The following excerpt is for your information only. Please do not refer to it in any discussions.

3. Canadian Participation in MFO. Prime Minister Mulroney announced today that his government had decided in principle to replace Australia in the Multilateral Force and Observers (MFO) in the Sinai. Aside from the Egyptian and Israeli diplomatic approaches, both Shamir and Hawke had personally asked Mulroney to participate in the MFO, and, as you know, I raised the issue with Clark in Quebec. While the terms of Canada's involvement must be negotiated, Mulroney clearly is demonstrating his personal interest in cooperating with the US on global issues and in continuing Canada's traditional role in peace-keeping operations. This Canadian response—positive and prompt—contrasts sharply with the Trudeau Government's unhelpful attitude in 1981. It also is a tribute to the MFO operation which has broad international respect and continues to have the strong support of Israel and Egypt.

EXTERNAL AFFAIRS SOURCE TOLD EMBOFF APRIL 22 THAT REPORTING FROM CANADIAN EMBASSY SAN JOSE INDICATED NICARAGUANS HAD BEEN "DIFFICULT" DURING LAST WEEK'S CONTADORA MEETING IN PANAMA, DESPITE CHARACTERISTICALLY UPBEAT" REPORT GIVEN CANADIAN AMBASSADOR BY COSTA RICAN FOREIGN MINISTRY OFFICIAL (REFTEL). NICARAGUANS HAD REJECTED DRAFT VERIFICATION ACCORD PRESENTED BY HONDURANS (REPRESENTING REGIONAL DEMOCRACIES) ON GROUNDS THEY WERE MERELY FRONTING FOR U.S. AND, FOR THE FIRST TIME, REJECTED CANADIAN WRITTEN COMMENTS ON VERIFICATION (PRESUMABLY PRESENTED BY MEXICO) ON SAME GROUNDS. INDEED, NICARAGUANS SAID THEY WOULD ACCEPT ONLY WESTERN EUROPEAN OR LATIN AMERICAN NATIONS AS PARTICIPANTS ON VERIFICATION COMMISSION, APPARENTLY EXCLUDING CANADA (AGAIN, FOR THE FIRST TIME). FINALLY, NICARAGUANS COMPLAINED THAT HONDURAN AND CANADIAN. SUGGESTIONS ON VERIFICATION WERE "TOO DETAILED" AND THEY PREFERRED A MORE VAGUE DOCUMENT.

3., COMMENT: ALTHOUGH WORKING LEVEL AT EXTERNAL AFFAIRS WAS CLEARLY NOT SURPRISED BY THE OUTCOME, THIS LATEST CONTADORA MEETING, WHICH APPARENTLY INCLUDED SUBSTANTIAL CANADIAN INPUT, FORCED SANDINISTAS TO SHOW A BIT MORE OF THEIR HAND IN TERMS OF BILATERAL RELATIONS WITH CANADA AND LATTER DID NOT LIKE WHAT IT SAW. - 2. BEGÎN TEXT: DEAR BRIAN: "NANCY AND I WERE DELIGHTED TO VISIT CANADA AGAIN. WE CERTAINLY APPRECIATED THE WARM HOSPITALITY WE RECEIVED AND I WAS PLEASED THAT YOU CHOSE CHARMING QUEBSC CITY AS THE SITE OF OUR MEETINGS. TO HAVE CELEBRATED ST. PATRICK'S DAY TOGETHER MADE OUR VISIT EVEN MORE ENJOYABLE.

AS I SAID TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE BEFORE LEAVING THE STATES, NO COUNTRY IS MORE IMPORTANT TO THE UNITED STATES THAN CANADA. I LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING CLOSELY WITH YOU, BRIAN, IN CARRYING OUT OUR MUTUAL GOALS.

NANCY AND I THANK YOU AND MILA FOR YOUR WONDERFUL GIFTS. THE ESKIMO STONE CARVINGS, THE BEAUTIFUL PLACEMATS, AND THE HANDSOME ALBUM OF PHOTOGRAPHS ON OUR VISIT WILL BE TREASURED, TOGETHER WITH THE INSCRIBED PICTURE OF YOU AND MILA, AS SPECIAL REMEMBRANCES OF YOUR WARM FREINDSHIP.
