





Ambassador Price has sent you a thoughtful and interesting message outlining the topics he expects Mrs. Thatcher to focus on during your December 22nd meeting (Tab A). My briefing package for the Thatcher visit and my separate paper on SDI cover the various topics that Charlie cites. Charlie does, however, put additional emphasis on two points that you may wish to address in Saturday's meeting.

On SDI, Charlie suggests, and I agree, that you urge Mrs. Thatcher to set the record straight on her support for SDI at the press conference she will hold at Andrews AFB just prior to her departure. You will wish to underline to her that perceptions that SDI lacks Allied support will hurt us at the upcoming Geneva talks.

On terrorism, you should express our appreciation for Britain's excellent cooperation in our antiterrorist efforts and praise British efforts to obtain more awareness and activity by other Europeans, especially the French and the Germans, in countering the terrorist threat.

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NEGOTIATE. BUT SHE THINKS FULL-SCALE SDI

THEY THANKED US WHEN YOU QUASHED THE INDICTMENTS -- BUT SO FAR WE HAVE NOTHING IN HAND BUT A BAG OF AIR.
- 13. I THINK YOU SHOULD EMPHASIZE THREE THINGS:
- -- FIRST, OUR DISAPPOINTMENT THAT YOUR DECISION ON INDICTMENTS HASN'T BROUGHT A POSITIVE RESPONSE,
- -- SECOND THAT CHANGES IN ANTITRUST LEGISLATION ARE, AT LEAST IN THE NEAR TERM, POLITICALLY OUT OF THE QUESTION,
- -- THIRD, AND MOST IMPORTANTLY, THAT WE LOOK FOR EARLY, CLEAR AND POSITIVE BRITISH STEPS ON CIVAIR LIBERALIZATION.

OFFICIALS HAVE BEEN PARTICULARLY UNHELPFUL ON THIS. SO A DIRECT WORD TO THATCHER COULD BE VERY USEFUL.

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- 14. FOR THE REST, I'M SURE THATCHER WILL PRESS
 FOR YOUR VIEWS ON THE U.S. ECONOMY AND THE
 DEFICIT. THERE IS GROWING APPRECIATION HERE THAT
 THE STRONG DOLLAR IS A BOON TO BRITISH EXPORTERS
 (EXPORTS TO THE U.S. HIT A RECORD LAST MONTH).
 STILL, THATCHER RETURNED CONSISTENTLY TO OUR
 FAILURE PRUDENTLY TO MANAGE OUR DEFICIT WHEN SHE
 MET RECENTLY WITH PAUL VOELKER. HER SENSE OF THE
 LINK BETWEEN BRITAIN'S PROSPERITY AND OURS WILL
