>BEGIN SUMMARY<

2. SUMMARY: THE 1987 SOVIET PLAN AND BUDGET CONTAIN NO SURPRISES, SETTING GROWTH RATES FOR NATIONAL INCOME PRODUCED AT 4.1 PERCENT AND INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION AT 4.4 PERCENT. THE REGIME HAS DECLARED VICTORY FOR 1986 (BASED ON THE FIGURES FOR THE FIRST 10 MONTHS), CLAIMING THE HIGHEST GROWTH RATES ACHIEVED SO FAR IN THE 1980'S. THE CLAIM THAT THE 1986 NATIONAL INCOME TARGET WAS MET IS BASED ON SOME STATISTICAL SLEIGHT OF HAND. NO NEW ECONOMIC MEASURES WERE ANNOUNCED AT THE SUPREME SOVIET SESSION; THE LONG AWAITED LAW ON INDIVIDUAL LABOR ACTIVITY WAS MENTIONED BUT NO DETAILS HAVE SO FAR BEEN GIVEN. THE EMBASSY'S JUDGMENTS ON KEY ASPECTS OF THE SPEECHES DELIVERED NOVEMBER 17 AT THE SUPREME SOVIET FOLLOW. END SUMMARY.

3. ON NOVEMBER 17, GOSPLAN CHAIRMAN TALYZIN AND FINANCE MINISTER GOSTEV DELIVERED THE ANNUAL SPEECHES TO THE SUPREME SOVIET ON THE NEXT YEAR'S PLAN AND BUDGET. WE ASSUME THAT WASHINGTON HAS THE TEXTS OF THESE SPEECHES, WHICH CONTAIN FIGURES FOR PLANNED MACROECONOMIC AND SECTORAL GROWTH RATES FOR 1987. THE EMBASSY HAS THE FOLLOWING COMMENTS ON THE SPEECHES:

-- THE REGIME HAS DECLARED VICTORY FOR 1986 (BASED ON THE FIRST 10 MONTHS), CLAIMING THE HIGHEST GROWTH RATES OF NATIONAL INCOME PRODUCED (4.3 PERCENT) AND INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION (5.1 PERCENT) IN THE 1980'S. IN OUR VIEW, THE YEAR-END INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION FIGURE WILL BE SOMEWHAT LOWER THAN 5.1 PERCENT, BUT STILL ABOVE THE PLAN TARGET OF 4.3 PERCENT.

-- THE REGIME RESORTED TO STATISTICAL SLEIGHT OF HAND TO CLAIM FULFILLMENT OF THE NATIONAL INCOME INDICATOR, SUBSTITUTING THE FIGURE FOR NATIONAL INCOME PRODUCED IN PLACE OF NATIONAL INCOME USED FOR CONSUMPTION AND ACCUMULATION. FOR THE FIRST 9 MONTHS OF THE YEAR NATIONAL

INCOME USED FOR CONSUMPTION AND ACCUMULATION GREW AT 3.7 PERCENT, SLIGHTLY BELOW THE PLAN TARGET OF 3.8 PERCENT.

-- THERE ARE NO SURPRISES IN THE BASIC PLAN TARGETS FOR 1987; THE RATE OF GROWTH OF NATIONAL INCOME

PRODUCED IS PEGGED AT 4.1 PERCENT AND THE RATE OF GROWTH OF INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION AT 4.4 PERCENT, IN LINE WITH THE FIVE-YEAR PLAN.

-- THE REGIME HAS RESISTED THE TEMPTATION TO INCREASE 1987 PLAN TARGETS BASED ON THE BETTER-THAN-ANTICIPATED RESULTS FOR 1986. THE NEED FOR STABLE LONG-TERM "NORMATIVES" IS ONE OF FEW ASPECTS OF THE ECONOMIC REFORM SPECIFICALLY MENTIONED IN THE SPEECHES.

DEFENSE EXPENDITURES WILL PURPORTEDLY INCREASE FROM 19.1 TO 20.2 BILLION RUBLES. SINCE THIS FIGURE REPRESENTS ONLY A FRACTION OF ACTUAL SOVIET DEFENSE SPENDING, WE INTERPRET THE PUBLISHED INCREASE AS A POST-REYKJAVIK SIGNAL TO THE U.S. OF CONTINUED SOVIET COMMITMENT TO THE DEFENSE SECTOR. NOT SURPRISINGLY GOSTEV USES THE MILITARY THREAT OF THE IMPERIALIST COUNTRIES TO JUSTIFY THE INCREASE.

REFERENCES IN THE BUDGET SPEECH TO THE NEED TO IMPROVE THE CREDIT SYSTEM MAY INDICATE A CHANGE IN THE BASIC CRITERIA FOR GRANTING CREDIT, FROM FINANCIAL WEAKNESS TO FINANCIAL STRENGTH. THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE, IN ADVOCATING FULL COST ACCOUNTING FOR BANKS, IS IMPLICITLY ARGUING AGAINST AUTOMATIC LOANS TO ENTERPRISES IN TROUBLE. IT IS HARD TO IMAGINE HOW A POLICY OF LENDING ONLY TO CREDIT-WORTHY ENTERPRISES WOULD BE IMPLEMENTED IF, AS MOST GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS WE HAVE SPOKEN TO MAINTAIN, THERE IS NO INTENTION TO CLOSE DOWN UNPROFITABLE

SUBJECT: 1987 ECONOMIC PLAN AND BUDGET: KEY JUDGMENTS ENTERPRISES.

-- SEVERAL REFERENCES IN THE SPEECHES TO THE BALANCE OF MONEY AND GOODS SUGGEST THAT THE REGIME IS CONCERNED ABOUT THE RUBLE OVERHANG, THE LARGE BALANCES OF (USUALLY) ILLEGALLY ACQUIRED RUBLES THAT PUT PRESSURE ON SUPPLIES OF CONSUMER GOODS. ONE WAY OF ADDRESSING THE PROBLEM WOULD BE A CURRENCY REFORM TO CALL IN BANKNOTES, RUMORED EARLIER THIS YEAR.

-- THE ENERGY SECTION IS NOTABLE FOR THE ABSENCE OF ANY MENTION OF NUCLEAR POWER, SUGGESTING SERIOUS PROBLEMS IN THE INDUSTRY IN CONTRAST WITH CONFIDENT PUBLIC STATEMENTS. ALSO LACKING

IS A REFERENCE TO ENERGY CONSERVATION, WHICH HAS BEEN SLATED TO PLAY A KEY ROLE IN THE USSR'S LONG-TERM ENERGY PLANS.

-- IN THE ENERGY NUMBERS, THE OIL SECTOR'S 617MT TARGET INDICATES THE SOVIETS WILL CONTINUE TO INVEST SUBSTANTIAL RESOURCES INTO MAINTAINING OUTPUT, DESPITE THE PROBABLE FAILURE TO REACH THE 1986 GOAL OF 616.7MT. THE ROBUST SIX PERCENT GROWTH OF THE GAS SECTOR UNDERLINES ITS ROLE IN KEEPING UP THE ENERGY SECTOR'S TOTAL OUTPUT. THE MENTION IN THE REGIONAL SECTION OF THE SPEECH OF CONTINUED RECONSTRUCTION OF THE DECLINING DONBASS FIELDS, DRAINING RESOURCES FROM URGENTLY NEEDED COAL-CLEANING EQUIPMENT AND NEW MINING AND TRANSPORT TECHNOLOGIES, IS

SUGGESTIVE OF THE CONTINUED POLITICAL SENSITIVITY
OF INVESTMENT FOR THE UKRAINE (AND SHCHERBITSKIY'S
CLOUT).

-- AGRICULTURAL POLICY CONTINUES TO STRESS MORE
INVESTMENTS AND MACHINERY AS THE KEY TO GREATER
PRODUCTIVITY. WHILE NOTHING IS SAID ABOUT CO-
OPERATIVES, COLLECTIVE FARM MARKETS, FAMILY
FARMS OR PRIVATE PLOT OWNERS, THERE IS MENTION
OF THE POTENTIAL OF GREATER USE OF THE "NEW
ECONOMIC MECHANISM" AND STABLE ANNUAL QUOTAS
WHICH LEAVE ABOVE-PLAN OUTPUT. "COMPLETELY AT
THE PRODUCERS' DISPOSITION FOR IMPROVING THE
PUBLIC'S FOOD SUPPLY". IF "STABLE QUOTAS"
MEAN LEVELLING OFF (OR SLOWER GROWTH) OF STATE
PURCHASES, THE RESULT COULD BE HIDDEN INFLATION
AS CONSUMERS ARE FORCED TO BUY THE INCREASED
OUTPUT AT THE HIGHER MARKET PRICES.

4. CONCLUDING COMMENT: THE SOVIET ECONOMY IS
ENTERING THE SECOND YEAR OF THE 12TH FIVE-YEAR PLAN
IN RELATIVELY GOOD SHAPE, WITH SOME ONE-TIME GAINS
PROBABLY STILL POSSIBLE FROM INCREASED SAVINGS AND
DISCIPLINE. GIVEN THE GOOD PERFORMANCE OF THE
SOVIET ECONOMY IN 1986, THE PLAN TARGETS FOR 1987 ARE
NOT UNREALISTIC: THE EMPHASIS OF THE SUPREME
SOVIET SPEECHES ON LONG-TERM NORMATIVES AND THE EXPLICIT
REJECTION OF PLANNING FROM WHAT HAS BEEN ACHIEVED
AND OF "VAL" (GROSS) INDICATORS IS CONSISTENT WITH
THE BASIC DIRECTION OF GORBACHEV'S ECONOMIC RESTRUCTURING.
HOWEVER, NOTHING IN THE 1987 PLAN TARGETS CHANGES
OUR VIEW THAT THE 12TH FIVE-YEAR PLAN IS OVERLY
AMBITIOUS AND THAT IT WILL BE DIFFICULT FOR THE
SOVIET ECONOMY TO SIMULTANEOUSLY MEET QUANTITATIVE
OUTPUT TARGETS AND SIGNIFICANTLY IMPROVE PRODUCT
QUALITY. WE EXPECT THESE DIFFICULTIES TO BECOME
GRADUALLY APPARENT DURING THE COURSE OF THE PLAN
PERIOD. END COMMENT. HARTMAN

1. ~~BT~~ SUMMARY: THE SOVIET ECONOMY CONTINUES TO TURN IN A RESPECTABLE, IF NOT STELLAR, PERFORMANCE IN 1986. THE INDUSTRIAL GROWTH RATE FOR THE FIRST 8 MONTHS OF THE YEAR FELL TO 5.2 PERCENT, FROM 5.4 PERCENT FOR THE FIRST 7 MONTHS, BUT IS STILL ABOVE THE PLAN TARGET OF 4.3 PERCENT. IF A SEVERE, EARLY WINTER DOES NOT INTERFERE, THE PLAN TARGET WILL LIKELY BE MET. NOTABLE IN THE CSA REPORT WAS THE ABSENCE OF THE USUAL CRITICISM OF THE PETROLEUM MINISTRY WHICH MET ITS MONTHLY PLANNED OUTPUT TARGET FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS YEAR. END SUMMARY.

2. ~~BT~~ THE SEPTEMBER 12 EDITION OF EKONOMICHESKAYA GAZETA CARRIED THE MONTHLY CENTRAL STATISTICAL ADMINISTRATION (CSA) REPORT ON SOVIET INDUSTRIAL OUTPUT. ACCORDING TO THE REPORT, THE INDUSTRIAL GROWTH RATE FOR THE JANUARY-AUGUST PERIOD WAS 5.2 PERCENT ABOVE THE SAME PERIOD LAST YEAR. LABOR PRODUCTIVITY IS REPORTED TO HAVE INCREASED 4.8 PERCENT.

3. ~~BT~~ THE INDUSTRIAL GROWTH RATE CONTINUED ITS SLOW DECLINE, FALLING TO THE STILL RESPECTABLE RATE OF 5.2 PERCENT FOR THE FIRST 8 MONTHS OF THE YEAR, COMPARED TO 5.4 PERCENT FOR THE FIRST 7 MONTHS. THE PLAN WAS OVERFULFILLED BY 2 PERCENT WITH OVERALL TARGETS BEING MET BY ALL REPUBLICS AND INDUSTRIAL MINISTRIES, WITHOUT EVEN THE USUAL EXCEPTION OF THE PETROLEUM SECTOR. THE PLAN TARGET OF 4.3 PERCENT SEEMS TO BE IN REACH IF THERE IS NO ESPECIALLY SEVERE WEATHER IN NOVEMBER OR DECEMBER.

4. ~~BT~~ THE MINISTRIES OF HEAVY AND TRANSPORT MACHINE BUILDING, CHEMICAL AND PETROLEUM MACHINE BUILDING, AND MACHINE TOOL AND TOOL BUILDING WERE ALL CRITICIZED

BECAUSE INSTANCES OF FAILURE TO MEET DELIVERY OBLIGATIONS NOT ONLY DID NOT DECLINE BUT ACTUALLY INCREASED IN THE REPORTING PERIOD. AS OF JANUARY 1987, ALL THE ENTERPRISES OF THE MINISTRY OF CHEMICAL AND PETROLEUM MACHINE BUILDING WILL ADOPT THE SELF-FINANCING SYSTEM THAT HAS BEEN SO SUCCESSFULLY IMPLEMENTED AT THE FRUNZE MACHINE BUILDING WORKS IN SUMY (REFTEL). GIVEN THE PERENNIAL PROBLEMS OF THIS MINISTRY IN MEETING DELIVERY OBLIGATIONS AND CERTAIN PLAN TARGETS, IT WILL BE INTERESTING TO SEE HOW EFFECTIVE THE NEW REFORM CAN BE.

5. ~~BT~~ ANOTHER LAGGARD IN THE STATISTICAL RACE WAS THE MINISTRY OF LIGHT INDUSTRY. ACCORDING TO THE REPORT, 42 PERCENT OF THAT MINISTRY'S ENTERPRISES FAILED TO FULFILL THEIR CONTRACT OBLIGATIONS. (COMMENT: WHILE FAILURE TO FULFILL CONTRACT OBLIGATIONS IS NOW A COMMON CRITICISM OF MINISTRIES IN THE MONTHLY REPORTS, THIS INDICATOR DOES NOT YET COUNT TOWARD OVERALL PLAN FULFILLMENT. HOWEVER, ACCORDING TO A DECREE PUBLISHED AUGUST 11, AS OF JANUARY 1987 CONTRACT FULFILLMENT IS TO BECOME THE BASIC (THOUGH NOT THE SOLE) CRITERION FOR THE EVALUATION OF ECONOMIC ACTIVITY. BONUSES WILL ONLY BE PAID TO MANAGERS WHO FULFILL 100 PERCENT OF THEIR CONTRACT OBLIGATIONS. PRESUMABLY, MINISTRIES WILL NOT BE ABLE TO CLAIM PLAN FULFILLMENT IF THEY HAVE IGNORED CONTRACT OBLIGATIONS TO MEET VOLUME OR VALUE TARGETS. END COMMENT)

6. ~~BT~~ THE BIG ENERGY STORY IN AUGUST IS THAT FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS YEAR OIL PRODUCTION REACHED ITS PLAN OBJECTIVE. THE 55.6 MMT OIL AND CONDENSATE OUTPUT TOTAL IS THE BEST AUGUST PERFORMANCE

SINCE 1980. WHILE THE 616.7 MMT GOAL FOR 1986 SEEMS OUT OF REACH, THE SECTOR SHOULD BE ABLE TO SURPASS LAST YEAR'S DISMAL 595 MMT PERFORMANCE. OUTPUT FOR 1986 COULD BE SOMEWHERE IN THE 606-610 MMT RANGE.

7. ~~BT~~ THE OTHER ENERGY BRANCHES DEMONSTRATED LITTLE DISCERNIBLE DEPARTURE FROM EXISTING TRENDS. ELECTRICITY PRODUCTION IN AUGUST DID NOT SEEM TO BE AFFECTED BY ANY NEED TO MODIFY CHERNOBYL-TYPE REACTORS. THE SECTOR, PARTICULARLY COAL, WAS URGED TO PREPARE PROPERLY FOR THE UPCOMING WINTER.
