinians associated with Abu Nidal in early 1976, American intelligence established contact with Mr. Arafat's PLO, then the dominant force in West Beirut. By various accounts, between 1976 and 1982 the PLO was able, through infiltrators, to abort or to give adequate advance warning of numerous radical plots against U.S. interests in the Middle East.

All that changed for two reasons after Israel's invasion of Lebanon in June 1982. First the Arafat wing of the PLO lost its ability to exert effective authority over the many disparate (and often desperate) factions of the Palestinian resistance movement. Second, and more important, the U.S. dropped all pretense of neutrality and became a belligerent on Israel's side. Prior to the invasion of Lebanon the U.S. was generally regarded with suspicion because of its support for Israel, but Israel was considered the main enemy. Indeed for years Arab publications had tended to portray the U.S. as Israel's stooge, subor-dinating its national interests in the Middle East to Israel's.

Support for Arafat

Having supported Israel's invasion, the U.S. was also held partly responsible for the massacre of Palestinians in Sabra and Chatilla refugee camps by Christian gunmen belonging to the pro-Israeli Lebanese Forces in Israeli-controlled South Beirut. The U.S. had guaranteed the safety of the Palestinian noncombatants living in Israeli-occupied Lebanon as part of the deal that led to the evacuation of Palestinian and Syrian fighters from Beirut after the Israeli invasion. It should come as no sur-prise that among the perpetrators of the massacres at the Rome and Vienna airports were young Palestinians who witnessed the mass killings in 1982 in those camps while in their impressionable midteens. Direct U.S. military intervention on behalf of the Lebanese central government and the subsequent brokering of an agreement between the Lebanese government and Israel that supported Israel's position in Lebanon reinforced the U.S.'s status as an anti-Arab belligerent in its own right.

The anti-Arab image is further reinforced by Washington's aversion to providing vigorous support for Arab-Israeli peace efforts and the inclusion of the PLO, as an integral party to the conflict, as one of the participants in the peace process. The assassination of Nablus mayor, Zafer Masri, by rival Palestinian gunmen and the demonstrations in favor of the PLO and the anti-Jordanian slogans at Mr. Masri's fu-

neral in February clearly show that Yas-sar Arafat's PLO retains the support of most of the West Bank Palestinians.

Meanwhile the Reagan administration has had great difficulty moving its security-assistance programs for Jordan and Saudi Arabia through an ostentatiously pro-Israel Congress that refuses to recognize that these Arab states have legitimate security requirements that are unrelated to the Arab-Israeli conflict.

What do these other factors have to do with the U.S. retaliatory strikes against Libya? Very little, and that is the problem. Moammar Gadhafi is not responsible for the events going back to 1982 and earlier that are the primary motivation for radical (and not-so-radical) Lebanese and Palestinians to commit acts of terrorism against American targets. Whatever control or influence outsiders have on particular terror ist groups, it facilitates activities they predisposed to undertake anyway Suspension of state-sponsorship for terrorist groups would at best create some logistical inconvenience for them. It would not erode the commitment of these groups to take revenge against the U.S. for real or imagined grievances.

It is what passes for American Middle East policy, not Moarnmar Gadhafi, that created the U.S. image as the enemy of the Palestinians and all Arabs.

It Doesn't Begin or End With Israel

The present world-wide lull in terrorist activities, connoting a reassessment of tactics and strategy in the terrorist camp, clearly indicates they are coordinated, government-sponsored operations. Desper-ate, fanatic "fighters for a cause" are deterred neither by air strikes nor by diplomatic and economic sanctions. But the myth of an inexorable connection between international or at least Middle Eastern terrorism and the Palestinian Arabs' "struggle for independence" nevertheless persists.

The existence of this myth is the terrorists' greatest success, for it has allowed them to focus the world's attention not on the murder of children, the tossing of a crippled pensioner into the sea, or the rigging of a pregnant woman as a time bomb, but on the bogus issue of the "root causes" of terrorism.

The canard is all too familiar: Refugees living in festering camps, deprived of homeland and nationhood, have turned to terrorism as a last resort to force attention to their plight. Give them the "West Bank" and terrorism will cease.

Nothing could be further from the truth. With few exceptions, terrorist groups, and most emphatically all of the Middle Eastern groups, are the hired guns of aggressive anti-Western regimes, without whose patronage and support organized terrorism could not survive. These regimes may exploit the plight of the Palestinian Arabs, as they do other inflamed local grievances. but as is apparent from recent history, they have no interest in "solving" the Palestinian problem. If Israel were to yield to present Arab demands and withdraw to the

1949 armistice borders, there is no question that terrorist groups sponsored by Syria, Libva, Irag, South Yemen and Iran would brand any accord a betrayal of the "Pales-tine revolution." They would launch an in-tensified campaign of terror, not only against a then-diminished and weakened Israel, but against the Arab partners to the settlement.

Terrorism is endemic to the region regardless of Israel. The destruction of the thousand-year-old Jewish community of Hebron took place 20 years before Israel was founded. But the majority of terrorism's victims are not Jews but Arabs killed by Arabs. Last month, 140 were killed and as many injured in eight terrorist bombings of Syrian city buses. The culprits were first thought to be Lebanese, then Iragis, then Moslem Brotherhood activists. Meanwhile, the intra-Arab terror in Lebanon continues. To suggest that ceding the 2,000 square miles of the West Bank to Arab domination will end terrorism is an insult to history and common sense.

But even the destruction of Israel is not the terrorists' ultimate goal. Their target is the Western democracies themselves.

Terrorism is their weapon of choice because the West, while prepared for nuclear and conventional military threats, is painfully vulnerable to this type of attack. Our open borders, our freedom of association and movement, our prohibitions against arbitrary search and arrest, and our strictures against covert operations make the work of terrorists laughably easy. Moreover, our ubiquitous television-competitive, news-hungry and melodramatically oriented-lends itself to exploitation as a stage for terrorist theater, thus advancing one of terrorism's main goals: the shaking and corroding of public confidence.

With no little help from the media, the conventional wisdom now has it that the West-the U.S. in particular-is hated by Arab radicals and fundamentalists because it supports Israel. The truth is the exact opposite. Israel is hated because it represents the West. For radicals and fundamentalists, the West-with its secularity, "decadence" and modernity, its demo-cratic institutions, humanistic values and individual freedoms-is the source of all evil. Israel is just closer, a Western tenta-

cle in what they consider Arab domain.

That is why "Zionism," "imperialism" and "racism" are interchangeable epithets. The declared goal of the Arab Command of Revolutionary Forces, a euphemism for a terrorist structure formed last year by Libya, Syria and Iran, is not only to destroy Israel, but "to confront imperialism . . . and strike at its positions and interests wherever they might exist." It is no wonder that the Soviets have not only looked upon this interna-tional network with favor, but have helped

it whenever they could.

And, indeed, for all his anti-Israel rheto-Col. Gadhafi's main efforts have had nothing to do with the Palestinian Arabs. He has supported terrorist groups in West Germany, France, Italy and Ireland; in Angola, Chad, Egypt, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Gambia, Mali, Mauritania, Morocco, Mozambique, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, Sudan, Tunisia, Uganda and Zimbabwe. He has helped terrorists in Guadeloupe, Martinique and New Caledonia; in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Nicaragua and Uruguay. A rather circuitous way to get at Israel.

Bitter and Disturbing Truth

Syria's goals are similar. Yet terrorist attacks on Americans in Syrian-dominated Lebanon are invariably interpreted as a consequence of America's closeness to Israel. What is usually forgotten is that as many French nationals as Americans have been abducted and assassinated there, and that on the day 250 Marines were massacred in their barracks, 58 French peacekeeping troops were killed in a similar attack. Now, France has consistently supported the Arab line on the "Palestine problem"; has sold no arms to Israel for 20 years, while generously supplying Arab countries; has given Arab terrorists shelter and safe conduct; has recognized the PLO, allowing it to operate freely on its soil; and has befriended Syria. France's only crime was being part of the Western presence in Lebanon, a crime that outweighed all credits.

Why, then, do we keep hearing of the need to remedy the "root causes" of terrorism? The bitter and disturbing truth is that the search for such remedy is highly selective. No one seems interested in the root causes" of European terrorism, de spite its toll in American lives, morale and security, nor in the causes of the Sikh, Sri Lankan and Japanese phenomena. presence in Lebanon, a crime that outweighed all credits.

It is in this context that the raid on Libya, the expulsion of Libyan and Syrian diplomats from European capitals, and the Tokyo declaration must be considered. For they signal for the first time ne West's recognition that it is not a bysta der but a target of terrorism, and that unless concerted diplomatic, political and economic—and, if necessary, military—measures against terror-sponsoring states are taken, it will remain terrorism's victim.

If this reflects a turning point, if the resolve will be lasting, anti-Western terrorism will disappear by the end of the decade. If, on the other hand, it is merely a fleeting spasm of uncharacteristic courage, terrorism will continue to dominate our lives for the foreseeable future.
