Soviet Views on Gorbachev/Shevardnadze Meetings

The Soviet charge d'affaires came in this afternoon to share Moscow's current thinking on arrangements for Geneva and Shevardnadze's September visit to the U.S.

Geneva Arrangements

On Ganeva, the Soviets feel "strongly" that meetings should alternate between their mission and ours. While we continue to feel that the advantages of a neutral site justify one more attempt to bring them around, we could minimize the difficulties of dual locations by using your residence as "our" venue. As the building normally used by the Soviets in Geneva is in fact the residence of their Consul General, there would be no symmetry problem.

On social events, Moscow shares our view that informal dinners the evenings of November 19 and 20 would be most appropriate. They have proposed, however, that the Swiss reception be the evening of November 18, which would make your first encounter with Gorbachev a public one. This is clearly not acceptable from our standpoint, and the Charge's reaction when we shared our concerns with him suggested the Soviets may ultimately be receptive to our arguments that the reception should come before dinner on the twentieth. We will try again.

The Charge indicated Gorbachev will arrive in Geneva the afternoon of November 18, and that he has agreed to meet with the Swiss President. Mrs. Gorbacheva will accompany him, but there are as yet no details on her program or interests in Geneva.

Shevardnadze Visit

Shevardnadze would hope to meet with you at the White House September 27. (He will be accompanying Gorbachev to Paris during the first days of October, and will return to Moscow directly from Washington the morning of September 28 if we agree on the

twenty-seventh). Depending on whether a morning or afternoon session was most convenient for you, he would come down from New York the night before your meeting or the same day.

Shevardnadze proposed that he and I meet in New York
September 25 from 2:00 to 6:00 p.m., and indicated that he would
be prepared to have a second meeting with me on the
twenty-seventh if time permitted. As you will recall, such a
scenario worked well last year with Gromyko. If you agree, we
will confirm to the Soviets that you are prepared to see
Shevardnadze the morning of September 27, and propose that he
and I hold a follow-up session that afternoon.

Уважаемый господин Г. Маршалл!

Мне очень трудно было решиться на то, чтобы побеспокоить Вас, и все же отважился обратиться с деликатной просьбой: может, согласитесь пробежать глазами по моим зарисовкам к портрету Э. Певарднадзе.

Я всегда был в стороне от политики, но по долгу службы и роду занятий мне приходилось слышать и видеть происходящее в Грузии изнутри.

Поясню.Я был заместителем главного редактора журнала "Литературная Грузия", переводил с грузинского на русский современных прозаиков, дружил со многими писателями, так сказать, варился в том котле. А сейчас, в связи с назначением Э. — еварднадзе министром иностранных дел, мне захотелось изложить увиденное и услышанное, набросать портрет — еварднадзе на фоне тогдашней действительности. Когда же написал, пришли сомнения — интересно ли это, нужно кому, стоит печатать???

Вот я и осмелился обратиться к Вам, уважаемый профессор, с просьбой прочитать эти заметки, наставить меня на путь истинный... А еели, даи Вог, они Вам чем-то понравятся, не согласитель ли оказать содействие в напечатании в англоязычной прессе.

Только не подумайте обо мне худо, я вовсе не нахал или назойливый тип, просто отсутствие умудренных опытом людей вокруг толкнуло меня потревожить Вас.

Если из этого доброго намерения /с Трузией у меня дружеские связи, получаю оттуда газеты, журналы и т.д./ ничего путного не получилось, то порвите, пожалуйста, мой "опус", выбросите в мусорную корзину.

Я буду Вам очень признателен, если черкнете хоть пару слов, не заставите казнить себя за это письмо.

Посылаю Вам в благодарность наперед мою книгу "Задуй во мне свечу", авось она Вам поможет в работе...

Зарисовки к портрету Эдуарда Шеварднадзе

В феврале 1921 года в столицу Грузии, конечно, по просьбе трудящихся, вступили части Красной Армии. В Москву полетела телеграмма:

" Ленину, Сталину.

Над Тифлисом реет красное знамя Советской власти. Да здравстует

Советская Грузия!"

С годами красное знамя выцвело. Над городом возвысилась фигура женщини, держащая в одной руке чашу, а в другой — меч. По замыслу скульптора эта фигура должна была символизировать гостеприимство для друзей и кару для врагов. Однако, по прихоти судьбы, она начала принимать иное значение. Высоко поднятая чаща стала "показателем" достатка, а опущенный ниже живота меч означал отсутствие правосудия...

В середине нашего века Грузия била охвачена бурным процессом обогащения. Деловые люди швыряли деньгами, покупали производства, должности, партийные билеты. Оморист Н. Думбадзе, любимец Э. Певарднадзе, в одном из романов писал, что то било время, когда партбилет приравнивался к хлебной карточке...

Всякий власть имущий имел свои объекти, каждый брал по чину. В Кутаиси мне рассказывали, какие огромные деньги дают милиционеры начальству за право дежурить в районе, где процветала спекуляция. Подежурив там несколько месяцев, постовой спокойно мог обзавестись квартирой.

У нас в Тоилиси произошла забавная история. Секретарь райкома партии одним ухом услышал, что его собираются снять с работы, и мигом дал задание подручным, не дожидаясь конца месяца, взять во всех объектов "пола-



гающися "ему калым. А через неделю все артельщики и магазинщики взвыли - им пришлось повторно выложить наличные уже для нового секретаря.

Начальники отделений милиции, секретари райкомов орали звонкой монетой. Зато первый секретарь горкома партии предпочитал драгоценные камни. Эти подношения он принимал в спичечной коробке. Самой "невинной жертвой "оказалась жена зозяина республики Виктория Мжаванадзе. Позже она наивно жаловалась, мол, знакомясь, протягивала деловым людям руку, а те унизивали ее
пальцы брильянтовыми кольцами...

Все были порабощены жаждой наживы, даже журналисты. Только они зарабатывали не на том, что писали, а что не печатали. Н. Думбадзе полущутя жаловался на сотрудников по журналу — за взятки они построили себе дома, купили машины, мебель и все это оформили на родственников, я подозреваю, что и жены у них оформлены на чужое имя...

Как-то я с молодым писателем Турамом Панджикидзе оказался свидетен лем такой сцены в закусочной. Трое дельцов запорили. Один из них, совсем молодой, достал из кармана пачку денег и начал ими бить второго по седой голове. Но тот с чем-то не соглашался, упрямился. А пачка все опускалась и опускалась на его голову. Наконец он сдался — пошел за пивом, протер тряпкой стойку, принес пирожки. Турам сказал: "Видишь, как они унижают слабых людей деньгами. В моем новом романе описан случай похлеще — пьяный делец предлагает официанту большую сумму денег за мизинец... хорощо прожаренный на сковородке. Будь человном, переведи его на русский".

Роман "Камень чистой воды", едва появившись в журнале "Пискари", подвергся уничтожающей критике. Ругали его даже на партийной конференции. Мне стало на душе муторно — зря взялся переводить по рукописи, никто не напечатает. В вдруг ободряющая весть. Редактор журнала передал Гураму поздравления В. — еварднадзе: "Роман Эдуарду очень понравился, он постарается



тебе помочь".

В то время Э. Леварднадзе занимал пост министра внутренних дел республики. На это место его "упрятал" Мжаванадзе, узрев в комсомольском вожаке активного соперника, птицу / шевардени на грузинском — сокол / внсокого полета. Вначале первый секретарь ЦК думал вовсе избавиться от Эдуарда, заслав его в захолустный михетский райком. Но произошла осечка, и шеварднадзе перебрался в министерское кресло. Утверждали, что ему помогла "рука из Москви".

Человек гибкий, умный, подверженный новым веяниям и честолюбивый, Э.шеварднадзе.еще будучи секретарем ПК комсомола.подобрал верных людей из молодежи, расставил их на ключевые позициим выжидал. Его друзья из писательской среды стали редакторами молодежных газет и журналов. Н. Думбадзе - редактором сатирического журнала "Нианги", Д. Чарквиани - журнала "Цискари".Г. Ланджикидзе - ответсекретарем литературной газеты. Они и печатали наиболее острые, разоблачительные произведения. Создается впечатление, что шеварднадзе из-за кулис, поскольку сил и влияния у него не было еще достаточно, руководил все громче звучащим хором недовольных интеллектуалов. Не исключено, что на его ноддержку расчитывали и двое приближенных к Мжаванадзе аппаратчиков, когда отважились на открытое письмо против секретаря ПК по идеологии. Оба они. смещенные с постов, сразу же после "воцарения" шеварднадзе получили высокие должности. Не забыл шеварднадзе и старых друзей - Н. Думбадзе и Д. Нарквиани стали секретарями союза писателей. впоследствим и лауреатами Ленинской и Руставелевской премий. Г. Пандимкидзе назначен директором крупнейшего грузинского издательства.

Карактерный штрих. Около года назад Эдуард меварднадзе написал на смерть Н. Думбадзе воспоминания о встречах с замечательным писателем.

На роман Панджикидзе продолжали сыпаться все шишки. И спасая его от издательского остракизма, Турам внес попраки, поправки, сгладил кое-где



острые углы, дописал новую главу — ввел в роман неподкупного следователя. Роман вышел, наконец, отдельной книгой, и в образе честного, интеллигентного следователя многие узнали Эдуарда Щеварднадзе. А при постановке инсценировки "Камня чистой воды" актер вагримировался с намеками на внешний облик шеварднадзе. Эта сцена не дошла даже до генеральной репетиции...

В качестве министра внутренних дел —еварднадзе завел папку на комбинаторов Лазищвили. Но широкая поддержка секретарей ПК и жены Мжаванадзе удачливых братьев нейтрализовали все его усилия. Ходили слухи, будто министр Эдуард шеварднадзе и делец Отар Лазишвили поклялись уничтожить один другого... А пока что Отар носил покровителям спичечные коробки, получал заграничное оборудование, мыл свою машину шампанским. шеварднадзе же упорно копил материал. И на каком-то этапе ему удалось взять верх — Отара арестовали...

Интересная подробность. Из всех братьев Лазишвили министр упрятал в тюрьму одного Отара, остальным же наказал немедленно бросить "левне" дела, закрыть "лавочку".

Такова была расстановка сил в Грузим, когда Э. шеварднадзе занял кресло первого секретаря ЦК. Я хорошо помню закритое собрание в Союзе писателей, на котором шеварднадзе обратился с призивом помочь партии в борьбе с "уродливыми явлениями нашего бита". Говорил он спокойно, не по бумажке, называл понравившиеся ему произведения, обращался к писателям по именам. Не обощлось и без упрека. Недавно, — сказал он, — я был на концерте симфонического оркестра Грузии и к своему огорчению не нашел в зале ни одного грузинского писателя, а ведь вы должны показывать пример...

Далее он неожиданно перешел к еврейскому вопросу и сказал приблизительно следущее. В том, что евреи уезжают из Грузии в зраиль, есть большая доля и нашей винь. Мы, партийные работники, не уделили достаточного внимания их просвещению, развитию, не помогли им подняться на должный



уровень. Надо усились идеологическую и культурную работу, внедрить в еврейские массы советский патриотизм, помочь им преодолеть отсталость.

Вообще Э. шеварднадзе, как мне верится, не должен быть антисемитом, ибо он подлинный грузин. А исторически грузинскому народу, за редким исключением, чужды антиеврейские настроения.

Я вырос, окончил школу и университет в Тбилиси. И даже во время войны не слышал унизительных кличек от сверстников или взрослых. Работая в журнале "Литературная Грузия" /из девяти сотрудников четверо были евреями/, довольно бистро стал заместителем главного редактора, членом редколлегии. Никто и никогда не заставлял меня подписывать переводы псевдонимом. Мое еврейство не мешало мне быть своим среди грузин.

Пикантная подробность. После собрания, на котором меня в связи с внездом в Израиль исключили из Союза писателей, грузинские друзья — поэты и прозаики — устроили мне пышные проводы в ресторане. Прямо после собрания мы поехали кутить...

Сам бакт существования государства Израиль стал для грузин доказательством того, что маленькая страна, окруженная врагами, способна сохранить независимость, постоять за себя. И эта мысль греет их сердца. Примером доброжелательного отношения грузин к Израилю могут служить и книги И. Абашидзе и И. Руруа о поездке в Иерусалим. Об истории их создания я подробно рассказал в книге "Задуй во мне свечу". Добавлю только, что при прощании И. Абашидзе попросил меня передать сборник его стихов с дарственной профессору Хаиму Варди.

Раз уж я упомянул свою книгу, признаюсь, что послал один из первых экземпляров Э. шеварднадзе с такой надписью:



"Уважаемый батоно Эдуард Шеварднадзе!
Примите, пожалуйста, в дар эту книгу, пронизанную любовью к Грузии и ее народу. Очень прошу Вас, продолжайте относиться с пониманием и сочувствием и к моему народу.

С почтительностью Борис Гасс

июль 1984 ".

Я далеко не уверен, что во многих советских газетах печатаются стихи, поздравления с праздниками или письма, присланные из Израиля. Зато точно знаю, так как регулярно получаю "Самнобло", что в этой грузинской газете часто публикуются корреспонденции израильских граждан.

И уже совсем редкий случай. Грузинская литературная газета напечатала некролог на смерть переводчика Руставели на иврит Бориса Гапонова, который за несколько лет до этого выехал в Израиль... Ответсекретарь этой газеты признался мне, что "протолкнуть" некролог на Гапонова ему не стоило никакого труда...

Борьбу с коррупцией и "махинаторами" шеварднадзе вел решительно и своеобразно. Он посилал людей в штатском проверять документи у посетителей ресторанов в рабочее время. Предложил на важном совещании голосовать левой рукой, а затем помнтересовался, откуда у многих на руках "Сейко", если эти часи не продаются в магазинах. Бапретил частникам вывозить из Грузии фрукти, цвети, апельсини. Закрыл многие цеха и комбинати. А в ответ на анонимние письма с угрозами стал совершать по парку вечерние прогулки "без личной охрани". Певарднадзе так и не разрешил перевести Отара Лазишвили в колонию за пределы Грузии, где братья могли бы создать ему лучшие условия. Клятва грузина чего-то да стоит...

Закончу свои мимолетные зарисовки к портрету министра иностранных



дел СССР телеграммой, составленной кем-то из балагуров в день назначения Эдуарда шеварднадзе первым секретарем ЦК КП Грузии:

" Москва. Кремль. Лично тов. Л. И. Брежневу.

Над Грузией реет красное знамя Советской власти".

The paper should be cleared by P and by other bureaus as appropriate. It should not exceed five pages in length. The scope paper is due in S/S-S by cob September 19.
- B. <u>Issues Agenda/Schedule</u>: In the shortest possible outline format, using headings, ticks, and bullets, this "game plan," or topical agenda, will note the key issues to be raised (using full-sized pages, format should include each meeting in sequence as it will occur) in each meeting the Secretary will attend. No more than a half dozen topics per meeting should normally be listed.



The Soviets have requested Secret Service protection for Foreign Minister Eduard Shevardnadze during his forthcoming visit to the United States. He plans to arrive in New York on September 17th and will depart on September 28th. Details of his schedule are still tentative, but we believe he will travel to Washington on September 26th and remain here through the afternoon of September 28th.

Foreign Minister Shevardnadze will attend the opening of the 40th United Nations General Assembly, will conduct bilateral talks with Secretary Shultz and will also meet with the President. This will be his first trip to the United States and the Soviets are deeply concerned about potential security incidents. We also anticipate that there will be a great deal of media interest in the visit. Foreign Minister Shevardnadze's predecessor, Mr. Gromyko, received Secret Service protection on similar visits in the past. The Secret Service has informally told us on the working level that they are willing to provide protection for Foreign Minister Shevardnadze.

In light of the importance of the trip, the meeting with the President and the high public profile of the visit, we believe that Secret Service protection is warranted. We ask that you convey our request for this coverage to the appropriate officials.

General Wojciech Jaruzelski plans to attend the Fortieth UNGA September 24-28. The Polish Government has requested head of state treatment for him, including the use of an armored vehicle. (See attached cables). Although Jaruzelski is not formally head of state, we believe that Secret Service protection for him is fully justified. As First Secretary of the Polish United Workers (Communist) Party, Prime Minister, and Chairman of the National Defense Council, General Jaruzelski clearly holds all the important reins of power. (The Chairman of the Council of the State, the head of state in Poland, performs a purely ceremonial function.) In view of Jaruzelski's role in crushing the independent trade union Solidarity, the likelihood of demonstrations against the General during his stay is high. We therefore request that General Jaruzelski be accorded Secret Service protection as befits a head of state.

THE UNITED NATORS IS BEING NOTIFIED OF THE COMING OF PRIME MINISTER OF THE POLISH PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC, GENERAL WOJCIECH JARUZELSKI TO THE UN 40TH SESSION. ARRIVAL IS SCHEDULED BY A SPECIAL PLANE FROM CUBA ON SEPTEMBER 24TH, EVENING HOURS, DEPARTURE IN THE AFTERNOON OF SEPTEMBER 28TH.

THE POLISH SIDE IS KINDLY REQUESTING THAT THE PRIME MINISTER BE GRANTED THE TREATMENT ACCORDED TO VISITING HEADS OF STATE AND APPROPRIATE SECURITY/PROTECTION/, INCLUDING AN ARMORED/BULLET-PROOF VEHICLE.
